ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS

Chapter 10 – Drawing-Style Game Rules

Rule 10.1—Applicability of these Rules

The Drawing-Style Game Rules contain specific rules, regulations, procedures, instructions and directives which apply to Drawing-Style Games developed and offered for distribution and sale to the public by the Mississippi Lottery Corporation (“MLC”). The MLC will, from time to time, amend these Rules and Regulations and adopt new Rules and Regulations that pertain to all Drawing-Style Games as well as Game specific items that will be incorporated into the Game Rules for each Game. In the event of a conflict among the Alyce G. Clarke Mississippi Lottery Law, Senate Bill 2001 (First Extraordinary Session 2018) (“Act”), the Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations, and the Retailer Contract, the Act will govern the Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations, and the Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations will govern the Retailer Contract; however, to the extent not in conflict with the Act, the Game Rules will govern the Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations as to the specific Drawing-Style Game being produced for distribution; further, however, to the extent not in conflict with the Act, any special rules, Draw Procedures or other Game Procedures adopted by the MLC and uniformly announced to all Retailers for a specific Drawing-Style Game (such as for a sales contest), will govern the Game Rules and the Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations as to that game.

These Drawing-Style Game Rules govern Drawing-Style Games authorized by the Act and approved by the MLC. No provision of these Drawing-Style Game Rules shall be construed as authorizing any Drawing-Style Game not authorized by the Act or not approved by the MLC, notwithstanding the inclusion of any references thereto herein.

Rule 10.2 – Definitions

Capitalized terms used herein shall have the meanings set forth in Appendix A to the MLC Rules and Regulations, unless otherwise defined herein.

Rule 10.3 – General Rules

- A. If the MLC, in its sole discretion, has authorized a Retailer to sell Tickets for Drawing-Style Games at one or more of its Retailer Business Locations, these Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations, in addition to all provisions, terms and conditions of the Act, other Rules and Regulations, and the Retailer Contract, shall apply to all Drawing-Style Games.
- B. Only Retailers who have entered into a Retailer Contract with the MLC and have been approved by the MLC, in the MLC’s sole discretion, for the sale of Drawing-Style Games, are authorized to sell Drawing-Style Game Tickets.

- C. Drawing-Style Game Tickets may only be sold at the Retailer Business Location(s) listed in the Retailer Contract for which the MLC has authorized the sale of Tickets for Drawing-Style Games.
- D. The MLC will install a Drawing-Style Game Lottery Terminal at each of the Retailer Business Locations listed in the Retailer Contract for which the MLC has authorized the sale of Tickets for Drawing-Style Games.
- E. By signing the Retailer Contract, Retailer acknowledges and agrees that it is responsible for making or having made, and bearing all costs associated therewith, any and all necessary or appropriate modifications to its MLC telecommunications systems or facilities which are reasonably requested by MLC to facilitate the installation, operation and maintenance of any lottery-related equipment.
- F. Retailer shall provide, prior to the installation of Drawing-Style Game Lottery Terminal(s) by MLC, a dedicated quadplex electrical outlet, for each Drawing-Style Game Lottery Terminal, which meets the following requirements: grounded, 110V/15 or 10 AMPS (isolated power circuit), and located no farther than six (6) feet from the applicable Drawing-Style Game Lottery Terminal. No electrical devices other than the MLC Drawing-Style Game Lottery Terminal shall be connected to, or operated from, the dedicated electrical outlet.

- G. Retailer shall provide approximately two (2) feet by four (4) feet of floor space at its business premises, which is acceptable to MLC, for a free-standing play center. Retailer further agrees to provide a space at least twenty (20) inches wide, thirty (30) inches deep and thirty (30) inches high, which is acceptable to MLC, for its Drawing-Style Game Lottery Terminal(s) to allow proper ventilation, maintenance and material loading and removing.
- H. Retailer agrees that it shall be responsible for all expenses, including MLC telecommunications charges, associated with all Retailer-requested Drawing-Style Game Lottery Terminal relocations.
- I. Each Retailer shall sell Drawing-Style Game Tickets, for any and/or all Drawing-Style Games as authorized and directed by the MLC, at each of the Retailer Business Location(s) listed in the Retailer Contract for which the MLC has authorized the sale of Tickets for the respective Drawing-Style Games.
- J. The MLC President in his sole discretion may establish minimum Retailer sales requirements. The MLC will provide Retailers with advance notice of the effective date of the minimum sales requirements. If Retailer fails to meet the MLC's established minimum weekly sales average, the MLC may remove the full-service Drawing-Style Games Lottery Terminal(s).
- K. Retailer Incentive Payments

1. The MLC will pay a Selling Bonus of \$25,000.00 to a Retailer that sells a jackpot winning Powerball or Mega Millions Drawing-Style Game Play.
2. The MLC will pay a Selling Bonus of \$5,000.00 to a Retailer who sells a winning Drawing-Style Game Play (excluding a Play described in subsection (1) above or a Play for a Prize won in a Second Chance Drawing) when the Prize won is equal to or greater than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00).
3. If there are multiple winning Plays sold in Mississippi in a single drawing that qualify for one of the selling bonuses described in this subsection (K) to be paid, the respective selling bonus will be divided between and among the respective Retailers equally (based on the number of winning Plays sold by each Retailer).

Rule 10.4 – Drawing-Style Game Rules

A. New Drawing-Style Game

1. The President, at any time, may introduce a new individual Drawing-Style Game or series of Drawing-Style Games.
2. Each Drawing-Style Game shall include the manner and time of payment of prizes as authorized by the President and stated in the individual Game Rules.
3. The individual Game Rules for each Drawing-Style Game shall contain the number and amount of prizes as authorized by the President.
4. The odds of winning for each Drawing-Style Game, as authorized by the President and stated in the individual Game Rules, will be formatted for distribution to the public through the Retailer base and shall include the following:
 - a. Available prize tiers;
 - b. Consolidated odds of winning each available prize tier; and
 - c. Overall odds of winning.

B. Sale of Drawing-Style Game Tickets

Each Drawing-Style Game Ticket shall sell for the retail sales price authorized by the President and stated in the individual Game Rules.

C. Game Procedures

The Game Procedures for each Drawing-Style Game shall contain the following information:

1. Game name;
2. Prize Structure;
3. Play Style;
4. Retail sales price;
5. Frequency of Games and drawings and selection of winning Tickets or Shares; and
6. Means of conducting drawings.

D. Determination of Prize Winner

1. A Claim Form shall be filed with the MLC in the name of Claimant. The MLC will pay a prize to only one (1) Claimant, which may be an individual, corporation, organization, partnership, trust or estate. If the person claiming the prize is a member of a winning group, family unit, club or organization tier, they must attach Internal Revenue Service Form 5754 at the time of claim whereupon multiple payees as designated on such Form 5754 may be permitted at the option of the MLC, provided the total amount of such payments does not exceed the amount of the particular prize. All members of the winning group will be subject to debt set-offs, as referenced in Rule 8.5(B).

2. No particular prize in any lottery game shall be paid more than once. Notwithstanding anything in this Section 10.4(D) to the contrary, in the event of a binding determination that more than one competing Claimant is entitled to a particular prize, the sole remedy of such Claimants is the award to each of them an equal share in the prize.

3. If the back of a Ticket contains multiple signatures, or if a claim is erroneously entered, the President may reject the claim.
4. A player's eligibility to win any Prize is subject to the Ticket validation requirements provided in subsection (E) of this section.

5. All Claim Forms shall be completed and signed by the Claimant or duly authorized representative.

6. If the owner of a prizewinning Ticket is unable to complete a Claim Form due to a legal, physical or other disability, a guardian, conservator, custodian, fiduciary or duly authorized representative having a power of attorney shall complete and sign a Claim Form on owner's behalf. The Claim Form shall indicate the name of the lawful payee.
7. If the person(s) signing the Claim Form is a personal representative of the estate of a deceased winner, that person shall submit his letter of administration or its legal equivalent showing the appointment from the court having jurisdiction over the estate.
8. A person who signs a Claim Form shall be deemed to have represented that the information contained therein is accurate and complete.
9. No incomplete Claim Form shall be processed for payment.
10. In accordance with the Act, the MLC is discharged from all liability upon payment of a Prize. Additionally, there shall be no liability on the part of, and no cause of action shall arise against, the MLC, its Board, staff, agents, vendors, or employees, arising out of or in connection with the issuance, failure to issue, or delivery of a Ticket.

E. Ticket Validation Requirements

1. Each Drawing-Style Game Ticket shall be validated according to validation procedures prior to payment of a Prize.
2. A Drawing-Style Game Ticket shall comply with all of the following:
 - a. The Ticket shall not be counterfeit or forged, in whole or in part.
 - b. The Ticket shall not be mutilated, altered, unreadable, reconstituted, or tampered with in any manner.
 - c. The Ticket shall have been issued by the MLC in an authorized manner.
 - d. The Ticket shall have been received or recorded by the MLC by applicable claim deadlines.
 - e. In addition to the validation requirements, a Drawing-Style Game Ticket shall not be valid unless all of the following conditions are met:
 - i. The Ticket data shall have been recorded on the central computer system on magnetic tape or disk prior to the drawing, and the Ticket data shall match this computer record in every respect; and

- ii. The Player's numbers, the Validation Number data and the drawing data of the Ticket shall appear on the official file of winning Tickets, confirmed via the MLC's internal control system, and a Ticket with that exact data shall not have been previously paid.
 - f. The Ticket and Validation Numbers must be present in their entirety and be fully legible.
 - g. The Play type, Validation Number, Retailer code and number must be correctly displayed on the Ticket.
 - h. The Ticket must not be blank or partially blank, misregistered, defective, or printed or produced in error.
 - i. A lottery Ticket shall be the only valid proof of the Play and the only valid instrument for claiming a Prize.
- 3. Any Ticket not passing all of the validation tests and requirements is void and ineligible for any Prize and shall not be paid. The President may, at the President's exclusive determination, reimburse the player for the purchase price of the void Ticket.
 - 4. If a defective Ticket is purchased, the MLC's only liability shall be reimbursement for the purchase price of the void Ticket.
 - 5. Any person who submits a lottery Ticket for validation or who claims a Prize, in whatever capacity, agrees to be bound and shall be bound by the provisions of the MLC's Drawing-Style Game Rules.

F. Ticket Responsibility

- 1. The purchaser of a Drawing-Style Game Ticket shall be solely responsible for verifying, at the time of purchase, the accuracy, legibility and condition of the data printed on the Ticket, and for determining that the Ticket accurately reflects the Play.
- 2. A Ticket is a bearer instrument until signed on the back by the Ticket holder. If the signature area is defaced, altered, or signed by more than one person, the MLC reserves the right to refuse payment.
- 3. The MLC shall not be responsible for lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed Tickets.
- 4. The MLC shall not be responsible for erroneous or mutilated Tickets.
- 5. The MLC shall not be responsible for Tickets claimed at a Retailer by a player for a lower Prize in error.

6. The MLC may not pay Prizes to any Claimant who purchases a Ticket from an unauthorized Retailer.
7. Exchange Tickets issued pursuant to a cashed multi-draw Play shall not be canceled.
8. The President shall not pay a Prize on any canceled or voided Drawing-Style Game Ticket.

G. Disputed Ticket

If a dispute arises between the MLC and a Ticket Claimant concerning whether the Ticket is a winning Ticket and the Ticket Prize has not been paid, the President may, exclusively at his/her determination, reimburse the Claimant for the purchase price of the disputed Ticket. This shall be the Claimant's exclusive remedy.

H. Game Termination and Prize Claim Period

1. Once an individual game (which is conducted as part of a Drawing-Style Game) closes, tickets can no longer be sold and the individual game ends.
2. The President may, at any time, announce the termination date for an individual Drawing-Style Game or series of Drawing-Style Games. If this occurs, no Tickets shall be sold past the termination date.
3. Drawing-Style Game cash Prizes shall be claimed no later than one hundred eighty (180) days after the drawing in which the cash Prize was won; the date of claim is the date of receipt by the MLC or a Retailer; thereafter, no claims shall be honored by the MLC or any Retailer.

I. Governing Law

In purchasing a Ticket, the customer or player agrees to comply with, and abide by, the Act, other applicable Mississippi laws, all Rules and Regulations and all final decisions of the MLC, and all procedures and instructions established by the MLC or the President for the conduct of the respective Game.

J. Purchase and Prize Restrictions

1. No Drawing-Style Game Ticket may be purchased by and no Prize shall be paid to any member of the MLC Board; any officer or employee of the MLC; any MLC vendor or Retailer; or any spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of abode of any such person. Nor shall any Ticket be purchased by and no Prize shall be paid to any officer, employee, agent, or subcontractor of any MLC vendor, or any spouse, child, brother, sister to parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of abode of any such

person if such officer, employee, agent, or subcontractor has access to confidential information which may compromise the integrity of the MLC.

2. The MLC reserves the right to decline to accept a Play.

K. Taxes and Debt Setoffs

In accordance with the Act, other applicable laws and the MLC's Prize Validation and Payment Rules and Regulations:

1. All Prizes of \$600.00 and above are subject to applicable federal and state withholdings, and all Prizes are subject to federal and state income taxes; and
2. Prizes of \$600.00 and above are subject to Debt Setoff collection by claimant agencies.

L. Coordination of Instant Game Rules and Drawing-Style Game Rules

If and when there is an issue or topic relevant to the Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations which is addressed in the Instant Game Rules and Regulations, but which is not addressed in the Drawing-Style Game Rules and Regulations, then the provisions of the Instant Game Rules and Regulations shall apply equally to the Drawing-Style Games for such issue or topic.

M. Non-Assignment

No rights of any person to a Prize or a portion of a Prize shall be assignable, except as set forth in the Act.

N. Payments to Persons Under a Legal Disability

1. The President shall direct payment to the duly authorized representative or fiduciary of a person under legal or other disability to receive a Prize in accordance with Mississippi law.
2. The President shall, pursuant to the Act and the MLC's Rules and Regulations, determine the lawful payee in all cases involving the death of a Prize winner, payment on behalf of a Minor or other person under a legal disability, or multiple Claimants, and may petition a court of competent jurisdiction as the President deems necessary for such purpose.

O. Dissemination of Winning Numbers

The dissemination and publication of winning numbers by MLC telephone or in the media is for informational purposes only, and the MLC shall not pay a Prize based upon information obtained from winning number information lines or any source

other than the official draw results electronically recorded in the central computer system.

P. Drawings

1. The President shall determine the time, frequency, date and method of the drawing(s) for each Drawing-Style Game and shall include such information in the Game Procedures.
2. The purposes of Drawing-Style Game drawings shall be to select winning numbers at random with the aid of mechanical drawing equipment or computer-based drawing software programs. Any drawings conducted with mechanical drawing equipment located within Mississippi shall be open to the public.
3. To the extent possible, Drawing-Style Game drawings conducted with mechanical drawing equipment shall be recorded on a video and audio tape which shall be retained by the MLC, but the failure to record the drawing or retain the tape, or the partial or total failure of technical, electronic, or mechanical equipment used to conduct or record the drawing shall not invalidate the drawing or change the outcome of a Game once it has been announced by the President.
4. In the event a Drawing-Style Game drawing is conducted through a random number generator, the MLC shall retain the log files for each Drawing-Style Game drawing.

Q. Method of Playing a Drawing-Style Game

1. The President shall determine the method of play for each Game, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. The requisite digits or numbers which shall be entered manually into the Lottery Terminal by the Drawing-Style Game Retailer;
 - b. Whether play can be completed by Play Slip; and
 - c. Whether play can be made by Quick Pick.
2. Tickets for Drawing-Style Games may be awarded as a Prize in an Instant Game. The President shall determine the specific details related to the use of a Drawing-Style Ticket as a Prize in an Instant Game.

R. Play Slips

1. The MLC, or its authorized distributors, may provide Play Slips at no cost to the Retailers, for use by the players.

2. Play Slips are provided solely for the convenience of players and shall have no monetary or prize value or constitute evidence of a Play.
3. If a Play Slip is used, the player shall select the requisite number of squares for each single lettered Panel for that Game.
4. The requisite numbers and the associated letter constitute a single Game Panel on a Play Slip.
5. Game Panels may be selected in any order.
6. Play Slips shall be processed through the Lottery Terminal by the Retailer, and Tickets shall be issued only through the Lottery Terminal.
7. If the Play Slip is rejected by the Lottery Terminal, the Play is not valid and the player may submit another Play Slip.

Rule 10.5 – Description of the Powerball Game Procedures

MUSL's Powerball Group Rules are attached hereto as Exhibit A and are hereby incorporated into the Drawing-Style Game Rules by reference. The Powerball Group Rules may be amended from time to time by MUSL. To the extent the MUSL amends its Powerball Group Rules, the Drawing-Style Game Rules shall be deemed amended in an equivalent fashion. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing to the contrary:

10.5.1 – Registered Play

Registered Play, as that term is defined in the Powerball Group Rules, is not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.5.2 – Request for Plays

Request for Plays, as that term is defined in the Powerball Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi

10.5.3 – Retailer Controlled Selling Devices

Retailer Controlled Selling Devices, as that term is defined in the Powerball Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.5.4 – Ticketless Transactions

Ticketless Transactions, as that term is defined in the Powerball Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

Rule 10.6 – Description of Mega Millions Game Procedures

MUSL's Mega Millions Product Group Rules are attached hereto as Exhibit B and are hereby incorporated into the Drawing-Style Game Rules by reference. The Mega Millions Product Group Rules may be amended from time to time by MUSL. To the extent MUSL amends its Mega Millions Product Group Rules, the Drawing-Style Game Rules shall be deemed amended in an equivalent fashion. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing to the contrary:

10.6.1 – Registered Play

Registered Play, as that term is defined in the Mega Millions Product Group Rules, is not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.6.2 – Request for Plays

Request for Plays, as that term is defined in the Mega Millions Product Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi

10.6.3 – Retailer Controlled Selling Devices

Retailer Controlled Selling Devices, as that term is defined in the Mega Millions Product Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.6.4 – Ticketless Transactions

Ticketless Transactions, as that term is defined in the Mega Millions Product Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

Rule 10.7 -- DESCRIPTION OF THE CASH 3 GAME PROCEDURES

- A. The MLC may operate a three-digit daily numbers Game using a set prize payout ("CASH 3").
- B. CASH 3 is a daily three-digit Game in which the player may play fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) (except as noted) on any one of the following Play types:
 1. Exact Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved only when the three-digit number specified by the player matches in exact order the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. For example, if the winning number is "123", then only the Plays made on "123" in that exact order will be winners.
 2. Six-Way Combination: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of three different digits specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of six Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at six times the \$1.00 base cost. For example, if the winning number is "123" then any combination Play made on "123" (i.e., "123", "132", "231", "213", "321",

or “312”) will be a winner of an Exact Order Play. This Play can only be purchased for one dollar (\$1.00) per combination thus this Play will cost six dollars (\$6.00).

3. Three-Way Combination: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of three digits (with any two of the three digits being the same) specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of three Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at three times the \$1.00 base cost. For example, if the winning number is “711”, then any combination Play made on “711”, (i.e., “117”, “171”, or “711”) will be a winner of an Exact Order Play. This Play can only be purchased for one dollar (\$1.00) per combination, thus this Play will cost three dollars (\$3.00).
4. Exact Order / Six-Way Any Order (on one Ticket): A Play whereby the player can place an Exact Order Play and a Six-Way Any Order Play for the same number on a single Ticket. The player can win on both the Exact Order and Any Order Play when the three digits specified by the player match in exact order the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. The player can win on the Any Order portion only when any other combination of the three digits selected by the player matches the winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. Plays are limited to fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Exact Order portion and fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Any Order portion for a total of one dollar (\$1.00) per Ticket. For example, if the winning number is “123”, then only Plays in that exact order will be winners on both portions of the Ticket. However, Any Order Plays made on “123” (i.e., “132”, “231”, “213”, “321”, or “312”) will be winners in the Any Order portion only.
5. Exact Order / Three-Way Any Order (on one Ticket): A Play whereby the player can place an Exact Order and a Three-Way Any Order Play for the same number on a single Ticket. The player can win on both the Exact Order and Any Order Plays when the three digits specified by the player match in exact order with the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. The player can win on the Any Order portion only when any other combination of the three digits (with any two of the three digits being the same) selected by the player matches the winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. Plays are limited to fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Exact Order portion and fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Any Order portion for a total of one dollar (\$1.00) per Ticket. For example, if the winning number is “311”, then only Plays made on “311” in that exact order will be winners on both portions of the Ticket. However, Any Order Plays made on “311” (i.e., “113” or “131”) will be winners in the Any Order portion only.
6. Six-Way Any Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of three (3) different digits specified by the player matches

the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of six Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at the fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) single-unit Ticket cost. For example, if the winning number is “123”, then all Any Order Plays made on “123” (i.e., “132”, “123”, “231”, “213”, “321”, or “312”) will be winners.

7. Three-Way Any Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of three digits (with any two of the three digits being the same) specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of three Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at the fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) single-unit Ticket cost. For example, if the winning number is “711”, then all Any Order Plays made on “711” (i.e., “117”, “171”, or “711”) will be winners.

C. FIREBALL Add-On

1. FIREBALL is an add-on feature available for all CASH 3 or CASH 4 Play types. The FIREBALL feature cannot be selected and cannot be purchased independently of a CASH 3 or CASH 4 Play.
2. The FIREBALL number is drawn at each interval of CASH 3 and CASH 4 and applies to either Game in which the player purchases the add-on feature.
3. The FIREBALL is one, single-digit number drawn at the time of each CASH 3 and CASH 4 drawing. The FIREBALL winning number will apply to both the CASH 3 and CASH 4 drawings at the time of the drawing. Only players who purchased the FIREBALL add-on will be eligible for the FIREBALL Prizes.
4. The FIREBALL number is an additional number which may be used to replace any one of the Lottery-drawn CASH 3 or CASH 4 winning numbers to make FIREBALL winning combinations. The FIREBALL number does not replace numbers selected by the player for a CASH 3 or CASH 4 Play.
5. Adding the FIREBALL feature doubles the cost of each corresponding CASH 3 Play. For instance, if a player purchases a CASH 3 Play with an Exact Order for \$1, the CASH 3 plus FIREBALL Play will cost an additional \$1; if a player purchases a CASH 3 Play with a Six-Way Combo for \$6, the CASH 3 plus FIREBALL Play will cost an additional \$6.
6. Selection of a FIREBALL add-on feature allows for a chance to win a FIREBALL Prize in addition to any base-game winning Prizes. Winning

is achieved by matching any one of the FIREBALL combinations created, based on the Play type and Play amount selected. For example, in a single CASH 3 Play panel, a player chooses the numbers “1, 4, 7” in an Exact Order Play with FIREBALL on a Ticket. The drawn numbers are “1, 4, 9” and the drawn FIREBALL is “7”, creating FIREBALL combinations of “1, 4, 7”, “1, 7, 9”, and “7, 4, 9”. The player has won by matching one FIREBALL combination. In certain circumstances, a player may win up to four times in a Play – with and without the FIREBALL number.

E. Canceled Tickets

1. A Ticket which is printed in error for the Mississippi CASH 3 Game may be canceled only on the date purchased, within fifteen (15) minutes of the purchase and prior to the drawing break. Such Tickets shall be voided only by the issuing Retailer on the Lottery Terminal that printed the Ticket and the player may request a refund or a replacement Ticket. If for any reason the Lottery Terminal that issued the Ticket is inoperable prior to the drawing break, the President may, exclusively at his/her discretion, reimburse the player the Ticket price. This shall be the player's exclusive remedy.
2. All canceled CASH 3 Tickets shall be retained by the Retailer for daily or weekly reconciliations of CASH 3 sales and provided to the MLC as requested.

F. Time, Place Frequency and Means of Conducting Drawing

1. CASH 3 drawings may be conducted up to three (3) times daily at such times and places established by the President.
2. The MLC will conduct CASH 3 drawings using a computer equipped with a random number generator and a program specific to this Drawing-Style Game and audited by an independent accounting firm.
3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, at the discretion of the President, CASH 3 drawings may be conducted, or winning numbers obtained in accordance with the provisions of the MLC's Disaster Recovery Plan in the event of a natural or other disaster or emergency.

G. Limitation on Liability

The MLC reserves the right at any time in its sole discretion to suspend Play or limit the number of Plays on any number(s) or play type(s).

Rule 10.8 – DESCRIPTION OF THE MISSISSIPPI MATCH 5 GAME PROCEDURES

- A. The MLC may operate a five-digit numbers Drawing-Style Game using a five (5) of thirty-five (35) matrix.
- B. To play MISSISSIPPI MATCH 5, a player shall select (or computer pick) five different numbers between one (1) and thirty-five (35). A player wins when two or more of the numbers selected from the five (5) of thirty-five (35) matrix match the numbers drawn.
- C. Each Play costs two dollars (\$2.00).

D. The Multiplier

- 1. Players may purchase the optional Multiplier for an additional one dollar (\$1.00) per Play.
- 2. The Multiplier is randomly assigned to each Play and is printed beside the player's numbers.
- 3. The Multiplier increases a non-jackpot prize by two (2), three (3), four (4) or five (5) times.

E. Prize Pool

The Prize Pool for the Game shall consist of fifty-two percent (52%) of each drawing period's sales which includes a 2% Reserve. The advertised Jackpot is an estimate and is pari-mutuel. The remaining prizes are set prizes. All set prizes and Multiplier prizes, with the exception of free tickets, may be reduced if prize claims exceed the available Non-Jackpot Prize Pool.

1. Jackpot Prize Pool

- a. The initial Jackpot is set at fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000). The initial Jackpot amount may change at the discretion of the President, based on projected or actual sales.
- b. If no Play matches the five (5) drawn numbers, the Jackpot will roll to the next drawing, and combine with amounts added to the Jackpot Prize Pool based on projected or actual sales during the next drawing period to a new Jackpot prize amount for the next drawing.
- c. The Jackpot prize is pari-mutuel; if there is more than one winning ticket sold that matches all five (5) drawn numbers, the Jackpot prize will be shared equally among all eligible winning tickets.
- d. The Multiplier does not affect the Jackpot prize.

2. Non-Jackpot Prize Pool

- a. Plays matching two (2), three (3) or four (4) of the drawn numbers, including those plays with the optional Multiplier, qualify as winners of a set prize.

- b. The Non-Jackpot Prize Pool prizes may be reduced if prize claims exceed the available prize fund for matching three (3) of five (5) or four (4) of five (5) numbers. Prizes for matching two (2) of five (5) numbers will not be reduced.

F. Prize Pool Percentage Allocation

The Prize Pool Percentage Allocation for the MISSISSIPPI MATCH 5 Game shall be as follows:

- Notwithstanding the foregoing, at the discretion of the President, MISSISSIPPI MATCH 5 drawings may be conducted, or winning numbers obtained in accordance with provisions of the MLC's Disaster Recovery Plan in the event of a natural disaster or other disaster or emergency.

I. Cancellations Prohibited.

MISSISSIPPI MATCH 5 tickets cannot be canceled.

J. Limitation on Liability

The MLC reserves the right at any time in its sole discretion to suspend Play or limit the number of Plays.

Rule 10.9 -- DESCRIPTION OF THE CASH 4 GAME PROCEDURES

A. The MLC may operate a four-digit daily numbers Game using a set prize payout ("CASH 4").

B. CASH 4 is a daily four-digit Game in which the player may play fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) (except as noted) on any one of the following Play types:

1. Exact Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved only when the four-digit number specified by the player matches in exact order the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. For example, if the winning number is "1234", then only the Plays made on "1234" in that exact order will be winners.

2. Twenty-Four-Way Combination: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four different digits specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of twenty-four Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at twenty-four times the \$1.00 base cost. For example, if the winning number is "1234" then any combination Play made on "1234" (i.e., "1234", "1243", "1324", "1342", "1423", "1432", "2134", "2143", "2314", "2341", "2413", "2431", "3124", "3142", "3214", "3241", "3412", "3421", "4123", "4132", "4213", "4231", "4312", or "4321") will be a winner of an Exact Order Play. This Play can only be purchased for one dollar (\$1.00) per combination thus this Play will cost twenty-four dollars (\$24.00).

3. Twelve-Way Combination: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four digits (with any two of the four digits being the same) specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of twelve Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at twelve times the \$1.00 base cost. For example, if the winning number is "1123" then any combination Play made on "1123" (i.e., "1123", "1132", "1213", "1231", "1312",

"1321", "2113", "2131", "2311", "3112", "3121", or "3211") will be a winner of an Exact Order Play. This Play can only be purchased for one dollar (\$1.00) per combination thus this Play will cost twelve dollars (\$12.00).

4. Six-Way Combination: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four digits – comprised of two pairs of like digits –specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of six Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at six times the \$1.00 base cost. For example, if the winning number is "1122" then any combination Play made on "1122" (i.e., "1122", "1212", "1221", "2112", "2121", or "2211") will be a winner of an Exact Order Play. This Play can only be purchased for one dollar (\$1.00) per combination thus this Play will cost six dollars (\$6.00).

5. Four-Way Combination: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four digits (with any three of the four digits being the same) specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of four Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at four times the \$1.00 base cost. For example, if the winning number is "1112", then any combination Play made on "1112", (i.e., "1112", "1121", "1211", or "2111") will be a winner of an Exact Order Play. This Play can only be purchased for one dollar (\$1.00) per combination thus this Play will cost four dollars (\$4.00).

6. Exact Order / Twenty-Four-Way Any Order (on one Ticket): A Play whereby the player can place an Exact Order and a Twenty-Four-Way Any Order Play for the same number on a single Ticket. The player can win on both the Exact Order and Any Order Plays when the four different digits specified by the player match in exact order with the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. The player can win on the Any Order portion only when any other combination of the four different digits selected by the player matches the winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. Plays are limited to fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Exact Order portion and fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Any Order portion for a total of one dollar (\$1.00) per Ticket. For example, if the winning number is "1234", then only Plays made on "1234" in that exact order will be winners on both portions of the Ticket. However, Any Order Plays made on "1234" (i.e., "1243", "1324", "1342", "1423", "1432", "2134", "2143", "2314", "2341", "2413", "2431", "3124", "3142", "3214", "3241", "3412", "3421", "4123", "4132", "4213", "4231", "4312", or "4321") will be winners in the Any Order portion only.

7. Exact Order / Twelve-Way Any Order (on one Ticket): A Play whereby the player can place an Exact Order and a Twelve-Way Any Order

Play for the same number on a single Ticket. The player can win on both the Exact Order and Any Order Plays when the four digits (with any two of the four digits being the same) specified by the player match in exact order with the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. The player can win on the Any Order portion only when any other combination of the four digits (with any two of the four digits being the same) selected by the player matches the winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. Plays are limited to fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Exact Order portion and fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Any Order portion for a total of one dollar (\$1.00) per Ticket. For example, if the winning number is “1123”, then only Plays made on “1123” in that exact order will be winners on both portions of the Ticket. However, Any Order Plays made on “1123” (i.e., “1132”, “1213”, “1231”, “1312”, “1321”, “2113”, “2131”, “2311”, “3112”, “3121”, or “3211”) will be winners in the Any Order portion only.

8. Exact Order / Six-Way Any Order (on one Ticket): A Play whereby the player can place an Exact Order Play and a Six-Way Any Order Play for the same number on a single Ticket. The player can win on both the Exact Order and Any Order Play when the four digits (with two pairs of two of the four digits being the same) specified by the player match in exact order the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. The player can win on the Any Order portion only when any other combination of the four digits (with two pairs of two of the four digits being the same) selected by the player matches the winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. Plays are limited to fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Exact Order portion and fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Any Order portion for a total of one dollar (\$1.00) per Ticket. For example, if the winning number is “1122”, then only Plays in that exact order will be winners on both portions of the Ticket. However, Any Order Plays made on “1122” (i.e., “1212”, “1221”, “2112”, “2121”, or “2211”) will be winners in the Any Order portion only.

9. Exact Order / Four-Way Any Order (on one Ticket): A Play whereby the player can place an Exact Order and a Four-Way Any Order Play for the same number on a single Ticket. The player can win on both the Exact Order and Any Order Plays when the four digits (with any three of the four digits being the same) specified by the player match in exact order with the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. The player can win on the Any Order portion only when any other combination of the four digits (with any three of the four digits being the same) selected by the player matches the winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. Plays are limited to fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Exact Order portion and fifty cents (\$0.50) on the Any Order portion for a total of one dollar (\$1.00) per Ticket. For example, if the winning number

is “1112”, then only Plays made on “1112” in that exact order will be winners on both portions of the Ticket. However, Any Order Plays made on “1112” (i.e., “1121”, “1211”, or “2111”) will be winners in the Any Order portion only.

10. Twenty-Four-Way Any Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four different digits specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of twenty-four Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at the fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) single-unit Ticket cost. For example, if the winning number is “1234”, then all Any Order Plays made on “1234” (i.e., “1234”, “1243”, “1324”, “1342”, “1423”, “1432”, “2134”, “2143”, “2314”, “2341”, “2413”, “2431”, “3124”, “3142”, “3214”, “3241”, “3412”, “3421”, “4123”, “4132”, “4213”, “4231”, “4312”, or “4321”) will be winners.

11. Twelve-Way Any Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four digits (with any two of the four digits being the same) specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of twelve Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at the fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) single-unit Ticket cost. For example, if the winning number is “1123”, then all Any Order Plays made on “1123” (i.e., “1123”, “1132”, “1213”, “1231”, “1312”, “1321”, “2113”, “2131”, “2311”, “3112”, “3121”, or “3211”) will be winners.

12. Six-Way Any Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four digits (with two pairs of two of the four digits being the same) specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of six Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at the fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) single-unit Ticket cost. For example, if the winning number is “1122”, then all Any Order Plays made on “1122” (i.e., “1122”, “1212”, “1221”, “2112”, “2121”, or “2211”) will be winners.

13. Four-Way Any Order: A Play whereby a winning result is achieved when any combination of four digits (with any three of the four digits being the same) specified by the player matches the official winning number drawn by the MLC for that drawing event. This is the equivalent of four Exact Order Plays on a single Ticket at the fifty cents (\$0.50) or one dollar (\$1.00) single-unit Ticket cost. For example, if the winning number is “1112”, then all Any Order Plays made on “1112” (i.e., “1112”, “1121”, “1211”, or “2111”) will be winners.

C. FIREBALL Add-On

1. FIREBALL is an add-on feature available for any CASH 3 or CASH 4 Play types. The FIREBALL feature cannot be selected and cannot be purchased independently of a CASH 3 or CASH 4 Play.
2. The FIREBALL number is drawn at each interval of CASH 3 and CASH 4 and applies to either Game in which the player purchases the add-on feature.
3. The FIREBALL is one, single-digit number drawn at the time of each CASH 3 and CASH 4 drawing. The FIREBALL winning number will apply to both the CASH 3 and CASH 4 drawings at the time of the drawing. Only players who purchased the FIREBALL add-on will be eligible for the FIREBALL Prizes.
4. The FIREBALL number is an additional number which may be used to replace any one of the Lottery-drawn CASH 3 or CASH 4 winning numbers to make FIREBALL winning combinations. The FIREBALL number does not replace numbers selected by the player for a CASH 3 or CASH 4 Play.
5. Adding the FIREBALL feature doubles the cost of each corresponding CASH 4 Play. For instance, if a player purchases a CASH 4 Play with an Exact Order for \$1, the CASH 4 plus FIREBALL Play will cost an additional \$1; if a player purchases a CASH 4 Play with a Six-Way Combo for \$6, the CASH 4 plus FIREBALL Play will cost an additional \$6.

The drawn numbers are “1, 3, 5, 9” and the drawn FIREBALL is “7”, creating FIREBALL combinations of “1, 3, 5, 7,” “1, 3, 7, 9,” “1, 7, 5, 9,” and “7, 3, 5, 9”. The player has won by matching one FIREBALL combination. In certain circumstances, a player may win up to five times in a Play – with and without the FIREBALL number.

B. To play CASH POP, a player shall select (or computer pick) between one and fifteen different numbers ("Pops") between one (1) and fifteen (15). A player wins when the winning Pop selected from the one (1) of fifteen (15) matrix match the Pop drawn.

1. For each Pop played, a prize will be randomly assigned at the time of purchase.

C. CASH POP is a daily one-number Game in which the player may choose to play one dollar (\$1.00), two dollars (\$2.00), five dollars (\$5.00), or ten dollars (\$10.00) per Pop selection.

D. The overall odds of matching the winning number are 1 in 15.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, at the discretion of the President, CASH POP drawings may be conducted, or winning numbers obtained in accordance with provisions of the MLC's Disaster Recovery Plan in the event of a natural disaster or other disaster or emergency.

G. Cancellations Prohibited.

CASH POP tickets cannot be canceled.

H. Limitation on Liability

The MLC reserves the right at any time in its sole discretion to suspend Play or limit the number of Plays.

Rule 10.11 – Description of the Lotto America with EZ Match Game Procedures

MUSL's Lotto America Group Rules are attached hereto as Exhibit C and are hereby incorporated into the Drawing-Style Game Rules by reference. The Lotto America Group Rules may be amended from time to time by MUSL. To the extent MUSL amends its Lotto America Group Rules, the Drawing-Style Game Rules shall be deemed amended in an equivalent fashion. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing to the contrary:

10.11.1 – Registered Play

Registered Play, as that term is defined in the Lotto America Group Rules, is not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.11.2 – Request for Plays

Request for Plays, as that term is defined in the Lotto America Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.11.3 – Retailer Controlled Selling Devices

Retailer Controlled Selling Devices, as that term is defined in the Lotto America Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.11.4 – Ticketless Transactions

Ticketless Transactions, as that term is defined in the Lotto America Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.11.5 – EZ Match Add-On Feature

- A. EZ Match is an instant-win add-on feature available for all Lotto America Play types. The EZ Match feature cannot be selected and cannot be purchased independently of a Lotto America Play.
- B. The cost of the EZ Match add-on is an additional \$1.00 per Lotto America Play. For purchases of multiple Lotto America Plays in which the EZ Match feature is selected, players will receive an individual Ticket for each Play.
- C. An EZ Match Play cannot be canceled.
- D. To purchase the EZ Match add-on, the player must select the EZ Match option on the Play Slip or verbally inform the Retailer. Failure to mark the EZ Match option on a submitted Play Slip will result in the EZ Match option not being selected.
- E. Each Play with the EZ Match option will receive six (6) unique EZ Match numbers (five (5) numbers for the Lotto America Play numbers, and one (1) number as the EZ Match Star Ball (SB) number) printed below the Lotto America Play on the Ticket. Each of the six (6) EZ Match numbers will have a corresponding prize amount set forth next to the EZ Match numbers. The EZ Match numbers shall apply at the time of purchase to the Lotto America Play appearing on a Lotto America Ticket. No drawing is necessary to determine a winning EZ Match number.
- F. If one of the EZ Match numbers matches one of the Lotto America Play numbers, the player instantly wins the prize amount set forth for the matching EZ Match number(s); provided, however, the EZ Match SB number must match the Lotto America SB number to be a winning match.
- G. The range of EZ Match numbers shall be from one (1) to fifty-two (52). The range of EZ Match SB numbers shall be from one (1) to ten (10).
- H. All EZ Match numbers printed on the Ticket and their corresponding prize amounts are randomly generated by the computer gaming system.
- I. In the event the multi-draw option is selected, the EZ Match Play will be applied to the first drawing only. The EZ Match prize(s) may only be paid once, regardless of the number of draws purchased.

10.12.3 – Subscription or Subscription Play

Subscription or Subscription Play, as those terms are defined in the Millionaire for Life Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

10.12.4 – Ticketless Transactions

Ticketless Transactions, as that term is defined in the Millionaire for Life Group Rules, are not currently authorized in Mississippi.

Rule 10.13 – Description of the Fast Play Game Procedures

- A. Fast Play is an instant-win Drawing-Style game offered in a variety of Play styles and wager amounts.
- B. The cost of each Fast Play game is dependent on the game option selected at the time of the purchase.
- C. A Fast Play Ticket cannot be canceled.
- D. Each Fast Play Ticket will generate a randomly drawn result from a pool of Prizes.
- E. The individual Working Papers for each Fast Play Game shall contain the number and amount of Prizes as authorized by the President.

F. The odds of winning for each Fast Play Game, as authorized by the President and stated in the individual Working Papers, will be made available for viewing on the Lottery website (www.msllottery.com). The information shall include the following:

1. Available Prize tiers;
2. Consolidated odds of winning each available Prize tier; and
3. Overall odds of winning.

G. The MLC reserves the right at any time in its sole discretion to suspend Play or limit the number of Plays.

PART I — ADMINISTRATION

PB RULE 1—DISPUTES, VOTING, ELECTIONS.

1.1 First Review. The Product Group shall have the first opportunity to informally resolve any disputes arising among Party Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries regarding the Product Group, rules, policies, or guidelines. The Selling Lottery seeking resolution of a dispute shall seek a remedy from the Product Group by filing a notice of dispute with the Product Group. Filing shall be done by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the Executive Director. If the Product Group fails to resolve the dispute to the satisfaction of any party to the dispute within sixty (60) days after receiving notice of the dispute, the aggrieved Selling Lottery may seek any other remedy authorized by the Multi-State Lottery Agreement.

Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012.

1.2 Voting. Unless a different requirement is stated in these Rules, the Product Group shall take actions by a majority of the members casting votes.

Amended September 9, 1998; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; May 9, 2019.

1.3 Amendment of Rules. These Product Group Rules may be amended upon a vote of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes. For rule amendments under Product Group Rule 27.8, Emergency Rule-making Authority, the rules may be amended upon a vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the members casting votes.

Amended November 15, 2012; May 9, 2019; June 22, 2020; January 7, 2021.

1.4 Quorum. The quorum necessary to hold an official meeting of the Product Group shall be representation in person or by proxy from more than fifty percent (50%) of all members. If neither the Chair nor Vice-Chair can attend a scheduled meeting in person, then the meeting shall be rescheduled.

Amended November 15, 2012.

1.5 Elections. A Product Group Chair and Product Group Vice-Chair shall be elected for one-year terms to begin with the fiscal year starting July 1, 2005. The Chair shall appoint a Nominating Committee to recommend candidates to the Product Group. Nominations may also be made by motion and properly seconded.

Amended April 24, 1997. Amended May 13, 1998; September 14, 2005.

PB RULE 2 RESERVED.

PB RULE 3—BUDGET.

3.1 Duties of Executive Director. Annually or on a more frequent basis, the Executive Director shall prepare and submit to the Product Group Chair a proposed budget and fees for the Party Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries to pay the Product Group for the services it renders to them and shall be paid as a fee for services by each of the Party Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries in accordance with estimated sales. An acceptable method of payment shall be determined by the Product Group, subject to approval by the Board.

If a lottery withdraws from participation in the product group without giving proper notice of such withdrawal before approval of the group's budget, then that Participating Lottery shall not be entitled to a refund of its contributions to the budget.

If the Product Group terminates before the end of a fiscal year, all unspent funds shall be returned to the lotteries that contributed to the Group's budget, however Group contributions to MUSL overhead expenses shall not be refunded.

Amended April 24, 1997; December 12, 2001; May 4, 2005; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

PB RULE 4—DRAWINGS.

The Executive Director shall establish, with Product Group approval, the Drawing Procedures to be followed at each Powerball®, Power Play® and Double Play Drawing. The Drawing Procedures shall include procedures for randomly selecting the Powerball Winning Numbers, the Power Play multiplier, and the Double Play Winning Numbers.

Drawings shall be held at the times and places established by the Product Group and the results shall be subsequently announced to the public. All Drawings shall be open to the public and shall be witnessed by an independent certified public accounting firm and other Selling Lottery officials as may be required by jurisdiction statute.

The Participating Lottery Director shall determine the time for the end of sales of Powerball Plays and Double Play Plays prior to the Drawings, which shall not be less than a minimum of fifty-nine (59) minutes between the close of the Play sales and the time of the Drawing for those Plays sold. Lotteries shall not process Plays for that Drawing after the time established by the Participating Lottery Director.

The Product Group shall designate the type of Drawing equipment to be used and any equipment used in a Drawing shall be inspected and tested by the MUSL in the presence of an independent certified public accounting firm before the Drawing, and shall be inspected by the MUSL in the presence of an independent certified public accounting firm after the Drawing. All Drawings, inspections, and tests shall be recorded.

Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; and April 5, 2018; amended December 5, 2019; June 16, 2022.

PB RULE 5 – RESERVED.

PB RULE 6—RECORDS MANAGEMENT.

6.1 Records Defined. "Records" shall mean any document, paper, photograph, or recording made or received, in any form, in connection with the official business of the Product Group. Records do not include materials made or acquired for reference or exhibition purposes, or miscellaneous papers or correspondence without official significance.

Amended September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

6.2 Duties of Executive Director. The Executive Director shall maintain Product Group records in a secure and orderly manner.

6.3 Confidentiality. To the maximum extent practical, Product Group records shall be made available for inspection by Participating Lotteries in a reasonable and responsible manner.

Amended June 15, 2016; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

6.4 Records Retention. The Executive Director shall establish the minimum retention period for each record or class of record with Product Group approval. The Executive Director shall establish the criteria for the disposal of Product Group records.

PB RULE 7 RESERVED.

PB RULE 8—PETITION FOR ADMISSION / LOTTERY LICENSE.

8.1 Minimum ICS Standards. A Lottery seeking admission to the Product Group, or seeking a license to sell the game, shall have a fully tested internal control system that meets or exceeds the minimum standards set forth in MUSL Rule 2 (Minimum ICS Standards) before sales of Plays commence. The Security and Integrity Committee shall review the internal control systems of each lottery seeking admission to the Product Group, or seeking to become a Licensee Lottery selling a game of the Product Group, for compliance with Rule 2 (Minimum ICS Standards) and shall issue a written report summarizing its findings.

Amended November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

8.2 Other Admission Requirements. The Product Group shall determine other admission or licensing requirements as allowed by the Agreement.

**PB RULE 9—EXPULSION OR SUSPENSION OF A PARTY LOTTERY /
TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION OF A LICENSEE LOTTERY / REINSTATEMENT
OF A PARTY LOTTERY OR A LICENSEE LOTTERY**

9.1 The Product Group can expel or suspend a Party Lottery of the Product Group for cause as determined in the sole discretion of the Product Group with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes in conformance with the MUSL Agreement. If the Product Group votes to expel or suspend a Party Lottery as provided in the Agreement, the Party Lottery being considered for expulsion or suspension shall be excluded from voting on that matter, and shall also be excluded from voting in any subsequent vote by the Product Group to reinstate that Party Lottery.

Amended November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; May 9, 2019; January 7, 2021.

9.2 The Product Group can terminate or suspend the license of a Licensee Lottery for cause as determined in the sole discretion of the Product Group with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes.

Adopted December 8-9, 2009; Amended November 15, 2012; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; and April 5, 2018; May 9, 2019; January 7, 2021.

9.3 The Product Group can reinstate a Party Lottery of the Product Group with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes in conformance with the MUSL Agreement; requests for reinstatement shall be considered by the Product Group at its earliest convenience, following submission by the requesting lottery of sufficient support for such reinstatement.

Added: September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; May 9, 2019; January 7, 2021.

9.4 The Product Group can reinstate a Licensee Lottery with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes; requests for reinstatement shall be considered by the Product Group at its earliest convenience, following submission by the requesting lottery of sufficient support for such reinstatement.

Added: September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; Amended May 9, 2019; January 7, 2021.

9.5 Any Participating Lottery, which fails, is unwilling, or loses the ability to transfer prize contributions as required under these Rules, shall suspend its sales of Powerball within seven (7) days of such failure or loss of ability. The Participating Lottery may request reinstatement as provided for under these Rules. Failure to notify the Product Group of such circumstances, or of the suspension of sales, or the failure to suspend sales as required, shall be grounds for suspension or termination.

Added: September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

9.6 Any Participating Lottery that fails, is unwilling, or loses the ability to pay all prize levels in the game(s) after prize claimants have met all prize claim procedures of the Participating Lottery, the Group and the MUSL Board, shall immediately suspend its sales of Powerball upon such failure, unwillingness, or loss of ability. The Participating Lottery may request reinstatement as provided for under these Rules. Failure to notify the Product Group of such circumstances, or of the suspension of sales, or the failure to suspend sales as required, shall be grounds for suspension or termination.

Added: September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

9.7 The liabilities and obligations under these Rules of any Participating Lottery, that has been terminated, suspended, or that has suspended sales, shall continue until all such liabilities and obligations are fulfilled.

Added: September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

PB RULE 10—ADVERTISING.

10.1 Unfair Advertising. No Selling Lottery may advertise, either directly or indirectly, that Plays sold in its jurisdiction offer better odds, better chances of winning, or better payoffs than Plays sold in other jurisdictions. This rule does not prohibit a Selling Lottery from offering retailer promotions or other creative promotions designed to increase the sale of Plays.

Amended May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

10.2 Powerball Grand Prize Estimate. No Selling Lottery may advertise an estimated or guaranteed Powerball Grand Prize amount that is different than the estimated or guaranteed Powerball Grand Prize amount provided to the Selling Lottery by the Product Group.

Adopted February 1, 2006; Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; December 5, 2019.

PB RULE 11—PLAY PRICE

11.1 Uniform Price. Each Play shall be sold at retail for the price set by the Product Group.

Amended May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

11.2 Taxes. The Play price set by the Product Group shall include all the applicable taxes that a Selling Lottery may be required to collect.

Amended November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

11.3 Discounts, Rebates, and Promotions. A Selling Lottery may offer Plays through discounts, rebates, or promotions, without Product Group approval, for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days in any six-month period after advising all Group members of the terms and dates of the offering. A Selling Lottery may offer other discounts, rebates, or promotions as may be approved by the Product Group.

Amended November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

11.4 Plays as Prizes. Nothing in this rule shall prohibit a Selling Lottery from offering Plays as a prize in any other game or promotion operated by the Selling Lottery after advising all Group members of the terms and dates of the offering.

Amended December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

11.5 Contribution to Prize Pool. Selling lotteries that offer Plays as a prize or as part of an authorized discount, promotion, or rebate shall contribute to the prize pool the full amount assessed for a play sold at the uniform price.

Adopted July 5, 2002; Amended August 6, 2009; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

Comment. Rules 11.3 and 11.4 are intended to require reporting only where the price of the Play is reduced by a promotion or is given away for free. A Selling Lottery need not report promotions that do not change the price of the Play. Promotions that increase the “value” of a Play or that offer other lottery games free or at a reduced price with the purchase of a Play do not need to be reported. The intent of the rule is to advise contiguous lotteries when their players might find that they can get the same Play at a reduced price from another lottery – not that they can get that other lottery’s games at a reduced price. Comment last updated September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

PB RULE 12—SALE OF PLAYS.

12.1 Authorized Agents. Plays shall be sold only through agents and means authorized by a Selling Lottery.

Amended May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

12.2 Printed Plays. Plays shall be sold through an authorized Selling Lottery and, other than ticketless transaction Plays, shall be printed on paper that meets the security requirements used in the Selling Lottery's other games and other requirements adopted by the MUSL Board and the Product Group.

Amended November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; June 16, 2022.

12.3 MUSL Markings. All Play Slips used in the game shall contain registered game trademarks and shall communicate other information as may be required by the MUSL Board and the Group.

Amended November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; Amended March 20, 2017 to be effective with the September 30, 2017 drawing.

12.4 Game Sell Out Prohibited. No Selling Lottery shall directly and knowingly sell a Play or combination of Plays to any person or entity that would guarantee such purchaser a Powerball Grand Prize or Double Play First Prize win.

Amended November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020.

12.5 Location and Method of Sales. An offer to buy and an offer to sell a Play shall be made only at a location or only by a method that is licensed, certified, authorized, or contracted by the Selling Lottery.

Adopted February 1, 2006; Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

12.6 If a Selling Lottery receives notification from a lottery in another jurisdiction that Powerball Plays, shares, or rights in Plays issued by the Selling Lottery are being advertised, promoted or sold in that other jurisdiction, and also receives notification that such activities are not legal in that jurisdiction, the Selling Lottery has thirty (30) days to investigate and respond to the reporting jurisdiction's lottery from the date of notification; at the request of the Selling Lottery, the time to investigate and respond may be extended as necessary in the discretion of the Powerball Group Chair.

If the Selling Lottery's investigation concludes that such activities are occurring, the Selling Lottery's response must include a remedial plan to prevent such activities. The affected Selling Lottery must also provide notification to the Executive Director of the notice received, the results of the investigation, and any remedial plan. The Executive Director must transmit this information to the membership in a timely manner.

Failure to investigate, respond, and/or take remedial action to such notification may constitute "cause" as referenced in Powerball Rule 9.

Adopted November 1, 2018.

PB RULE 13—PRIZE PAYMENTS.

No Selling Lottery may pay Powerball prizes that are less than or more than the prize amounts established by the Product Group. The prize won cannot be indirectly increased by Selling Lottery promotions or agent promotions that have the effect of increasing the designated prize. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any Selling Lottery that, due to jurisdictional law requirements, separately determines its low-tier prize amounts and does not share prize liability with other lotteries, will be exempt from this rule with respect to any low tier prize amounts.

Adopted February 1, 2006; Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; September 12, 2017 and January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018.

Comment: Due to its jurisdictional law requirements, on November 15, 2012, the Powerball Group concluded that the California Lottery shall be exempt from this Rule with respect to any low-tier prize amounts.

PB RULE 14—POWERBALL AND DOUBLE PLAY PRIZE FUND TRANSFERS.

14.1 Prize Funds Transferred to MUSL.

14.1(a) Participating Lotteries. Funds shall be collected from or transferred to each Participating Lottery weekly by wire transfer, electronic funds transfer, or other means acceptable to the Product Group as described herein or as determined by the Product Group.

The amount to be transferred shall be calculated in accordance with these rules. The Product Group shall determine collection days.

Except as may be noted in 14.1(b), each Participating Lottery shall transfer to MUSL in trust an amount as determined by the Product Group to be its total proportionate share of the Powerball prize pool less actual low-tier Powerball prize liability, its proportionate share of its Power Play Prize Pool less actual Power Play prize liability, and its proportionate share of its Double Play Prize Pool, less actual Double Play low-tier prize liability. If this results in a negative amount, the MUSL central office shall transfer funds from the appropriate prize account to the Participating Lottery.

Comment: For Powerball and Power Play prize pool reserve account contributions: At its meetings on January 11, 2010 and October 13, 2020, the Product Group determined that funds shall be collected weekly from Party Lotteries on the Monday, or the first banking day that is fourteen (14) days from the applicable Monday Drawing; twelve (12) days from the applicable Wednesday Drawing; and nine (9) days from the applicable Saturday Drawing.

For Double Play prize pool contributions: At its meeting on December 5, 2019, the Product Group determined that the proportionate share of Double Play prize pool contribution funds shall be collected weekly from Participating Lotteries on the Monday or the first banking day that is fourteen (14) days from the applicable Monday Drawing; twelve (12) days from the applicable Wednesday Drawing; and nine (9) days from the applicable Saturday Drawing.

Intra-Fund Borrowing: If funds are needed to pay a prize when due, MUSL may borrow funds from other accounts of this Product Group, of the MUSL Operations Account, after approval of the Product Group Officers, the Finance and Audit Committee, and the Executive Committee. The borrowed funds shall be immediately replenished upon collection of prize funds from Participating Lotteries.

Funds to pay a Powerball prize may not be borrowed from the Double Play accounts; and, funds to pay a Double Play prize may not be borrowed from Powerball accounts.

Comment updated September 12, 2017; January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; April 5, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the Drawing on April 22, 2020; October 13, 2020 to be effective with the transfer of funds on the Monday, or the first banking day that is fourteen (14) days from the applicable Monday Drawing beginning with the August 23, 2021 drawing; January 7, 2021; February 4, 2021.

14.1(b) Licensee Lotteries. Licensee Lotteries shall adhere to PB Rule 14.1(a) unless a different process is approved by the Product Group.

Adopted December 8-9, 2009; Amended November 15, 2012.

Comment. At its meeting on December 8-9, 2009, the Product Group agreed to exclude the Licensed Lotteries involved in the cross-selling initiative of Powerball and Mega Millions from PB Rule 14.1(a) regarding Powerball and Power Play fund transfers, and such Licensee Lotteries shall transfer to the MUSL in trust an agreed-upon amount as its total proportionate share of a Powerball Grand Prize or Match 5 Bonus Prize amounts. At its meeting on June 24, 2011, the Product Group agreed to eliminate the Match 5 Bonus Prize beginning with the draw on January 18, 2012, ending the need for a Match 5 Bonus Prize transfer. By agreement with the Licensee Lotteries, MUSL will transfer Powerball Grand Prize funds to the Licensee Lotteries' Powerball Clearinghouse (currently the Virginia Lottery) within thirteen (13) calendar days from the date of the winning Powerball Grand Prize draw at a Licensee Lottery. If a winning Grand Prize Play is sold by a Party Lottery, the Licensee Lotteries' Powerball Clearinghouse shall collect the funds from the Licensee Lotteries and shall transfer their Grand prize shares to MUSL within fourteen (14) calendar days of the winning Powerball Grand Prize draw.

Comment updated September 12, 2017; January 4, 2018 to be effective January 4, 2018; April 5, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the Drawing on April 22, 2020; October 13, 2020 to be effective with the transfer of funds on the Monday, or the first banking day that is fourteen (14) days from the applicable Monday Drawing beginning with the August 23, 2021 drawing; January 7, 2021; February 4, 2021.

14.2 Powerball Grand Prize and Double Play First Prize Funds Transferred to Selling Lottery. Powerball Grand Prize amounts and Double Play First Prize amounts held by MUSL shall be transferred to the Selling Lottery immediately after the Selling Lottery validates the prize claim and for a Powerball Grand Prize, a Powerball Grand Prize payout election has been determined, and after MUSL has collected the prize pool shares from all Selling Lotteries.

Adopted September 9, 1998; Amended March 5, 2003; December 8-9, 2009; June 24, 2011 to be effective for draws beginning January 18, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; June 15, 2016.

14.3 Unclaimed Powerball Grand Prizes and Double Play First Prizes. All funds to pay a Powerball Grand Prize, or a Double Play First Prize that had been collected by MUSL from a Selling Lottery and that went unclaimed shall be returned to the Selling Lotteries in proportion to sales by Selling Lotteries for the Powerball Grand Prize or Double Play First Prize in question after the claiming period set by the Selling Lottery selling the winning Play expires.

If after a winning Play has not been claimed or redeemed and the corresponding prize monies have been returned to Selling Lotteries pursuant to this Rule, a claim is made or redemption sought that a Selling Lottery pays (i) as a result of the provisions of the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (50 U.S.C. App. §3901 as amended) (SCRA); (ii) as a result of jurisdictional legislation adopted to satisfy the requirements of the SCRA; or (iii) as a result of jurisdictional legislation requiring such payment to a member of the armed forces who was engaged in active military service outside the paying Selling Lottery jurisdiction when the usual permitted time period to make a claim or seek redemption expired, each other Selling Lottery, that was a Selling Lottery at the time of the Drawing, shall reimburse the paying Selling Lottery in an amount equal to the amount such other Selling Lottery would have contributed to the prize had the claim been made or redemption sought within the usual permitted time period for that claim or redemption. The provisions of this rule shall remain in force and effect and be binding upon the Participating Lotteries without regard to whether the Powerball game remains in existence and/or whether the Participating Lottery seeking reimbursement has withdrawn from the game at the time a Participating Lottery seeks reimbursement pursuant to this rule.

PB RULE 21—ADVANCE SALES.

Proceeds from advance sales may be held by the Selling Lottery until the draw date for which the Play applies.

PART II GENERAL RULES FOR POWERBALL AND ADD-ON GAME PROMOTIONS

PB RULE 26—DEFINITIONS.

The following definitions apply to all Parts of these rules unless the context requires a different meaning or is otherwise inconsistent with the intention of these rules adopted by the Product Group. Capitalized terms used but not defined in these rules shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the MUSL Agreement.

Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012.

26.1 “Advertised Grand Prize” shall mean the estimated annuitized Powerball Grand Prize amount as determined by the MUSL Central Office by use of the MUSL Annuity Factor and communicated through the Selling Lotteries prior to the Powerball Grand Prize Drawing. The “Advertised Grand Prize” is not a guaranteed prize amount and the actual Powerball Grand Prize amount may vary from the advertised amount, except in circumstances where there is a guaranteed Powerball Grand Prize amount as described in Rule 30.5.

Adopted May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; Amended December 5, 2019.

26.2 “Agent” or “retailer” means a person or entity authorized by a Selling Lottery to sell lottery Plays.

Amended May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018 and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

26.3 A “Drawing” refers collectively to the formal draw event for randomly selecting the winning indicia that determine the number of winners for each prize level of the Powerball game or a Powerball game promotion as described in these Rules. A Powerball Drawing shall determine the winning indicia for the Powerball game and the Power Play multiplier. Winning indicia for the Powerball game include the Winning Numbers drawn for the Powerball game, and the number drawn to determine the Power Play multiplier.

Amended November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

26.4 “Computer pick” means the random selection of game play number indicia by the authorized retailer computer that appear on a ticket or ticketless transaction and are played by a player in the game.

Amended November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; December 30, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on June 3, 2020.

26.5 “Double Play Promotion” means an add-on game to the Powerball game as defined in Part V of these Rules.

Adopted December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on June 3, 2020.

26.6 “Double Play Drawing” refers collectively to the formal draw event performed for the selection of the game results that determine the number of winners for each prize level of the Double Play Promotion.

Adopted December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on June 3, 2020.

26.7 “Double Play Plays” or “DP Plays” shall refer to a purchased wager, as defined in Part V of these Rules, that must be made at the same time a Powerball Play is purchased. Double Play Plays do not include Powerball Plays or Power Play Plays.

Adopted December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020.

26.8 "Game ticket" or "Ticket" means the physical evidence of a Play, printed on paper that meets the play and security data required by the Selling Lottery, these Game Rules, and the MUSL Rules that allow redemption of a prize. Tickets may be printed by terminals or Retailer Controlled Selling Devices as permitted by these Rules and the Selling Lottery. Affected MUSL Rules include, but are not limited to MUSL Rules 2.14, 2.20, and 2.21.

Amended October 5, 2004; November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; June 16, 2022.

26.9 "Grand Prize" shall refer to the top prize in the Powerball game.

Adopted December 10, 2014. Amended May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing.

26.10 "Licensee Lottery" shall mean a state lottery or lottery of a governmental unit, political subdivision, or entity thereof that is not a Party Lottery but has agreed to comply with all applicable MUSL and Product Group requirements and has been authorized by the MUSL and by the Powerball Product Group to sell the Powerball game.

Adopted December 8-9, 2009; Amended November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing.

26.11 "MUSL" means the Multi-State Lottery Association, a government-benefit association wholly owned and operated by the Party Lotteries.

26.12 "MUSL Annuity Factor" shall mean the annuity factor as determined by the MUSL central office through a method approved by the MUSL Finance and Audit Committee and which is used as described in these Rules.

Adopted May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing.

26.13 "MUSL Board" means the governing body of the MUSL, which is comprised of the chief executive officer of each Party Lottery.

Amended November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing.

26.14 "MUSL Finance and Audit Committee" shall mean the committee of that name established by the MUSL Board.

Adopted June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

26.15 "Pari-Mutuel" or "pari-mutuel" shall mean wagered funds that are pooled and then paid in equal shares to the winners of a prize as described in these Rules.

Adopted September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

26.16 "Party Lottery" or "Member Lottery" means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity that has joined the MUSL and, in the context of these Product Group Rules, that is authorized to sell the Powerball game. Unless otherwise indicated, "Party Lottery" or "Member Lottery" does not include "Licensee Lotteries."

Amended June 20, 2006; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing.

26.17 "Play" or "Bet" means the six (6) numbers, the first five (5) from a field of sixty-nine (69) numbers and the last one (1) from a field of twenty-six (26) numbers, that appear on a ticket or communicated in a ticketless transaction as a single lettered selection, either manually or by a Computer Pick, and are to be played by a player in the Powerball game.

"Power Play" Plays are separately described in Part III of these Rules.

Amended July 5, 2002; May 4, 2005; August 20, 2008; June 14, 2011 and effective for draws beginning January 18, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; December 5, 2019.

“Double Play” Plays are separately described in Part V of these Rules.

26.18 “Powerball Play or Plays” (aka PB Plays) shall refer to Plays purchased as a wager as part of the Powerball game, as defined in Part III of these Rules, but shall not include Power Play Plays.

26.19 “Power Play” shall refer to Power Play promotion as described in Part III of these Rules.

26.20 “Power Play Plays” shall refer to Plays purchased as part of the Power Play Promotion described in Part III of these Rules.

26.21 “Product Group” or “the Group” means a group of lotteries that has joined together to offer a product pursuant to the terms of the Multi-State Lottery Agreement and the Product Group’s own rules.

Amended November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014.

26.22 “Play Slip” or “Bet Slip” means a physical or electronic means by which a player communicates their intended Play selection to the retailer as defined and approved by the Selling Lottery. A Play Slip or Bet Slip is not a ticket or ticketless transaction.

Amended December 10, 2014; Amended March 20, 2017 to be effective with the September 30, 2017 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; June 16, 2022.

26.23 “Registered Play” means a wager where the play is owned by a specifically identified player through a means acceptable to the Selling Lottery, and which is recorded on the Selling Lottery’s computer gaming system and internal control system.

Adopted June 16, 2022.

26.24 “Retailer Controlled Selling Device” means a device which is not a Terminal and which is controlled by a retailer for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating tickets, and transmitting reports. Examples of Retailer Controlled Selling Devices include cash registers. Retailer Controlled Selling Devices must meet all security requirements of the Selling Lottery, these Rules and the MUSL Rules. Retailer Controlled Selling Devices do not include player provided point of sale devices such as smartphones.

Adopted June 16, 2022.

26.25 “Selling Lottery” or “Participating Lottery” shall mean a lottery authorized by the Product Group to sell Plays, including Party Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries.

Adopted December 8-9, 2009.

Amended May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

26.26 “Set Prize”, also referred to as “low-tier prize”, means all other prizes, except the Powerball Grand Prize and the Double Play First Prize, and, except in instances outlined in these rules, will be equal to the prize amount established by the Product Group for the prize level.

Amended November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on June 3, 2020.

26.27 “Terminal” means a device that meets all security and definitional requirements of these Rules, the MUSL Rules and the Selling Lottery, and which is authorized by a Selling Lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the Selling Lottery’s computer gaming system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating tickets, and transmitting reports. The term Terminal does

not include a Retailer Controlled Selling Device such as a cash register or player provided point of sale device such as a smartphone.

Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; June 16, 2022.

26.28 “Ticketless Transaction” means any Play that is not printed on paper that meets the anti-counterfeiting requirements described in the MUSL Rules. Examples of Ticketless Transactions include internet, subscription, and other types of Registered Plays. All Ticketless Transactions must be Registered Plays. Any Play sold through a Terminal, but which is a Registered Play requiring confirmation of the player’s identity upon prize redemption shall be considered a Ticketless Transaction even when a receipt, summation, or recognition of purchase is printed by or through the device.

26.29 Reserved.

26.30 Reserved.

26.31 Reserved.

26.32 "Winning Numbers" means the game results selected during a Drawing which shall be used to determine winning Plays contained on a Game Ticket or a Ticketless Transaction.

Amended December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on June 3, 2020; June 16, 2022.

PB RULE 27 GENERAL RULES, INCLUDING PROOF OF PLAY, PLAY CANCELLATIONS, MAXIMUM PURCHASE AND MATRIX CHANGES.

27.1 Proof of Play. Unless otherwise permitted by a selling lottery, a ticket (subject to the validation requirements set forth in Rule 31 (Play Validation)) or properly registered ticketless transaction shall be the only proof of a game Play or Plays and the submission of a winning ticket to the issuing Selling Lottery or its authorized agent shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes. A Play Slip, paper receipt or printed summation of a Play printed by a Terminal which is not a ticket has no pecuniary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of a Play purchase or numbers selected.

Amended October 5, 2004; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; June 16, 2022.

27.2 Cancellations Prohibited; Request for Plays, Returned Plays, Incomplete Transaction Plays, Stolen Plays and Refunds for Game Cancellations.

(a) **Plays Non-Cancellable.** In all instances, a Play recorded on the CGS may not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket or ticketless transaction to the Retailer or to the Selling Lottery, including tickets that are misprinted, illegible, printed in error, or for any reason not successfully transferred to an authorized selling entity or Player.

(b) **Request for Plays.** A lottery may conduct future sales through a subscription or other system that does not immediately record such sales on the CGS. A “Request for Play” is a sale that is not immediately recorded on the CGS, but is instead recorded onto the CGS at some future time prior to a draw event. At the sole discretion of the lottery, authorized sales through a subscription or other system which have not been recorded on the CGS (instead recorded as “Request for Plays”), may be cancelled at any time prior to the time the Request for Play is recorded as a Play on the CGS. If a Request for Play is cancelled, it shall not be recorded on the CGS.

Per 27.2(a), once a Play is recorded on the CGS, it may not be cancelled at any time. Any cancelled “Request for Play” shall not be include in sales data report to MUSL.

Comment: Examples of instances when Selling Lotteries may desire to permit cancellation of subscription “Request for Plays” include game matrix changes, price changes, modifications of game features, players who enroll in self-exclusion programs, and other circumstances as may be determined by the Selling Lottery.

(c) **Returned Plays.** To promote good Player or Retailer relations, a Selling Lottery, at its sole discretion, may develop a method of compensating Players or Retailers for Plays accepted by the Selling Lottery as returned to the Selling Lottery (“Returned Plays”) that are misprinted, illegible, printed in error, future Plays affected by changes in game features by the Selling Lottery or due to game cancellations.

Returned Plays may not be cancelled or voided. Returned Plays are not reported to MUSL.

The Selling Lottery Must remit its required prize pool contributions on all Plays accepted as returned Plays by the Selling Lottery.

Returned Plays may not be claimed for a prize by any person or entity, including the Selling Lottery. Any prizes which would have been won on a Returned Play shall become an unclaimed prize at the end of the prize claim period.

(d) **Incomplete Transaction Plays.** Incomplete Transaction Plays occur when a Retailer begins a Play transaction as requested by a Player, and the Play is registered on the CGS, but the transaction is terminated prior to transferring Play confirmation to the Player, there is no attempt to print the Play on a ticket, and the Player has not paid for the Play. Transaction terminations may be due to time sensitivities, communications loss or other issues as accepted by the Selling Lottery.

A Selling Lottery, at its sole discretion, may develop an approved method of managing Incomplete Transaction Plays, subject to these provisions.

Incomplete Transaction Plays may not be cancelled or voided.

The Selling Lottery must remit its required prize pool contributions on any Incomplete Transaction Plays. At its sole discretion, the Selling Lottery may develop a method of compensation Retailers for Incomplete Transaction Plays if Retailers are required to reimburse Selling Lotteries for prize pool contributions.

Incomplete Transaction Plays may not be claimed for a prize by any person or entity including the Retailer. Any prize which cannot be claimed as a prize under this Rule but would otherwise have been won on an Incomplete Transaction Play shall become an unclaimed prize at the end of the prize claim period of the drawing for which the Incomplete Transaction Play was recorded. Incomplete Transaction Plays are not reported to MUSL.

(e) Stolen Plays. Plays reported as stolen from a Retailer that have been recovered cannot be accepted by the Selling Lottery as Returned Plays.

Selling Lotteries may compensate a Retailer for the loss from theft if a Selling Lottery, solely at its discretion, determines to assume such a loss, but Stolen Plays cannot be cancelled or voided.

Ownership of Stolen Plays, and whether any party has a right to claim prizes on Stolen Plays, shall be determined by the rules of the Selling Lottery.

(f) Game Cancellation. In the event of cancellation of the Game by the Product Group prior to the occurrence of all drawings for which Plays have been sold and recorded on the CGS, the Selling Lottery may provide a refund mechanism for such Plays to the Players, and the Selling Lottery shall not be required to remit its prize pool contributions for any such refunded Plays.

(g) Selling Lotteries Prohibited from Claiming Prizes. Selling Lotteries and lottery officials are prohibited from claiming any prizes on Plays that are owned by the Selling Lottery through “Returned Plays” or otherwise acquired and held by the Selling Lottery. Any prizes that would otherwise be won on Plays owned or acquired by Selling Lotteries shall become unclaimed prizes at the end of the prize claim period.

27.3 Player Responsibility. It shall be the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game Play or Plays and other data printed on the ticket or contained in a ticketless transaction. The placing of Plays is done at the player's own risk through the agent that is acting on behalf of the player in entering the Play or Plays. The purchaser of a Play or Plays through a ticketless transaction has the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data at the time of purchase.

27.4 Entry of Plays. Plays may only be entered as approved by the Selling Lottery by such means as approved by the Selling Lottery. Retailers shall not permit the use of Play Slips that are not allowed by the Selling Lottery. Retailers shall not permit any device to enter Plays, except as allowed by the Selling Lottery.

27.5. Registration of Plays. Ticketless transaction Plays may be registered with the Selling Lottery in a manner that meets the requirements established by the Product Group, the Selling Lottery, and the MUSL Rules.

27.6 Maximum Purchase. Except for a ticketless transaction Play purchase when the lottery has a process in place to allow players to make changes to their Play purchases in the event of a game change, the maximum number of consecutive Drawings on a single Play purchase is thirty-nine (39). The maximum number of consecutive Drawings encompassed by a ticketless transaction Play purchase when the lottery has a process in place to allow players to make changes to their Play purchases in the event of a game change is one hundred fifty-six (156). The maximum number of Drawing purchases may be further limited by the Selling Lottery Director.

Adopted September 12, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; January 7, 2021.

27.7. Matrix Changes. In the event of a matrix change, the Selling Lottery that issued the ticketless transaction will determine the option(s) available to ticketless transaction purchasers from that Selling Lottery for the balance of Plays remaining on their ticketless transactions effective as of the date of the matrix change.

Adopted September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

27.8 Emergency Rule-making Authority. Pursuant to the Product Group’s fiduciary duties, it may become necessary for the Product Group to adopt rule changes or modifications to protect the integrity of the game in response to an imminent crisis or emergency. Such rule changes or modifications shall take into effect immediately, or otherwise as indicated by the Product Group, without prior notification to players or the public.

A rule change or modification adopted pursuant to this Section is effective upon the affirmative vote of three-fourths (3/4) or more of the Members casting votes, and shall continue in effect until otherwise determined by the Product Group.

Adopted June 22, 2020; Amended January 7, 2021.

Comment: the Product Group recognizes that rule-making procedures in each participating jurisdiction are unique and play a critical role in the governance of the multi-jurisdictional game; this Rule should be adopted by each jurisdiction for clarity to Players and the public.

PB RULES 28 – 29 RESERVED.

PB RULE 30 PRIZE PAYMENTS.

30.1 Powerball Grand Prize.

Portions of Rule 30.1 were previously amended: September 9, 1998, December 21, 1998, March 15, 1999, February 3, 2002; July 5, 2002; May 4, 2005; October 11, 2006; August 20, 2008; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013 to be effective October 1, 2013; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing; June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

(a) Powerball Grand Prizes shall be paid, at the election of the player made no later than sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, with either a per-winner annuity or single lump sum payment (which may be referred to as the “cash option”). If the payment election is not made at the time of purchase and is not made by the player within sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, then the prize shall be paid as an annuity prize. An election for an annuity payment made by a player before ticket purchase or by system default or design may be changed to a cash option payment at the election of the player until the expiration of sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. The election to take the cash option payment may be made at the time of the prize claim or within sixty (60) days after the player

becomes entitled to the prize. An election made after the winner becomes entitled to the prize is final and cannot be revoked, withdrawn, or otherwise changed.

(b) The Powerball Grand Prize available in the GPP shall be determined by dividing the funds available in the GPP on a pari-mutuel basis among all winning PB Plays of the Powerball Grand Prize as described in these Rules.

Winner(s) who elect a cash option payment shall be paid their share(s) in a single lump sum payment.

The annuitized option prize shall be determined by multiplying a winner's share of the Powerball Grand Prize pool by a process as approved by the MUSL Board.

Neither MUSL nor the Selling Lotteries shall be responsible or liable for changes in the advertised or estimated annuity prize amount and the actual amount purchased after the prize payment method is actually known to MUSL.

Amended September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

(c) In certain instances announced by the Product Group, the Powerball Grand Prize shall be a guaranteed amount and shall be determined pursuant to Rule 30.5.

(d) If individual shares of the GPP funds held to fund an annuity is less than \$250,000.00, the Product Group, in its sole discretion, may elect to pay the winners their share of the funds held in the GPP.

(e) All annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in thirty (30) payments with the initial payment being made in a single payment, to be followed by twenty-nine (29) payments funded by the annuity. Except as may be controlled by a Selling Lottery's governing statute, all annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in thirty (30) graduated payments (increasing each year) by a rate as determined by the Product Group. Prize payments may be rounded down to the nearest one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). Annual payments after the initial payment shall be made by the lottery on the anniversary date or if such date falls on a non-business day, then the first business day following the anniversary date of the selection of the Grand Prize Winning Numbers.

Comment: On July 8, 2005, the Product Group set the graduated rate at four percent (4%) per year. On May 22, 2015 (to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing), the Product Group set the graduated rate at five percent (5%) per year.

(f) Funds for the initial payment of an annuitized prize or the lump sum cash option prize payment shall be made available by MUSL for payment by the Selling Lottery no earlier than the fifteenth calendar day (or the next banking day if the fifteenth day is a holiday) following the Drawing. If necessary, when the due date for the payment of a prize occurs before the receipt of funds in the prize pool trust sufficient to pay the prize, the transfer of funds for the payment of the full lump sum cash option amount may be delayed pending receipt of funds from the Selling Lotteries. A paying lottery may elect to make the initial payment from its own funds after validation, with notice to MUSL.

Comment: On September 9, 1998, the Product Group mandated a delay in payment to a Selling Lottery until the validation of the claim. On August 20, 2008, the Product Group authorized the use of a Party Lottery's share of MUSL non-game earnings to fund annuity payments, as may be needed, in a manner other than provided for in this rule, due to mandates of local statute.

(g) If a Party Lottery purchases or holds the prize payment annuity for a prize won in that jurisdiction, that Party Lottery's game rules, and any prize payment agreement with the prize winner, shall indicate that the prize winner has no recourse on the MUSL or any other Selling Lottery for payment of that prize.

(h) In the event of the death of a lottery winner during the annuity payment period, unless prohibited by jurisdictional law, the MUSL Finance & Audit Committee, in its sole discretion excepting a discretionary review by the Product Group, upon the petition of the estate of the lottery winner (the "Estate") to the lottery of the jurisdiction in which the deceased lottery winner purchased the winning PB Play, and subject to federal, state, district, or territorial applicable laws, may accelerate the payment of all of the remaining lottery proceeds to the Estate. If such a determination is made, then securities and/or cash held to fund the deceased lottery winner's annuitized prize may be distributed to the Estate. The identification of the securities to fund the annuitized prize shall be at the sole discretion of the Finance & Audit Committee or the Product Group.

Amended September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

Comment. Changes made to this Rule on December 21, 1998, are intended to provide players with the advantages offered by the changes made to 26 U.S.C. §451. These rules should be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the purposes, requirements, and restrictions of that code section. Due to its jurisdictional law, on November 15, 2012, the Powerball Group concluded that the provisions relating to acceleration of annuity payments to an estate shall not be applicable to the California Lottery.

30.2 First Prize for Double Play.

(a) The Double Play First Prize is a fixed, non-annuitized value of \$10 million for each Double Play Drawing.

(b) If, in any Double Play drawing there are no DP Plays that qualify for the first Prize category, the portion of the prize fund allocated to such First Prize category shall remain in the First Prize pool for the next Double Play drawing.

(c) Funds for the payment of a First Prize shall be made available by MUSL for payment by the Selling Lottery on a schedule approved by the Product Group. If necessary, when the due date for the payment of a First Prize occurs before the receipt of funds in the FPP trust sufficient to pay the prize, the transfer of funds for the payment of the First Prize may be delayed pending receipt of funds from the Selling Lotteries participating in the Double Play Promotion. A Selling Lottery may elect to make the First Prize payment from its own funds after validation, with notice to MUSL.

Adopted December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020.

30.3 Set Prize. A Selling Lottery may begin paying low-tier prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office. If a Selling Lottery, due to jurisdictional law requirements, separately determines its low-tier prize amounts, it shall be solely responsible for its low-tier prize liability, and may begin paying low-tier prizes after a Drawing when it determines appropriate to do so.

Amended December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

Comment: Due to jurisdictional law requirements, on November 15, 2012, the Powerball Group concluded that the California Lottery shall separately determine the low-tier prize values for that jurisdiction.

30.4 Process for Prize Payments. All prizes (whether described as "cash" payment prizes or otherwise) shall be paid through the Selling Lottery that sold the winning Play(s) and at the discretion of the Selling Lottery that sold the winning Play(s) may be paid by cash, check, warrant or electronic transfer.

30.5 Powerball Grand Prizes Rounded. Annuitized payments of the Powerball Grand Prize or a share of the Powerball Grand Prize may be rounded to facilitate the purchase of an appropriate funding mechanism. Breakage on an annuitized Powerball Grand Prize win shall be added to the first payment to the winner or winners. Prizes other than the Powerball Grand Prize, which, under these rules, may become single-payment, pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Except with regards to low-tier prizes paid by a Selling Lottery which separately determines its low-tier prize amounts pursuant to Rule 30.3, breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next Drawing.

Amended November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014.

Comment: Due to jurisdictional law requirements, on November 15, 2012, the Powerball Group concluded that the California Lottery shall separately determine the low-tier prize values for that jurisdiction.

30.6 Powerball Prize Rollover. If the Powerball Grand Prize is not won in a Drawing, the prize money allocated for the Grand Prize shall roll over and be added to the GPP for the following Drawing.

Amended July 5, 2002; June 24, 2011 and effective for draws beginning January 18, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing.

30.7 Guaranteed Powerball Prizes.

30.7(a) The Product Group may offer guaranteed minimum Grand Prize amounts or minimum increases in the Grand Prize amount between Drawings or make other changes in the allocation of prize money where the Product Group finds that it would be in the best interest of the game.

Amended June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

30.7(b) If a minimum Grand Prize amount or a minimum increase in the Grand Prize amount between Drawings is offered by the Product Group, then the Grand Prize shares shall be determined as follows:

30.7(b)(1) If there are multiple Grand Prize winners during a single Drawing, each selecting the annuitized option prize, then a winner's share of the guaranteed annuitized Grand Prize shall be determined by dividing the guaranteed annuitized Grand Prize by the number of Grand Prize winning PB Plays;

Amended September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018 and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018

30.7(b)(2) If there are multiple Grand Prize winners during a single Drawing and at least one (1) of the Grand Prize winners has elected the annuitized option prize, then the MUSL Annuity Factor shall be utilized to determine the cash pool. The cost of the annuitized prize(s) will be determined at the time the annuity is purchased through a process as approved by the MUSL Board;

30.7(b)(3) If no winner of the Grand Prize during a single Drawing has elected the annuitized option prize, then the amount of cash in the GPP shall be an amount equal to the guaranteed annuitized amount divided by the MUSL Annuity Factor.

Amended June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

30.7(c) Minimum guaranteed prizes or increases may be waived if the alternate funding mechanism set out in Rule 36.3(1)(c) becomes necessary. Approval of the Group is required to change the guaranteed minimum Grand Prize amounts or minimum increases in the Grand Prize amount. The Group may increase, decrease or eliminate the guaranteed minimum Grand Prize amount of any announced minimum Grand Prize increases effective at any time following the next drawing following the action taken by the Group.

Amended November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013 to be effective October 1, 2013; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing; June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016; April 1, 2020 to be effective after the April 8, 2020 drawing.

Comments:

The SAP has a cap of \$20 million dollars.

The Product Group has determined that the minimum Grand Prize shall be \$40 million annuity and the minimum increases in the Grand Prize shall be \$10 million annuity between draws. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the numerous stay at home orders and business operation restrictions affecting normal player consumer opportunities, fixing \$40 million (annuity) minimum starting Grand Prize amounts and maintaining \$10 million (annuity) increases between drawings is unsustainable. On March 25, 2020, the Product Group determined that effective following the next Grand Prize win, the minimum Grand Prize shall be twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) annuity and the minimum increases in the Grand Prize shall be two million dollars (\$2,000,000) annuity between draws. On April 1, 2020, the Product Group determined that, effective after the Drawing on April 8, 2020, any minimum starting Grand Prize and any minimum increases in the Grand Prize between drawings shall be as determined and announced by the Group Chair and Vice-Chair.

Comment last amended April 1, 2020 to be effective after the Drawing on April 8, 2020.

30.7(d) Funding of Guaranteed Grand Prizes. If the amount in the GPP, GPCFP and SAP and contributions from Licensee Lotteries who are not participating in the PRA are insufficient to fund the amount required by awarded Guaranteed Grand Prize(s), then the PRA, and thereafter contributions from individual Member Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries participating in the PRA, may be required to fund Guaranteed Grand Prize award deficiencies. Contributions from the PRA shall first be utilized, and then contributions from individual Member Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries participating in the PRA if necessary.

Contributions required from the PRA or from Member Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries participating in the PRA shall be determined on a pro rata basis based on sales since the most recent Grand Prize win.

Adopted January 6, 2022.

30.8 Limited to Highest Powerball Prize Won.

(a) The holder of a winning PB Play may win only one (1) prize per PB Play in connection with the winning numbers drawn for the Powerball game, and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category.

(b) The holder of a winning DP Play may win only one (1) prize per Play in connection with the winning numbers drawn for the Double Play game, and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category.

(c) A player may win both a PB prize and also a DP prize if the player purchased the DP add-on option to the Powerball Play, and if the PB Play and the DP Play match the winning numbers drawn for both the Powerball game and the Double Play game.

(d) All liabilities for a Powerball prize, a Power Play prize, and a Double Play prize are discharged upon payment of a prize claim.

Amended November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020.

30.9 Prize Claim Period. Prize claims shall be submitted within the period set by the Selling Lottery selling the PB Play or DP Play. If no such claim period is established, all Grand Prize claims and Double Play First Prize claims shall be made within one hundred eighty (180) days after the Drawing date.

Amended November 15, 2012; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

30.10 Winner Disclosure. Subject to the laws and regulations of each Participating Lottery jurisdiction, and at the discretion of the Director of each Participating Lottery where disclosure is permitted, the name and community of the winner of a Powerball Grand Prize or Match 5+0 prize will be disclosed in a press conference or in a press release of the Participating Lottery.

Adopted September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

PB RULE 31—PLAY VALIDATION FOR POWERBALL AND DOUBLE PLAY.

31.1 To be a valid Play and eligible to receive a prize, a Play's ticket or ticketless transaction shall satisfy all the requirements established by a Selling Lottery for validation of winning Plays sold through its computer gaming system and any other validation requirements adopted by the Product Group, the MUSL Board, and published as the Confidential MUSL Minimum Game Security Standards. The MUSL and the Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for tickets or ticketless transactions that are altered in any manner.

Amended September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020.

31.2 Under no circumstances will a claim be paid for any prize without an official ticket (or validly registered ticketless transaction) matching all game Play, serial number and other validation data residing in the Selling Lottery's computer gaming system and such ticket (or validly registered ticketless transaction) shall be the only valid proof of the wager placed and the only valid receipt for claiming or redeeming such prize.

Amended September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

31.3 In addition to the above, in order to be deemed a valid, winning Play, unless the Play is a validly registered ticketless transaction, all of the following conditions must be met:

- (a) The validation data must be present in its entirety and must correspond, using the computer validation file, to the number selections printed on the ticket for the Drawing date(s) printed on the ticket;
- (b) The ticket must be intact;
- (c) The ticket must not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted, or tampered with in any manner;
- (d) The ticket must not be counterfeit or an exact duplicate of another winning ticket;
- (e) The ticket must have been issued by an authorized sales agent, or retailer of the Selling Lottery and printed on paper in compliance with MUSL Rule 2;

- (f) The ticket must not have been stolen, to the knowledge of the Selling Lottery;
- (g) The Play data must have been recorded on the Selling Lottery's computer gaming system prior to the Drawing and the Play data must match this computer record in every respect. In the event of a conflict between information as printed on the ticket and as accepted by the Selling Lottery's computer gaming system, the wager accepted by the Selling Lottery's computer gaming system shall be the valid wager;
- (h) The player or computer pick number selections, validation data and the Drawing date(s) of an apparent winning Play must appear on the official file of winning Plays, and a Play with that exact data must not have been previously paid;
- (i) The play must not be mis-registered, and the Play's ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error to an extent that it cannot be processed by the Selling Lottery that issued the Play;
- (j) In submitting a Play for validation, the claimant agrees to abide by applicable laws, all rules and regulations, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Director of the Selling Lottery that issued the Play;
- (k) There must not be any other breach of these Powerball Game Rules in relation to the Play that, in the opinion of the Director of the Selling Lottery that issued the Play, justifies invalidation.
- (l) The Play must be submitted to the Selling Lottery that issued it.
- (m) Ticketless transaction Plays must meet the validation requirements of the Selling Lottery that issued the Play.

Amended September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; June 16, 2022.

31.4 A Play submitted for validation that fails any of the validation conditions shall be considered void, subject to the following determinations:

- (a) In all cases of doubt, the determination of the Selling Lottery shall be final and binding; however, the Selling Lottery may, at their option, replace an invalid Play with a Play of equivalent sales price;
- (b) In the event a defective ticket is purchased or in the event the Selling Lottery determines to adjust an error, the Claimant's sole and exclusive remedy shall be the replacement of such defective or erroneous ticket(s) with a Play of equivalent sales price;
- (c) In the event a Play is not paid by a Selling Lottery and a dispute occurs as to whether the Play is a winning Play, the Selling Lottery may, at its option, replace the Play as provided in paragraph (i) of this subsection. This shall be the sole and exclusive remedy of the Claimant unless the laws or regulations governing the Selling Lottery provide for further administrative review.

Amended November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

PB RULE 32—TICKET RESPONSIBILITY.

32.1 Prize Claims. Prize claim procedures shall be governed by the rules of the selling lottery. The MUSL and the Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for prizes that are not claimed following the proper procedures as determined by the selling lottery.

Amended November 20, 1998; December 21, 1998; October 5, 2004; November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013.

32.2 Reserved.

32.3 Stolen Tickets. The Product Group, the MUSL and the Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for lost or stolen tickets.

32.4 Ticketless Transactions. A Ticketless Transaction Play is only valid when registered with the lottery in accordance with lottery rules, these Rules and the MUSL Rules. The person or, if permitted by the lottery rules, the persons registering the Play shall be the owner of the Ticketless Transaction Play. A receipt for a Ticketless Transaction Play has no value and is not evidence of a Play.

Amended June 16, 2022.

32.5 The MUSL and the Participating Lotteries shall not be responsible to a prize claimant for Plays redeemed in error by a selling agent, sales agent or retailer.

32.6 Winners are determined by the numbers drawn and certified by the independent auditor responsible for auditing the Powerball and Double Play Drawings. MUSL and the Participating Lotteries are not responsible for winning numbers reported in error.

Adopted February 1, 2006. Amended June 25, 2013; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020.

PB RULE 33—INELIGIBLE PLAYERS.

33.1 A Play or share for the Powerball game issued by any of its Selling Lotteries shall not be purchased by, and a prize won by any such Play or share shall not be paid to:

- (a) a MUSL employee, officer, or director;
- (b) a contractor or consultant under agreement with the MUSL to review the MUSL audit and security procedures;
- (c) an employee of an independent accounting firm under contract with MUSL to observe Drawings or site operations and actually assigned to the MUSL account and all partners, shareholders, or owners in the local office of the firm; or
- (d) an immediate family member (parent, stepparent, child, stepchild, spouse, or sibling) of an individual described in subsections (a), (b), and (c) and residing in the same household.

Amended September 30, 1996; November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

33.2 Those persons designated by a Selling Lottery's law as ineligible to play its games shall also be ineligible to play the Powerball game in that Selling Lottery's jurisdiction.

Amended June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

PB RULE 34—APPLICABLE LAW.

In purchasing a Play, or attempting to claim a prize, purchasers and prize claimants agree to comply with and abide by all applicable laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Selling Lottery where the Play was purchased, and by directives and determinations of the director of that Selling Lottery.

A prize claimant agrees, as its sole and exclusive remedy that claims arising out of a Play can only be pursued against the Selling Lottery which issued the Play. Litigation, if any, shall only be maintained within the jurisdiction in which the Powerball Play was purchased and only against the Selling Lottery that issued the Play. No claim shall be made against any other Participating Lottery or against the MUSL

Nothing in these Rules shall be construed as a waiver of any defense or claim the Selling Lottery which issued the Play, any other Participating Lottery or MUSL may have in any litigation, including in the event a player or prize claimant pursues litigation against the Selling Lottery, any other Participating Lottery or MUSL, or their respective officers, directors or employees.

All decisions made by a Selling Lottery, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof and the interpretation of Powerball Rules, shall be final and binding on all Play purchasers and on every person making a prize claim in respect thereof, but only in the jurisdiction where the Powerball Play was issued.

Unless the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Lottery which issued the Play provide otherwise, no prize shall be paid upon a Play purchased, claimed or sold in violation of these Rules or the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Selling Lottery; any such prize claimed but unpaid shall constitute an unclaimed prize under these Rules and the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Selling Lottery.

PART III – POWERBALL GAME

PB RULE 35—POWERBALL GAME DESCRIPTION.

35.1 Powerball Game.

35.1(a) Powerball is a five (5) out of sixty-nine (69) plus one (1) out of twenty-six (26) numbers lottery game drawn every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday as part of the Powerball Drawing, which pays the Grand Prize, at the election of the player made in accordance with these rules or by a default election made in accordance with these rules, either on an annuitized pari-mutuel basis or as a single lump sum payment of the total funding held in the Grand Prize Pool (GPP) for the winning Drawing on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a single payment basis.

Amended October 13, 2020 to include Monday drawings to be effective with the drawing on August 23, 2021.

35.1(b) Powerball Winning Numbers applicable to determine Powerball prizes will be determined in the Powerball Drawing. During the Drawing, five (5) numbers shall be drawn from the first set of sixty-nine (69) numbers, and one (1) number shall be drawn from the second set of twenty-six (26) numbers, which shall constitute the Winning Numbers.

Double Play winning numbers shall not be used to determine Powerball prizes. Powerball winning numbers shall not be used to determine Double Play prizes.

Amended December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020.

35.1(c) To play Powerball, a player shall select (or computer pick) five (5) different numbers, from one (1) through sixty-nine (69) and one (1) additional number from one (1) through twenty-six (26). The additional number may be the same as one of the first five numbers selected by the player.

35.1(d) PB Plays can be purchased for two dollars (U.S. \$2.00), including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a PB Play.

35.1(e) PB Plays may be purchased from a Selling Lottery approved sales outlet in a manner as approved by the Selling Lottery and in accordance with MUSL Rules

Amended December 21, 1998, February 3, 2002; July 5, 2002; May 4, 2005; August 20, 2008; December 8-9, 2009; June 14, 2011 and effective for draws beginning January 18, 2012; November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014; December 30, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

PB RULE 36—POWERBALL PRIZE POOL

36.1 Powerball Prize Pool. The prize pool for all Powerball prize categories shall consist of fifty percent (50%) of each Drawing period's Powerball sales, inclusive of any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a PB Play, and including contributions to the prize pool accounts and prize reserve accounts; prize pool contribution requirements shall be based on the sales price for Plays as established by the Group, not on the amount collected by the Selling Lottery after deducting for statutorily mandated taxes.

Amended August 20, 2008; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013; December 10, 2014; December 30, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 23, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; September 24, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on March 30, 2019.

36.2(a) Powerball Prize Pool Accounts and Prize Reserve Accounts. The Product Group shall set the contribution rates to the prize pool and to one or more prize reserve or pool accounts established by this rule.

(i) The following prize reserve accounts for the Powerball game are hereby established:

- (a) the Prize Reserve Account (PRA), which is used to guarantee the payment of valid, but unanticipated, Grand Prize claims that may result from a system error or other reason, or to fund Guaranteed Grand Prizes per Rule 30.7(d); and
- (b) the Set Prize Reserve Account (SPRA), which is used to fund deficiencies in low-tier Powerball prize payments (subject to the limitations of these rules).

Amended January 6, 2022

(ii) The following prize pool accounts for the Powerball game are hereby established:

- (a) the GPP, which is used to fund the current Grand Prize;
- (b) the Set Prize Pool (SPP), which is used to fund the Set Prizes. The SPP shall hold the temporary balances that may result from having fewer than expected winners in the Set Prize (aka low-tier prize) categories. The source of the SPP is the Party Lottery's weekly prize contributions less actual Set Prize liability;
- (c) the Set-Aside Pool (SAP), which is used to fund the payment of the awarded minimum starting annuity Grand Prizes and minimum annuity Grand Prize increase, if necessary (subject to the limitations in these rules), as may be set by the Product Group; and
- (d) the Grand Prize Carry Forward Pool (GPCFP), which is used to fund the starting minimum annuity Grand Prize, as may be set by the Product Group, if such funds are available, and if sales do not fund the Grand Prize.

(iii) The above prize reserve accounts, the GPCFP and the SAP shall have maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers that are set by the Product Group and are detailed in the *Comments* to this Rule.

The maximum balance amounts and balance limit triggers are subject to review by the MUSL Board Finance and Audit Committee. The Finance and Audit Committee shall have two weeks to state objections, if any, to the approved maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers. Approved maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers shall become effective no sooner than two weeks after notice is given to the Finance and Audit Committee and no objection is stated or sooner if the Committee affirmatively approves the maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers. The Group may appeal the Committee's objections to the full Board. Group approved changes in the maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers set by the Product Group shall be effective only after the next Grand Prize win.

(iv) The maximum contribution rate to the GPP shall be 68.0131% of the prize pool (34.0066% of sales) except as provided in Rule 30.7(d).

Amended January 6, 2022.

An amount up to five percent (5%) of a Party Lottery's sales shall be deducted from a Party Lottery's GPP contribution and placed in trust in one or more prize pool accounts and prize reserve accounts held by the Product Group (hereinafter the "prize pool and reserve deduction") at any time that the prize pool accounts and Party Lottery's share of the prize reserve accounts(s) is below the amounts designated by the Product Group.

An additional amount up to twenty percent (20%) of a Party Lottery's sales shall be deducted from a Party Lottery's GPP contribution and placed in trust in the GPCFP to be held by the Product Group at a time as determined by the Product Group.

Amended June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

(v) The Product Group may determine to expend all or a portion of the funds in the Powerball prize pool accounts (except the GPP account and the GPCFP) and the prize reserve accounts:

- (1) for the purpose of indemnifying the Party Lotteries and Licensee Lotteries in the payment of prizes to be made by the Selling Lotteries; and
- (2) for the payment of prizes or special prizes in the game, limited to prize pool and prize reserve contributions from lotteries participating in the special prize promotion, subject to the approval of the Board's Finance & Audit Committee or that Committee's failure to object after given two weeks' notice of the planned action, which actions may be appealed to the full Board by the Product Group.

The GPCFP may only be expended to fund the starting minimum annuity Grand Prize.

(vi) The prize reserve shares of a Party Lottery may be adjusted with refunds to the Party Lottery from the prize reserve account(s) as may be needed to maintain the approved maximum balance and sales percentage shares of the Party Lotteries.

Amended June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

(vii) A Party Lottery may contribute to its sales percentage share of prize reserve accounts over time, but in the event of a draw down from a prize reserve account, a Party Lottery is responsible for its full sales percentage share of the prize reserve account, whether or not it has been paid in full.

Amended June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

(viii) Any amount remaining in the Powerball prize pool accounts or prize reserve accounts when the Product Group declares the end of the game shall be returned to the lotteries participating in the accounts after the end of all claim periods of all Selling Lotteries, carried forward to a replacement game, or otherwise expended in a manner at the election of the individual Members of the Product Group in accordance with jurisdiction statute.

Amended December 12, 2001; August 1, 2003; August 20, 2008; December 8-9, 2009; November 15, 2012; May 13, 2013 to be effective October 1, 2013; June 25, 2013; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014; December 30, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 23, 2015 and October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing.

Comment. The SPRA and the SPP, to the extent they exist, may be used to fund a deficiency in Power Play multiplier prizes; but monies from the GPP may not be used to fund or increase a Power Play prize. As permitted by Rule 30.5 and as required by Rule 28.2(a)(iii), on October 25, 2011, the Powerball Product Group set the maximum SAP balance amount at \$20 million and the maximum SPRA balance amount at \$40 million. As required by Rule 28.2(a)(iii), on November 15, 2012, the Product Group set the maximum PRA balance amount at \$80 million.

On May 13, 2013, the Group determined that, effective October 1, 2013, the prize pool and reserve deduction is set to begin at two percent (2%) when the annuity Grand Prize, as determined after sales are known, exceeds one hundred twenty million (\$120,000,000.00), and four percent (4%) when the annuity Grand Prize, as determined after sales are known exceeds two hundred fifty million dollars (\$250,000,000.00). Any amount of the prize pool and reserve deduction shall first be used to fund the SAP until it reaches its maximum established balance amount, and then shall be used to fund the prize reserve accounts until they reach their individual maximum established balance amounts. Any amount of the prize pool and reserve deduction not used to fund the SAP or prize reserve accounts shall become part of the GPP.

As required by Rule 28.2(a)(iii), on September 23, 2015, as modified by Group action on January 27, 2016, and on June 15, 2016, the Group established a balance limit trigger for the GPCFP as follows: Effective with the Drawing on July 2 2016, at any time that the GPCFP is below forty-five million dollars (\$45,000,000) prior to a Drawing, the GPCFP deduction from a Party Lottery's GPP contribution for that drawing shall be equal to a maximum of four percent (4%) of a Party Lottery's sales when the annuity Grand Prize, as determined after sales are known, exceeds one hundred twenty million dollars (\$120,000,000.00); the GPCFP percentage shall be reduced by the percentage of sales being actually contributed to the SAP, SPRA or the PRA. At any time that the GPCFP exceeds forty-five million dollars (\$45,000,000) prior to a Drawing, there shall be no GPCFP deduction for that Drawing. On June 15, 2016 the Group agreed to continue contributions to the GPCFP after August 2, 2017.

Approval of the Group is required to change the prize pool and prize reserve deduction percentages, maximum balances and balance limit trigger levels.

Comment last modified June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on July 2, 2016; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

36.2(b) Licensee Lotteries. Licensee Lotteries shall adhere to PB Rule 36.2(a) unless a different process is approved by the Product Group.

Adopted December 8-9, 2009.

Comment. At its meeting on December 8-9, 2009, and under the terms of the Cross-Selling Agreement, the Product Group agreed to exclude the Licensed Lotteries from contributing to the prize pool accounts (other than the GPP) and prize reserve accounts with the agreement of the Licensed Lotteries to be responsible for the payment of their shares of all prizes won.

Comment last modified October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing.

36.3 Expected Powerball Prize Payout Percentages.

(1) The Grand Prize payout shall be determined on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as otherwise mandated by jurisdiction statute or judicial requirements, or provided for in these rules, all other prizes awarded shall be paid as set single payment prizes. All prize payouts are made with the following expected prize payout percentages, although the prize payout percentage per draw may vary:

(a) The prize money allocated to the Grand Prize category shall be divided on a pari-mutuel basis by the number of PB Plays winning the Grand Prize.

(b) **Powerball Set Prize Pool Carried Forward.** For Party Lotteries, the Powerball SPP (for single payment prizes of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the Powerball Set Prizes awarded in the current draw.

Amended June 25, 2013; June 5, 2014; December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing.

(c) Pari-Mutuel Powerball Prize Determinations. Except as provided for in 36.3(1)(c)(1)(c), for Party Lotteries:

Amended December 10, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing.

(1)(a) If the total of the Powerball Set Prizes (as multiplied by the respective Power Play multiplier if applicable) awarded in a Drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the Powerball Set Prizes, then the amount needed to fund the Powerball Set Prizes, including Power Play prizes, awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

- (i)** the amount available in the SPP and the Power Play Prize Pool, if any;
- (ii)** an amount from the SPRA, if available, not to exceed forty million dollars (\$40,000,000.00) per Drawing; and
- (iii)** other amounts as agreed to by the Product Group in its sole discretion.

Amended June 25, 2013 effective October 1, 2013; December 10, 2014; December 30, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; June 15, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 19, 2016.

(1)(b) If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the Set Prizes awarded, including Power Play prizes, then the highest Set Prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest Set Prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest Set Prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining Set Prizes awarded, then the next highest Set Prize, including Power Play prizes, shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all Set Prize levels, if necessary, until all Set Prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels; In that circumstance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning PB Plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Powerball Set Prizes and Power Play prizes will be reduced by the same percentage.

(1)(c) By agreement with the Licensee Lotteries, the Licensee Lotteries shall independently calculate their Set Prize pari-mutuel prize amounts. The Party Lotteries and the Licensee Lotteries shall then agree to set the pari-mutuel prize amounts for all lotteries selling the game at the lesser of the independently calculated prize amounts.

Amended June 25, 2013 effective October 1, 2013; December 10, 2014.

Comment. The California Lottery is excluded from the Party Lotteries' and other Licensee Lotteries' pari-mutuel prize calculations.

(2) Licensee Lotteries. Licensee Lotteries shall adhere to PB Rule 36.3(1)(c)(1)(a) and (b) unless a different process is approved by the Product Group.

Comment. The California Lottery is excluded from the Party Lotteries' and other Licensee Lotteries' pari-mutuel prize calculations. At its meeting on December 8-9, 2009, and under the terms of the Cross-Selling Agreement, the Product Group agreed to exclude the Licensed Lotteries from contributing to the prize pool accounts (other than the GPP) and prize reserve accounts with the agreement of the Licensed Lotteries to be responsible for the payment of their shares of all prizes won subject to the agreement noted in 28.3(1)(c)(1)(c).

Comment last modified October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing.

PB RULE 37 PROBABILITY OF WINNING POWERBALL PRIZES. The following table sets forth the probability of winning and the probable distribution of winners in and among each prize category, based upon the total number of possible combinations in Powerball. The Set Prize Amount shall be the prizes set for all Selling Lotteries unless prohibited or limited by a jurisdiction’s statute or judicial requirements.

PART III – POWERBALL POWER PLAY® PROMOTION.

Adopted January 26, 2001.

APPLICABILITY OF THESE RULES: The Part III Power Play® Promotion Rules are applicable to all Selling Lotteries, except as may be controlled by a Selling Lottery's governing jurisdiction statute. The Product Group shall reach an agreement with such lotteries that will permit the operation of the promotion in a manner consistent with statute.

Adopted December 8-9, 2009; Amended November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing.

Comment: Due to its jurisdictional law requirements, the California Lottery will not offer the Power Play promotion.

PB RULE A — PROMOTION DESCRIPTION.

The Powerball Power Play® promotion is a limited extension of the Powerball game and is conducted in accordance with the Powerball game rules and other lottery rules applicable to the Powerball game, except as may be amended herein. The promotion will begin at a time announced by the Selling Lottery and will continue until discontinued by the lottery. The promotion will offer to the owners of a qualifying Play a chance to increase the amount of any of the eight (8) lowest Set Prizes (the prizes normally paying four dollars (\$4.00) to one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00)) won in a Drawing held during the promotion. The Grand Prize is not a Set Prize and will not be increased.

Participating Lotteries may require purchase of the Power Play promotion when a player purchases a Powerball Play.

Power Play is not applicable to the Powerball Double Play Promotion described in Part V of these Rules.

Amended July 5, 2002; May 4, 2005; August 25, 2010; June 24, 2011 and effective for draws beginning January 18, 2012; November 15, 2012; June 5, 2014; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018; December 5, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 22, 2020; February 4, 2021.

PB RULE B — QUALIFYING PLAY.

A qualifying Play is any single Powerball Play for which the player pays an extra dollar for the Power Play option and that is recorded at the Selling Lottery's computer gaming system as a qualifying Power Play Play.

Amended November 15, 2012; May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

PB RULE C – PRIZES TO BE INCREASED.

Except as provided in these rules, a qualifying Play which wins one of seven lowest Set Prizes (excluding the Match 5+0 prize) will be multiplied by the number selected, either two, three, four, five or sometimes ten (2, 3, 4, 5 or sometimes 10), in a separate random Power Play Drawing announced during the official Powerball Drawing show. The ten (10X) multiplier will be available for drawings in which the initially advertised annuitized Grand Prize amount is one hundred fifty million dollars (\$150,000,000.00) or less. The announced Match 5+0 prize, for players selecting the Power Play option, shall be two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) unless a higher limited promotional dollar amount is announced by the Group.

Amended July 5, 2002; August 20, 2008; August 25, 2010; June 24, 2011 and effective for draws beginning January 18, 2012; November 15, 2012; June 25, 2013 to be effective for the drawing on January 22, 2014; June 5, 2014; May 22, 2015 and June 25, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; September 12, 2017, January 4, 2018, and April 5, 2018 to be effective with the drawing on September 15, 2018.

PB RULE D — POWER PLAY DRAWS.

MUSL will conduct a separate random Power Play[®] Drawing and announce results during each of the regular Powerball Drawings held during the promotion. During each Power Play Drawing a single number (2, 3, 4, 5 and sometimes 10) shall be drawn. The ten (10X) multiplier shall be available for all Drawings in which the initially Advertised Grand Prize amount is one hundred fifty million dollars (\$150,000,000.00) or less. The probability of the possible Power Play numbers being drawn is indicated in Rule F. The Powerball Group may modify the multiplier features for special promotions from time to time.

Amended June 25, 2013 to be effective for the drawing on January 22, 2014; June 5, 2014; May 22, 2015 and June 25, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; October 22, 2015.

PB RULE E — PRIZE POOL.

E(1) Power Play Prize Pool.

(a) The Power Play Prize Pool (PPP) is hereby created, which is used to fund Power Play prizes. The PPP shall hold the temporary balances that may result from having fewer than expected winners in the Power Play. The source of the PPP is the Party Lottery's weekly prize contributions less actual Power Play Prize liability.

(b) In total, fifty percent (50%) of each draw's sales shall be collected for the payment of prizes; prize pool contribution requirements shall be based on the sales price for Plays as established by the Group, not on the amount collected by the Selling Lottery after deducting for statutorily mandated taxes:

(1) In Drawings where the ten (10X) multiplier is available, the expected payout for all prize categories shall consist of up to forty-nine and nine hundred sixty-nine thousandths percent (49.969%) of each Drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket. In Drawings where the ten (10X) multiplier is not available, the expected payout for all prize categories shall consist of up to forty-five and nine hundred thirty-four thousandths percent (45.934%) of each Drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket.

(2) In Drawings where the ten (10X) multiplier is available, an additional thirty-one thousandths percent (0.031%) of each Drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket, may be collected and placed in trust in the PPP, for the purpose of paying Power Play prizes. In Drawings where the ten (10X) multiplier is not available, an additional four and sixty-six thousandths percent (4.066%) of each Drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket, may be collected and placed in trust in the PPP, for the purpose of paying Power Play prizes.

(c) The prize payout percentage per draw may vary. The PPP shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the Power Play prizes awarded in the current draw and held in the PPP.

E(2) Licensee Lotteries. Licensee Lotteries shall adhere to PB Rule E(1) unless a different process is approved by the Product Group.

Comment. At its meeting on December 8-9, 2009, and under the terms of the Cross-Selling Agreement, the Product Group agreed to exclude the Licensee Lotteries involved in the cross-selling initiative of Powerball and Mega Millions from PB Rule E(2) and such lotteries shall be responsible for the payment of all prizes won in those jurisdictions.

E(3) End of Promotion.

Any amount remaining in the PPP when the Product Group declares the end of this Promotion shall be returned to the lotteries participating in the account after the end of all claim periods of all Selling Lotteries, carried forward to a replacement game or Promotion, or otherwise expended in a manner at the election of the individual Participating Lotteries of the Product Group in accordance with jurisdiction statute.

PB RULE G — LIMITATIONS ON PAYMENT OF POWER PLAY PRIZES.

G(1) Prize Pool Carried Forward. For Party Lotteries, the prize pool percentage allocated to the Power Play set prizes shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw.

G(2)(a) Pari-Mutuel Prizes—All Prize Amounts. Except as provided for in G(2)(c), for Party Lotteries:

G(2)(a)(1) If the total of the original Powerball set prizes and the Power Play prizes awarded in a Drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pools allocated to the set prizes, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes (including the Power Play prize amounts) awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

- (i) the amount available in the SPP and the PPP, if any;
- (ii) an amount from the Powerball SPRA, if available in the account, not to exceed forty million dollars (\$40,000,000.00) per Drawing; and
- (iii) other amounts as agreed to by the Product Group in their sole discretion.

G(2)(a)(2) If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded (including Power Play prize amounts), then the highest set prize (including the Power Play prize amounts) shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize, including the Power Play prize amount, shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all set prizes levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning Plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Powerball and Power Play prizes will be reduced by the same percentage.

Comment amended May 22, 2015 to be effective with the October 7, 2015 drawing; October 22, 2015 to be effective with the February 3, 2016 drawing.

G(2)(b) Licensee Lotteries. Licensee Lotteries shall adhere to PB Rule G(2)(a) unless a different process is approved by the Product Group.

Comment. At its meeting on December 8-9, 2009, and under the terms of the Cross-Selling Agreement, the Product Group agreed to exclude the Licensed Lotteries involved in the cross-selling initiative of Powerball and Mega Millions from PB Rule G(2)(a) and such lotteries shall be responsible for the payment of all prizes won in those jurisdictions.

G(2)(c) By agreement with the Licensee Lotteries, the Licensee Lotteries shall independently calculate their set pari-mutuel prize amounts, including the Power Play prize amounts. The Party Lotteries and the Licensee Lotteries shall then agree to set the pari-mutuel prize amounts for all lotteries selling the Powerball game at the lesser of the independently-calculated prize amounts.

Comment. The California Lottery is excluded from the Party Lotteries and other Licensee Lotteries pari-mutuel prize calculations.

PB RULE H – PRIZE PAYMENT

H(1) Prize Payments. All Power Play prizes shall be paid in one single payment through the Selling Lottery that sold the winning ticket(s). A Selling Lottery may begin paying Power Play prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

H(2) Prizes Rounded. Prizes that, under these rules, may become pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next Drawing.

PART V – POWERBALL DOUBLE PLAY PROMOTION

PB DP RULE 1 — POWERBALL DOUBLE PLAY PROMOTION DESCRIPTION.

DP 1.1 – Powerball DP Overview. The Powerball Double Play Promotion (“DP” or “Promotion”) is an add-on to the Powerball game, and participation by a Lottery is optional. Players must purchase an official Powerball ticket to participate in DP.

DP offers players a second chance to win a new set of prizes, using the same numbers the player selected (manually or by computer pick) for their Powerball Play. The Double Play Drawing is a separate drawing which takes place after the official Powerball Drawing, conducted by and in accordance with the Product Group approved Draw Procedures.

Selling Lotteries may choose when to start, and end the Double Play Promotion.

DP is an additional add-on to the Powerball game, and does not replace or alter Power Play. Power Play is not available with the Double Play Promotion. DP Prizes will not be multiplied or increased by the Power Play Promotion.

DP is conducted in accordance with the Powerball Double Play Promotion Rules and Selling Lottery rules. All rules applicable to the Powerball Game in Parts I and II of these rules are applicable to the DP Promotion unless otherwise indicated.

Powerball prizes and Double Play prizes are determined separately; for example, a Powerball player who chooses to participate in Double Play may win both a Double Play prize and a Powerball Prize, if their Play numbers match the Powerball winning numbers and also the Double Play winning numbers.

Participating Lotteries may require purchase of the Double Play promotion when a player purchases a Powerball play.

Amended February 4, 2021.

DP 1.2 How DP Works. Double Play is a five (5) out of sixty-nine (69) plus one (1) out of twenty-six (26) lottery game, drawn on the day(s), time(s) and location(s) as determined by the Powerball Product Group, and which pays a single payment First Prize.

DP 1.3 DP Winning Numbers. Double Play winning numbers applicable to determine Double Play prizes will be determined on the day(s), time(s) and location(s) as determined by the Powerball Product Group. During the drawing event, five (5) numbers shall be drawn from the first set of sixty-nine (69) numbers, and one (1) number shall be drawn from the second set of twenty-six (26) numbers, which shall constitute the Double Play Winning Numbers.

Powerball winning numbers shall not be used to determine Double Play prizes. Double Play winning numbers shall not be used to determine Powerball prizes.

DP 1.4 DP Requirements. To play Double Play, Players must purchase an official Powerball ticket. For an additional one dollar (\$1.00) players may purchase a Double Play at the same time the Powerball ticket is purchased. Double Play Play numbers shall be the same as the numbers the player selected (manually or computer pick) for their Powerball Play. The one dollar (\$1.00) purchase price for Double Play shall include any specific statutorily-mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery Play.

DP 1.5 - Purchases. Plays may be purchased from a Selling Lottery approved sales outlet in a manner as approved by the Selling Lottery and in accordance with MUSL Rules.

DP 1.6 - Tickets and Ticketless Transactions. Selling Lotteries may determine whether the DP Plays are printed on the same ticket as a Powerball ticket, or on a separate ticket from the Powerball ticket.

If a Selling Lottery determines that the DP Play may be on a separate ticket than the Powerball ticket, under no circumstances will a claim be paid for a DP prize without having first purchased an official Powerball ticket for the same drawing.

If the DP is on a separate ticket, then that ticket must match all of the game play, serial number and other validation data residing in the Selling Lottery's computer gaming system (CGS) and such ticket shall be the only valid proof of the wager placed and the only valid receipt for claiming or redeeming such prize.

If the DP Play is purchased as a ticketless transaction, the Selling Lottery's electronic record of purchase shall be the only valid proof of the wager placed and the only valid receipt for claiming or redeeming such prize.

PB RULE DP 2 - PRIZE POOL.

DP RULE 2.1 - Double Play Prize Pool. The prize pool for all prize categories offered by the Selling Lotteries shall consist of fifty-five percent (55%) of each drawing period's sales, inclusive of any specific statutorily-mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery PB Play, and inclusive of contributions to the prize pool accounts, but may be higher or lower based upon the number of winners at each prize level. Prize pool contribution requirements shall be based on the sales price for Plays as established by the Group, not on the amount collected by the Selling Lottery after deducting for statutorily mandated taxes.

Amended January 7, 2021.

DP RULE 2.2 - Double Play Prize Pool Accounts. The Product Group shall set the contribution rates to the prize pool accounts established by this rule.

(a) **Reserved.**

(b) The following prize pool accounts for the Double Play game are hereby established:

- (i) The First Prize Pool (FPP), which is used to fund the First Prize and fund deficiencies in the DPSPP. Any monies not used to pay a First Prize may be used to fund deficiencies in the DPSPP as needed. Any funds not used to pay a First Prize or fund deficiencies in the DPSPP shall accumulate in this pool until such time as funds are needed to pay a First Prize or fund deficiencies in the DPSPP; and
- (ii) The Double Play Set Prize Pool (DPSPP), which is used to fund the Double Play Set or Lower Tier Prizes. The DPSPP shall hold the temporary balances that may result from having fewer than expected winners in the Double Play Set Prize categories. The Source of the DPSPP is the Selling Lottery's weekly prize contributions less actual Double Play Set Prize liability.

Comment: The Double Play prize pools may not be used to pay Powerball prizes.

(c) **Reserved.**

(d) The contribution rate to the FPP from DP Plays shall be four and nine thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine ten thousandths percent (4.9889%) of sales except as provided in Rule DP 3(a).

(e) **Reserved.**

(f) The Product Group may determine to expend all or a portion of the funds in the DPSPP:

(i) for the purpose of indemnifying the Selling Lotteries in the payment of prizes to be made by the Selling Lotteries; and

(ii) for the payment of prizes or special prizes in the game, limited to prize pool contributions from lotteries participating in the special prize promotion.

(g) Reserved.

(h) Reserved.

(i) Reserved.

DP Rule 2.3 Licensee Lotteries. Licensee Lotteries shall adhere to DP Rule 2.2 unless a different process is approved by the Product Group.

Comment. Licensee Lotteries shall contribute to and participate in the Double Play prize pool accounts. Amended January 7, 2021.

PB RULE DP 3 - EXPECTED PRIZE PAYOUT PERCENTAGES. The First Prize payout shall be determined on a pari-mutuel basis. All Double Play prizes shall be paid as single payment prize. Except as otherwise provided in these Rules, all prizes other than the First Prize are set prize amounts. All prize payouts are made with the following expected prize payout percentages, although the prize payout percentages per draw may vary:

(a) The First Prize amount shall be divided equally by the number of DP Plays winning the First Prize. If no Plays match the DP winning numbers as described above, the DP First Prize will not be awarded, and remains at ten million dollars (\$10,000,000).

If the amount in the FPP is insufficient to fund awarded First Prize(s), contributions from individual Participating Lotteries to fund the awarded First Prize deficiency shall be determined on a pro rata basis based on sales since the most recent First Prize win.

(b) The DPSPP (for payment of single payment prizes of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw.

(c) Pari-mutuel Prize Determinations Applicable to Participating Lotteries.

(c)(1) Except as may be otherwise provided:

(c)(1)(a) If the total of the Double Play Set Prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the Double Play Set Prizes, then the amount needed to fund the Double Play Set Prizes awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

(i) the amount available in the DPSPP if any;

(ii) an amount from the FPP, if available; and

(iii) other amounts as agreed to by the Product Group in its sole discretion.

(c)(1)(b) If, after these sources are depleted there are not sufficient funds to pay the Double Play Set Prizes, then the highest Double Play Set Prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest Double Play Set Prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest Double Play Set Prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining Double Play Set Prizes awarded, then the next highest Double Play Set Prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all Double Play Set Prize levels, if necessary, until all Double Play Set Prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels; In that circumstance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this Rule shall be divided among the winning DP Plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages.

Comment. The California Lottery is excluded from the Participating Lotteries pari-mutuel prize calculations.

(c)(2) Reserved.

(d) Subject to the laws and rules governing each Selling Lottery, the number of prize categories and the allocation of the prize fund among the prize categories may be changed at the discretion of the Product Group, for promotional purposes. Such change shall be announced by Product Group.

MUSL MEGA MILLIONS® (M2G2) PRODUCT GROUP RULES

Adopted Dec 15, 2009; last amended June 27, 2024, to be effective with sales beginning April 5, 2025, and the drawing held on April 8, 2025.

These Rules Changes are effective with sales beginning April 5, 2025, and the drawing held on April 8, 2025.

PART I — ADMINISTRATION

MM RULE 1—LICENSE; DISPUTES, VOTING, ELECTIONS.

1.0 Cross-Sell Agreement; Terms Incorporated. The MUSL Board has entered into an agreement (“Cross-Sell Agreement”) with certain U.S. lotteries operating the Mega Millions® lottery game (“Mega Millions Lotteries”) that allows the MUSL Mega Millions (M2G2) Product Group (“Product Group”) to sell the Mega Millions lottery game. All provisions and requirements of the Cross-Sell Agreement, as it may be amended, are incorporated herein. Any conflict between the terms of these Rules and the Cross-Sell Agreement shall be interpreted in favor of the Cross-Sell Agreement.

The Mega Millions Lotteries shall determine the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount (cash value option and annuity) prior to each drawing. The Amended and Restated Mega Millions Official Game Rules and the Finance and Operations Procedures for Mega Millions as adopted and amended by the Mega Millions Lotteries are also incorporated herein. Any conflict between the Amended and Restated Mega Millions Official Game Rules, the Finance and Operations Procedures for Mega Millions, and these Product Group Rules shall be interpreted in favor of the Amended and Restated Mega Millions Official Game Rules and the Finance and Operations Procedures for Mega Millions.

Amended June 3, 2010, to be effective September 14, 2010; March 29, 2013; June 5, 2014. October 28, 2019; June 27, 2024.

1.1 First Review. The Product Group shall have the first opportunity to informally resolve any disputes arising between or among Party Lotteries regarding the Product Group, rules, policies, or guidelines. The Party Lottery seeking resolution of a dispute shall seek a remedy from the Product Group by filing a notice of dispute with the Product Group. Filing shall be done by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the MUSL Executive Director. If the Product Group fails to resolve the dispute to the satisfaction of any party to the dispute within sixty (60) days after receiving notice of the dispute, the aggrieved Party Lottery may seek any other remedy authorized by the Multi-State Lottery Agreement (the MUSL Agreement), or the Cross-Sell Agreement with the Mega Millions Lotteries.

1.2 Voting. Each Party Lottery has one (1) vote. Unless a different percentage is provided in these rules, the percentage of votes necessary to allow action by the Product Group shall be more than fifty percent (50%) of the votes cast, in person or by proxy of the Product Group members.

1.3 Amendment of Rules. These Product Group Rules may be amended upon a vote of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the votes cast.

1.4 Quorum. The quorum necessary to hold an official meeting of the Product Group shall be representation in person or by proxy from more than fifty percent (50%) of all members. If neither the Chair nor Vice-Chair can attend a scheduled meeting in person, then the meeting shall be rescheduled.

Amended March 29, 2013.

1.5 Elections. A Product Group Chair and Product Group Vice-Chair shall be elected for one-year terms starting July 1. The Chair shall appoint a Nominating Committee to recommend candidates to the Product Group. Nominations may also be made by motion and properly seconded.

MM RULE 2 RESERVED.

MM RULE 3—BUDGET.

3.1 Duties of Executive Director. Annually or on a more frequent basis, the Executive Director shall prepare and submit to the Product Group Chair a proposed budget and fees for the Party Lotteries to pay the Product Group for the services it renders to them and shall be paid as a fee for services by each of the Party Lotteries in accordance with estimated sales. An acceptable method of payment shall be determined by the Product Group, subject to approval by the Board.

If a lottery withdraws from participation in the product group without giving proper notice of such withdrawal before approval of the group's budget, then that Participating Lottery shall not be entitled to a refund of its contributions to the budget.

If the Product Group terminates before the end of a fiscal year, all unspent funds shall be returned to the lotteries which contributed to the Group's budget, however Group contributions to MUSL overhead expenses shall not be refunded.

MM RULE 4—DRAWINGS.

Drawings will be held at the times and places established by the Mega Millions Lotteries. Each Party Lottery Director shall determine the time for the end of sales prior to the drawings, which shall not be less than fifteen (15) minutes between the close of the game Play sales and the time of the drawing for those Plays sold. Lotteries shall not process plays for that drawing after the time established by the Party Lottery Director.

The Product Group shall approve draw procedures used by MUSL that facilitate the timely exchange of game and draw information with the Mega Millions Lotteries.

Amended June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 16, 2022; June 27, 2024.

MM RULE 5 RESERVED.

MM RULE 6—RECORDS MANAGEMENT.

6.1 Records Defined. “Records” shall mean any document, paper, photograph, or recording made or received, in whatever form, in connection with the official business of the Product Group. Records do not include materials made or acquired for reference or exhibition purposes, or miscellaneous papers or correspondence without official significance.

Amended June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017

6.2 Duties of Executive Director. The Executive Director shall maintain Product Group records in a secure and orderly manner.

6.3 Confidentiality. To the maximum extent practical, Product Group records shall be made available for inspection by Party Lotteries in a reasonable and responsible manner.

6.4 Records Retention. The Executive Director shall establish the minimum retention period for each record or class of record with Product Group approval. The Executive Director shall establish the criteria for the disposal of Product Group records.

MM RULE 7 RESERVED.

MM RULE 8—PETITION FOR ADMISSION.

8.1 Minimum Internal Control Systems (ICS) Standards. A Lottery seeking admission to the Product Group shall have a fully tested internal control system that meets or exceeds the minimum standards set forth in MUSL Rule 2 (Minimum ICS Standards) before sales of Plays commence. The MUSL Security and Integrity Committee shall review the ICS of each lottery seeking admission to the Product Group for compliance with Rule 2 (Minimum ICS Standards) and shall issue a written report summarizing its findings.

8.2 Other Admission Requirements. The Product Group shall determine other admission requirements as allowed by the MUSL Agreement and in the Cross Sell Agreement.

MM RULE 9—EXPULSION OR SUSPENSION OF A PARTY LOTTERY.

9.1 The Product Group can expel or suspend a Party Lottery of the Product Group for cause as determined in the sole discretion of the Product Group with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members pursuant to both methods of voting in conformance with the MUSL Agreement. If the Product Group votes to expel or suspend a Party Lottery as provided in the MUSL Agreement, the Party Lottery being considered for expulsion shall be excluded from voting on that matter, and shall also be excluded from any subsequent vote by the Product

Group to reinstate that Party Lottery, and in the voting calculations outlined in these Product Group Rules.

9.2 The Product Group can reinstate a Party Lottery of the Product Group with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the Members pursuant to both methods of voting in conformance with the MUSL Agreement. Requests for reinstatement shall be considered by the Product Group at its earliest convenience, following submission of support sufficient for such reinstatement from the requesting lottery.

Adopted: October 25, 2017.

9.3 Any Party Lottery, which fails, is unwilling, or loses the ability to transfer prize contributions as required under these Rules shall suspend its sales of Mega Millions within seven (7) days of such failure or loss of ability. The Party Lottery may request reinstatement as provided for under these Rules. Failure to notify the Product Group of such circumstances, or of the suspension of sales, or the failure to suspend sales as required, shall be grounds for suspension or expulsion.

Adopted: October 25, 2017.

9.4 Any Party Lottery that fails, is unwilling, or loses the ability to pay all prize levels in the game(s) after prize claimants have met all prize claim procedures of the Party Lottery, the Group and the MUSL Board, shall immediately suspend its sales of Mega Millions upon such failure, unwillingness, or loss of ability. The Party Lottery may request reinstatement as provided for under these Rules. Failure to notify the Product Group of such circumstances, or of the suspension of sales, or the failure to suspend sales as required, shall be grounds for suspension or termination.

Adopted: October 25, 2017.

MM RULE 10—ADVERTISING.

10.1 Unfair Advertising. No Party Lottery may advertise, either directly or indirectly, that Plays sold in its jurisdiction offer better odds, better chances of winning, or better payoffs than Plays sold in other jurisdictions. This rule does not prohibit a Party Lottery from offering retailer promotions or other creative promotions designed to increase the sale of Plays.

10.2 Mega Millions Jackpot Estimate. No Party Lottery may publicize an advertised Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount or guaranteed Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount that is different than the estimated Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount provided to the Party Lotteries by the Mega Millions Lotteries.

MM RULE 11—TICKET PRICE

11.1 Uniform Price. Each Play shall be sold at retail for the price set by the Mega Millions Lotteries.

11.2 Taxes. The Play price set by the Mega Millions Lotteries shall include all the applicable taxes that a Party Lottery may be required to collect.

2017; June 27, 2024.

11.3 Discounts, Rebates, and Promotions. A Party Lottery may offer Plays through discounts, rebates, or promotions as long as the full prize share is paid to the Product Group, without discount, and after a notice is provided to all Group members of the terms and dates of the offering.

Amended June 3, 2010, to be effective September 14, 2010; March 29, 2013; June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

11.4 Plays as Prizes. Nothing in this rule shall prohibit a Party Lottery from offering Plays as a prize in any other non-MUSL game or promotion operated by the Party Lottery after advising all Group members of the terms and dates of the offering.

Amended June 3, 2010, to be effective September 14, 2010; June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

11.5 Contribution to Prize Pool. Party Lotteries that offer Plays as a prize or as part of an authorized discount, promotion, or rebate shall contribute to the prize pool the full amount assessed for a Play sold at the uniform price.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

MM RULE 12—SALE OF PLAYS

12.1 Agents and Retailers. Plays shall be sold only through Agents and Retailers and means authorized by a Party Lottery.

Amended June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

12.2 Printed Plays. Plays sold through the Product Group shall be sold through a Party Lottery and, other than Ticketless Transaction Plays, shall be printed on paper that meets the security requirements for paper used in the Party Lottery's other games and other requirements adopted by the MUSL Board and the Product Group.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013; June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 16, 2022.

12.3 MUSL Markings. All Play Slips used in the game shall contain registered game trademarks and shall communicate other information as may be required by the MUSL Board and the Product Group.

12.4 Game Sell Out Prohibited. No Party Lottery shall directly and knowingly sell a Play or combination of Plays to any person or entity that would guarantee such purchaser a Mega Millions Jackpot Prize win.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019, to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

12.5 Location and Method of Sales. An offer to buy and an offer to sell a Play sold through the Product Group shall be made only at a location or only by a method that is licensed, certified, authorized, or contracted by the Party Lottery.

MM RULE 13—PRIZE PAYMENTS.

No Party Lottery may pay prizes that are less than or more than the prize amounts established by the Mega Millions Lotteries. The prize won cannot be indirectly increased by Party Lottery promotions or agent promotions that have the effect of increasing the designated prize.

MM RULE 14—MEGA MILLIONS PRIZE POOL TRANSFERS.

14.1 Prize Funds Transferred to MUSL. Each Party Lottery shall transfer to MUSL, in trust, an amount determined by the Product Group to be its total proportionate share of the Mega Millions Prize Pool less actual Mega Millions low-tier prize liability. If this results in a negative amount, the MUSL central office shall transfer funds from the appropriate prize pool to the Party Lottery.

In the event of a Mega Millions Jackpot Prize win at a MUSL Lottery, the Mega Millions Lottery's Mega Millions Clearinghouse shall collect the total proportionate share of the Jackpot Prize pool from the Mega Millions Lotteries and shall transfer that amount to MUSL within 14 calendar days from the date of the winning draw.

14.2 Mega Millions Jackpot Prize Funds Transferred to Lottery. Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amounts held by MUSL shall be transferred to a Party Lottery having a winner in the Mega Millions game on a schedule approved by the Product Group and after MUSL has collected the prize pool shares from all Participating Lotteries selling the Mega Millions lottery game.

Amended Dec 31, 2009; June 14, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019, to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

14.3 Unclaimed Prizes.

(a) All funds to pay a Mega Millions Jackpot Prize that went unclaimed shall be returned to Selling Lotteries in proportion to sales by Selling Lotteries for the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize in question after the claiming period set by the Selling Lottery selling the winning Play expires.

If after a winning Play has not been claimed or redeemed and the corresponding prize monies have been returned to Party Lotteries pursuant to this Rule, a claim is made or redemption sought which a Party Lottery pays (i) as a result of the provisions of the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (50 U.S.C. App. §3901 et seq as amended) (SCRA); (ii) as a result of jurisdictional legislation adopted to satisfy the requirements of the SCRA; or (iii) as a result of jurisdictional legislation requiring such payment to a member of the armed forces who was engaged in active military service outside the paying Party Lottery jurisdiction when the usual permitted time period to make a claim or seek redemption expired, each other Party Lottery, that was a Party Lottery at the time of the drawing, shall reimburse the paying Party Lottery in an amount equal to the amount such other Party Lottery would have contributed to the prize had the claim been made or redemption sought within the usual permitted time period for that claim or redemption. The provisions of this rule shall remain in force and effect and be binding upon the Party

Lotteries without regard to whether the Mega Millions game remains in existence and/or whether the Party Lottery seeking reimbursement has withdrawn from the game at the time a Party Lottery seeks reimbursement pursuant to this rule.

(b) The return of unclaimed Mega Millions Jackpot Prize funds shall occur promptly upon the termination of the relevant claim period for the Participating Lottery in which the unclaimed Jackpot Prize Play was purchased. Interest accrued on any securities purchased to fund an unclaimed Mega Millions Jackpot Prize will be reflected in market rates at the time of liquidation by the Purchaser of the securities. The Purchaser shall return interest earned on unclaimed cash value option Mega Millions Jackpot Prizes based on the interest yields realized on such funds during the claim period.

Any interest earned on unclaimed Mega Millions Jackpot Prizes held by Mega Millions Lotteries shall be returned on a proportional basis to MUSL. Any interest earned on unclaimed Mega Millions Jackpot Prizes held by MUSL shall be returned on a proportional basis to the Mega Millions Lotteries.

(c) By agreement with the Mega Millions Lotteries, the Product Group will not participate in the sharing of liabilities at the low-tier prize level (all prizes below the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize) and shall not reconcile unclaimed low-tier prizes with the Mega Millions Lotteries.

MM RULES 15 through 18 RESERVED.

MM RULE 19—FUNDS TRANSFER.

Funds shall be collected from each Party Lottery by wire transfer, electronic funds transfer, or by other means acceptable to the Product Group. The amount to be transferred shall be calculated in accordance with Product Group rules. The Product Group shall determine collection days. If MUSL is unable to collect all funds in a timely manner for the transfer to the winning lottery(ies), MUSL may borrow the funds from other appropriate Mega Millions Product Group cash reserves, or from the MUSL Operations Account, following notice to the Product Group Officers, the Finance Committee, and the Executive Committee. The borrowed funds shall be immediately replenished upon collection of prize funds from the Party Lotteries.

MM RULE 21—ADVANCE SALES.

Proceeds from advance sales may be held by the Party Lottery until the draw date for which the Play applies.

PART II GENERAL RULES FOR THE MEGA MILLIONS GAME

MM RULE 26—DEFINITIONS.

The following definitions apply unless the context requires a different meaning or is otherwise inconsistent with the intention of the rules adopted by the Product Group. Capitalized terms used but not defined in these rules shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the MUSL Agreement.

26.1 “Advertised Jackpot Prize” shall mean the estimated annuitized Mega Millions Jackpot amount as determined by the Mega Millions Lotteries. The Advertised Jackpot Prize is not a guaranteed prize amount, and the actual Mega Millions Jackpot amount may vary from the advertised amount, except in circumstances where there is a guaranteed Mega Millions Jackpot amount as described in Rule 30.1(a).

Adopted June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; Amended June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020.

26.2 “Agent” or “retailer” means a person or entity authorized by a Party Lottery to sell lottery Plays.

Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

26.3 “Computer pick” means the random selection of game play number indicia by the authorized retailer computer that appear on a ticket or Ticketless Transaction and are played by a player in the game.

Adopted October 28, 2019, to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2010

26.4 Reserved.

26.5 Reserved.

26.6 Reserved.

26.7 “Finance Committee” shall mean the committee established by the Multi-State Lottery Association.

26.8 “Game ticket” or “Ticket” means the physical evidence of a Play or Plays, printed on paper that meets the play and security data required by the Selling Lottery, these Game Rules, and the MUSL Rules that allow redemption of a prize. Tickets may be printed by Terminals or Retailer Controlled Selling Devices as permitted by these Rules and the Selling Lottery. Affected MUSL Rules include, but are not limited to MUSL Rules 2.14, 2.20, and 2.21.

26.9 “Jackpot” or “Jackpot Prize” shall refer to the top prize in the Mega Millions game.

26.10 Reserved.

26.11 Reserved.

26.12 Reserved.

26.13 “Mega Millions Lotteries” means those lotteries that have reached a Cross Sell Agreement with MUSL for the selling of the Mega Millions Game. The Mega Millions Lotteries determine the Mega Millions Advertised Jackpot Prize amount (cash value option and annuity)

Amended March 29, 2013; June 27, 2024.

26.14 “Mega Millions Plays” or “MM Plays” shall refer to Plays purchased for the Mega Millions game.

Adopted June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019, to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

26.15 Reserved.

26.16 “Multiplier” means a unique number that is automatically selected by computer software according to the frequency set forth in **MM RULE 38** for each Mega Millions Play.

Adopted June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019, to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

26.17 “MUSL” means the Multi-State Lottery Association, a government-benefit association wholly owned and operated by the Party Lotteries.

26.18 “MUSL Board” means the governing body of the MUSL that is comprised of the chief executive officer of each Party Lottery.

Amended March 29, 2013.

26.19 “Participating Lottery” or “Selling Lottery” means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity that is participating in selling the Mega Millions game and that may be a member of either MUSL or the Mega Millions Lotteries. In context, “Selling Lottery” may refer to the Participating Lottery which sold a particular Play.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020.

26.20 “Party Lottery” means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity which has joined MUSL and, in the context of these Product Group Rules that has joined in selling the games offered by the MUSL Mega Millions Product Group.

Amended March 29, 2013.

26.21 “Play” or “Bet” means a physical or electronic means by which a player communicates their intended Play selection to the retailer as defined and approved by the Selling Lottery. As used in these Rules “Play” or “Bet” means a Mega Millions Play.

Amended June 25, 2013 to be effective with the drawing on October 22, 2013; June 14, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 16, 2022; June 27, 2024.

26.22 "Play Slip" or "Bet Slip" means a physical or electronic means by which a player communicates their intended play selection to the retailer as defined and approved by the Selling Lottery. A Play Slip or a Bet Slip is not a ticket or Ticketless Transaction.

Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

26.23 "Product Group" or "the Group" means the group of lotteries that has joined together to offer the Mega Millions lottery game product pursuant to the terms of the Agreement for Cross Sell between MUSL and the Mega Millions Lotteries, the Multi-State Lottery Agreement, and the Product Group's own rules.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 5, 2014.

26.24 "Registered Play" means a wager where the play is owned by a specifically identified player at the time of purchase through a means acceptable by the Selling Lottery, and which is recorded on the Selling Lottery's computer gaming system and internal control system.

Adopted June 16, 2022.

26.25 "Request for Play" means a sale that is not immediately recorded on the CGS but is recorded onto the CGS at some future time prior to a draw event.

26.26 "Retailer Controlled Selling Device" means a device that is not a Terminal, and which is controlled by a retailer for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating tickets, and transmitting reports. Examples of Retailer Controlled Selling Devices include cash registers. Retailer Controlled Selling Devices must meet all security requirements of the Selling Lottery, these Rules, and the MUSL Rules. Retailer Controlled Selling Devices do not include player provided point of sale devices such as smartphones.

Adopted June 16, 2022.

26.27 "Returned Plays" means Plays accepted by the Selling Lottery as returned to the Selling Lottery because the Play is misprinted, illegible, printed in error, a future Plays affected by changes in game features by the Selling Lottery, or is returned due to game cancellations.

26.28 "Set Prize", also referred to as "low-tier prize", means all other prizes except the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize and, except in instances outlined in these rules, will be equal to the prize amount established by the Mega Millions Lotteries.

Amended June 5, 2014; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

26.29 "Terminal" means a device that meets all security and definitional requirements of these Rules, the MUSL Rules, and the Selling Lottery, and which is authorized by a Party Lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer gaming system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets, and transmitting reports. The term Terminal does not include a Retailer Controlled Selling Device such as a cash register or player provided point of sale device such as a smartphone.

Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 16, 2022.

26.30 "Ticketless Transaction" means any Play that is not printed on paper that meets the anti-counterfeiting requirements described in the MUSL Rules. Examples of Ticketless Transactions include internet, subscription, and other types of Registered Plays. All Ticketless

Transactions must be Registered Plays. Any Play sold through a Terminal or Retailer Controlled Selling Device, but which is a Registered Play requiring confirmation of the player's identity upon prize redemption shall be considered a Ticketless Transaction even when a receipt, summation, or recognition of purchase is printed by or through the device.

26.31 "Winning numbers" means the game results selected during an official drawing event performed by the Mega Millions Lotteries and are used by the Mega Millions Lotteries to determine winning Plays contained on a game ticket or Ticketless Transaction.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013, to be effective with the drawing on October 22, 2013; June 5, 2014; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

26.32 Proof of Play. Unless otherwise permitted by the selling lottery, a ticket (subject to the validation requirements set forth in Rule 31 - Play Validation) or properly registered Ticketless Transaction, shall be the only proof of a game Play or Plays and the submission of a winning ticket to the issuing Party Lottery or its authorized agent shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes. A Play Slip, paper receipt, or printed summation of a Play printed by a Terminal which is not a ticket has no pecuniary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of a Play purchase or numbers selected.

MM RULE 27-- Proof of Play; Cancelled Plays Prohibited; Request for Plays, Returned Plays, Incomplete Transaction Plays, Stolen Plays and Refunds for Game Cancellations.

27.1 General. Unless otherwise permitted by the selling lottery, a validated ticket or properly registered Ticketless Transaction is the only proof of a game Play or Plays. Submission of a winning ticket to the issuing Party Lottery or to its authorized agent shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes.

(a) Cancelled Plays Prohibited. In all instances, a Play recorded on the CGS may not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket or Ticketless Transaction to the Agent, Retailer, or Selling Lottery.

(b) Request for Plays. A lottery may conduct future sales through a subscription or other system that does not immediately record such sales on the CGS. At the sole discretion of the lottery, authorized sales through a subscription or other system which are recorded as a Request for Play(s) may be cancelled at any time prior to the time the Request for Play is recorded as a Play on the CGS. If a Request for Play is cancelled, it shall not be recorded on the CGS. Per 27.1 (a) above, once a Play is recorded on the CGS, it may not be cancelled at any time. Any cancelled Request for Play shall not be included in sales data report to MUSL. Examples of permitted cancellation of subscription "Request for Plays" include game matrix changes, price changes, modification of the game features, player enrollment in self-exclusion programs, and other circumstances as determined by the Selling Lottery.

(c) Returned Plays. To promote good Player or Retailer relations, a Selling Lottery, at its sole discretion, may develop a method of compensating Players or Retailers for Plays accepted by the Selling Lottery as returned to the Selling Lottery (“Returned Plays”) that are misprinted, illegible, printed in error, future Plays affected by changes in game features by the Selling Lottery or due to game cancellations. If a Selling Lottery exchanges a Ticket for a Returned Play due to a misprint or illegible printing, the Ticket for the Returned Play shall print the unique Multiplier from the Ticket being exchanged.

Returned Plays may not be cancelled or voided. Returned Plays are not reported to MUSL.

The Selling Lottery Must remit its required prize pool contributions on all Plays accepted as returned Plays by the Selling Lottery.

Returned Plays may not be claimed for a prize by any person or entity, including the Selling Lottery. Any prizes which would have been won on a Returned Play shall become an unclaimed prize at the end of the prize claim period.

(d) Incomplete Transaction Plays. Incomplete Transaction Plays occur when a Retailer begins a Play transaction as requested by a Player, and the Play is registered on the CGS, but the transaction is terminated prior to transferring Play confirmation to the Player, there is no attempt to print the Play on a ticket, and the Player has not paid for the Play. Transaction terminations may be due to time sensitivities, communications loss or other issues as accepted by the Selling Lottery.

A Selling Lottery, at its sole discretion, may develop an approved method of managing Incomplete Transaction Plays, subject to these provisions.

Incomplete Transaction Plays may not be cancelled or voided.

The Selling Lottery must remit its required prize pool contributions on any Incomplete Transaction Plays. At its sole discretion, the Selling Lottery may develop a method of compensation Retailers for Incomplete Transaction Plays if Retailers are required to reimburse Selling Lotteries for prize pool contributions.

Incomplete Transaction Plays may not be claimed for a prize by any person or entity including the Retailer. Any prize which cannot be claimed as a prize under this Rule but would otherwise have been won on an Incomplete Transaction Play shall become an unclaimed prize at the end of the prize claim period of the drawing for which the Incomplete Transaction Play was recorded. Incomplete Transaction Plays are not reported to MUSL.

(e) Stolen Plays. Plays reported as stolen from a Retailer that have been recovered cannot be accepted by the Selling Lottery as Returned Plays.

Selling Lotteries may compensate a Retailer for the loss from theft if a Selling Lottery, solely at its discretion, determines to assume such a loss, but Stolen Plays cannot be cancelled or voided.

Ownership of Stolen Plays, and whether any party has a right to claim prizes on Stolen Plays, shall be determined by the rules of the Selling Lottery.

(f) Game Cancellation. In the event of cancellation of the Game by the Product Group prior to the occurrence of all drawings for which Plays have been sold and recorded on the CGS, the Selling Lottery may provide a refund mechanism for such Plays to the Players, and the Selling Lottery shall not be required to remit its prize pool contributions for any such refunded Plays.

(g) Selling Lotteries Prohibited from Claiming Prizes. Selling Lotteries and lottery officials are prohibited from claiming any prizes on Plays that are owned by the Selling Lottery through “Returned Plays” or otherwise acquired and held by the Selling Lottery. Any prizes that would otherwise be won on Plays owned or acquired by Selling Lotteries shall become unclaimed prizes at the end of the prize claim period.

27.2 Player Responsibility. It shall be the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game Play or Plays and other data printed on the ticket or contained in a Ticketless Transaction. The placing of Plays is done at the player's own risk through the agent that is acting on behalf of the player in entering the Play or Plays. The purchaser of a Play or Plays through a Ticketless Transaction has the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data at the time of purchase.

27.3 Entry of Plays. Plays may only be entered as approved by the Party Lottery by such means as approved by the Party Lottery. Retailers shall not permit the use of Play Slips that are not allowed by the Party Lottery. Retailers shall not permit any device to enter Plays, except as allowed by the Party Lottery.

27.4 Registration of Plays. Ticketless Transaction Plays may be registered with the Party Lottery in a manner that meets the requirements established by the Product Group, the Party Lottery, and the MUSL Rules.

27.5 Maximum Purchase. Except for a Ticketless Transaction Play purchase when the Party Lottery has a process in place to allow players to make changes to their Play purchases in the event of a game change, the maximum number of consecutive drawings on a single Play purchase is twenty-six (26). The maximum number of consecutive drawings encompassed by a Ticketless Transaction Play purchase when the Party Lottery has a process in place to allow players to make changes to their Play purchases in the event of a game change is one hundred four (104).

27.6 Matrix Changes. In the event of a matrix change, the Party Lottery that issued the Ticketless Transaction will determine the option(s) available to Ticketless Transaction purchasers from that Party Lottery for the balance of Plays remaining on their Ticketless Transactions effective as of the date of the matrix change.

MM RULES 28 – 29 RESERVED.

MM RULE 30 PRIZE PAYMENTS.

30.1 Jackpot Prize for Mega Millions Game

(a) The prize money allocated from the current Mega Millions prize pool for the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize, will be divided equally among all Mega Millions Jackpot Prize winning MM Plays in all Participating Lotteries. The annuity Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount will be paid in thirty (30) graduated annual installments. Mega Millions Jackpot Prize won shall be funded by the Selling Lotteries in accordance with the formula set by the Mega Millions Lotteries. The Mega Millions Lotteries may set a minimum guaranteed annuity Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount that shall be advertised by the Selling Lotteries as the starting guaranteed annuity Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount.

Amended Dec 31, 2009; June 3, 2010, to be effective September 14, 2010; March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

(b) **Rollover.** If, in any Mega Millions drawing there are no MM Plays that qualify for the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize category, the portion of the prize fund allocated to such Mega Millions Jackpot Prize category shall remain in the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize category and be added to the amount allocated for the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize category in the next consecutive Mega Millions drawing.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

(c) Unless there is a different Party Lottery rule, Mega Millions Jackpot Prizes shall be paid, at the election of the player made no later than sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize as determined by the Selling Lottery, with either a per winner annuity or cash payment. If the payment election is not made by the player within sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, then the prize shall be paid as an annuity prize. An election made after the winner becomes entitled to the prize is final and cannot be revoked, withdrawn, or otherwise changed.

(d) In the event of a prize winner who selects the cash value option, the prize winner's share shall be paid in a single payment upon completion of internal validation procedures. The cash value option shall be determined by the Mega Millions Lotteries.

(e) If an annuity is chosen, it shall be paid in thirty (30) consecutive graduated annual installments by the Party Lottery that sold the winning Mega Millions Ticket, with graduated annual installments as defined by the Mega Millions Lotteries in the Mega Millions Finance and Operations Procedures. The initial payment shall be paid upon completion of internal validation procedures. The subsequent twenty-nine (29) payments shall be paid annually to coincide with the month of the federal auction date at which the bonds were purchased to fund the annuity. All such payments shall be made within seven (7) days of the anniversary of the annual auction date.

(f) If individual shares of the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize Pool funds held to fund an annuity is less than two hundred fifty-thousand dollars (\$250,000.00), the Product Group, in its sole discretion, may elect to pay the winners their share of the cash held in the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize pool.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013, to be effective with the drawing on October 22, 2013; June 5, 2014; October 28, 2019, to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020.

(g) Funds for the initial payment of an annuitized prize or the cash value option prize shall be made available by MUSL for payment by the Party Lottery on a schedule approved by the Product Group. If necessary, when the due date for the payment of a prize occurs before the receipt of funds in the prize pool trust sufficient to pay the prize, the transfer of funds for the payment of the full cash value option amount may be delayed pending receipt of funds from the Party Lotteries or other lotteries participating in the Mega Millions Game. A Party Lottery may elect to make the initial payment from its own funds after validation, with notice to MUSL.

(h) In the event of the death of a lottery winner sold by a Party Lottery during the annuity payment period, unless prohibited by jurisdictional law, the MUSL Finance Committee, in its sole discretion excepting a discretionary review by the Product Group, upon the petition of the estate of the lottery winner (the “Estate”) to the lottery of the jurisdiction in which the deceased lottery winner purchased the winning Play, and subject to federal, state, district or territorial applicable laws, may accelerate the payment of all of the remaining lottery proceeds to the Estate. If such a determination is made, then securities and/or cash held to fund the deceased lottery winner’s annuitized prize may be distributed to the Estate. The identification of the securities to fund the annuitized prize shall be at the sole discretion of the Finance Committee or the Product Group.

Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

(i) If a Party Lottery purchases or holds the prize payment annuity for a prize won in that jurisdiction, that Party Lottery’s game rules, and any prize payment agreement with the prize winner, shall indicate that the prize winner has no recourse against MUSL or any other Party Lottery for payment of that prize.

30.2 Reserved.

30.3 Set Prizes. A Party Lottery may begin paying set or low-tier prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

30.4 Process for Prize Payments. All prizes shall be paid through the Selling Lottery that sold the winning Plays, and at the discretion of the Selling Lottery may be paid by cash, checks, warrants or electronic transfers.

30.5 Prizes Rounded. Annuitized payments of the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize or a share of the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize may be rounded to facilitate the purchase of an appropriate funding mechanism. Breakage on an annuitized Mega Millions Jackpot Prize win shall be added to the first payment to the winner or winners.

Prizes other than the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize that, under these rules, may become single-payment, pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool(s) for the next drawing.

30.6 Limited to Highest Prize Won.

(a) The holder of a winning MM Play may win only one (1) prize per Play in connection with the winning numbers drawn for the Mega Millions game and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category.

(b) All liability for a Mega Millions prize is discharged upon payment of a prize claim.

30.7 Prize Claim Period. Prize claims shall be submitted within the period set by the Party Lottery selling the Play. If no such claim period is established, all prize claims shall be made within one hundred eighty (180) days after the drawing date.

MM RULE 31—PLAY VALIDATION FOR MEGA MILLIONS PLAYS

31.1 To be a valid Play and eligible to receive a prize, a Play's ticket or ticketless transaction shall satisfy all the requirements established by a Party Lottery for validation of winning Plays sold through its computer gaming system and any other validation requirements adopted by the Product Group, the MUSL Board and published as the Confidential MUSL Minimum Game Security Standards. The MUSL and the Party Lotteries shall not be responsible for Plays that are altered in any manner.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 5 2014; June 14, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

31.2 Under no circumstances will a claim be paid for a prize without an official Mega Millions ticket, or validly registered Ticketless Transaction, matching all game Play, serial number and other validation data residing in the selling Party Lottery's computer gaming system and such ticket or validly registered Ticketless Transaction shall be the only valid proof of the wager placed and the only valid receipt for claiming or redeeming such prize. Prize payment(s) will be made only after completion of the internal validation procedures and administrative processes as required by these Rules and the requirements of the Party Lottery that sold the winning Play.

31.3 In addition to the above, in order to be deemed a valid, winning Play, unless the Play is a validly registered Ticketless Transaction, all of the following conditions must be met:

(a) The validation data must be present in its entirety and must correspond, using the computer validation file, to the number selections printed on the ticket for the drawing date(s) printed on the ticket.

(b) The ticket must be intact.

(c) The ticket must not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted, or tampered with in any manner.

(d) The ticket must not be counterfeit or an exact duplicate of another winning ticket.

(e) The ticket must have been issued by an authorized Mega Millions sales agent, or retailer of the selling Party Lottery and printed on paper in compliance with MUSL Rule 2.

Amended June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 16, 2022.

(f) The ticket must not have been stolen, to the knowledge of the Party Lottery.

(g) The ticket must be submitted for payment in accordance with the Amended and Restated Mega Millions Official Game Rules.

(h) The Play data must have been recorded on the CGS prior to the drawing and the Play data must match this computer record in every respect. In the event of a contradiction between information as printed on the ticket and as accepted by the Party Lottery's computer gaming system, the wager accepted by the Party Lottery's computer gaming system shall be the valid wager.

(i) The player or computer pick number selections, validation data and the drawing date(s) of an apparent winning Play must appear on the official file of winning Plays, and a Play with that exact data must not have been previously paid.

(j) The play must not be mis-registered, and the Play's ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error to an extent that it cannot be processed by the Party Lottery that issued the Play.

(k) The Play must pass validation tests using a minimum of three (3) of the five (5) validation methods as defined in the Finance and Operations Procedures for Mega Millions. In addition, the Play must pass all other confidential security requirements of the Party Lottery that issued the Play.

(l) In submitting a Play for validation, the claimant agrees to abide by applicable laws, all rules and regulations, instructions, conditions, and final decisions of the Director of the Party Lottery that issued the Play.

(m) There must not be any other breach of these Mega Millions Rules in relation to the Play that, in the opinion of the Director of the Party Lottery issuing the Play, justifies invalidation.

(n) The Play must be submitted to the Party Lottery that issued it.

Amended June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

(o) Ticketless transaction Plays must meet the validation requirements of the Party Lottery that issued the Play.

Amended June 5, 2014; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

31.4 A Play submitted for validation that fails any of the preceding validation conditions shall be considered void, subject to the following determinations:

(a) In all cases of doubt, the determination of the Party Lottery that sold the Play, shall be final and binding; however, the Party Lottery may, at its option, replace an invalid Play with a Play of equivalent sales price.

(b) In the event a defective ticket is purchased or in the event the Party Lottery determines to adjust an error, the Claimant's sole and exclusive remedy shall be the replacement of such defective or erroneous ticket(s) with a Play of equivalent sales price.

(c) In the event a Play is not paid by a Party Lottery and a dispute occurs as to whether the Play is a winning Play, the Party Lottery may, at its option, replace the Play as provided in paragraph (a) of this subsection. This shall be the sole and exclusive remedy of the Claimant unless the laws or regulations governing the Party Lottery provide for further administrative review.

MM RULE 32—PLAY RESPONSIBILITY.

32.1 Prize Claims. Prize claim procedures shall be governed by the rules of the Selling Lottery. MUSL and the Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for prizes that are not claimed following the proper procedures as determined by the Selling Lottery.

32.2 Reserved.

32.3 Stolen Plays. The Product Group, MUSL and the Party Lotteries shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Plays.

32.4 Ticketless Transactions. A Ticketless Transaction Play is only valid when registered with the lottery in accordance with lottery rules, these Rules, and the MUSL Rules. The person or, if permitted by the lottery rules, the persons registering the Play shall be the owner of the Ticketless Transaction play. A receipt for a Ticketless Transaction Play has no value and is not evidence of a Play.

32.5 The Party Lotteries shall not be responsible to a prize claimant for Plays redeemed in error by a selling agent or retailer.

32.6 Winners are determined by the numbers drawn and certified by the independent auditor responsible for auditing the Mega Millions draws. MUSL and the Party Lotteries are not responsible for Mega Millions winning numbers reported in error.

MM RULE 33—INELIGIBLE PLAYERS.

33.1 A Play or share for a MUSL game issued by MUSL or any of its Party Lotteries shall not be purchased by, and a prize won by any such Play or share shall not be paid to:

Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

(a) A MUSL employee, officer, or director.

Amended March 29, 2013.

(b) A contractor or consultant under agreement with the MUSL to review the MUSL audit and security procedures.

Amended March 29, 2013.

(c) An employee of an independent accounting firm under contract with MUSL to observe drawings or site operations and actually assigned to the MUSL account and all partners, shareholders, or owners in the local office of the firm. or

Amended March 29, 2013.

(d) An immediate family member (parent, stepparent, child, stepchild, spouse, or sibling) or any person residing in the same household of an individual described in subsections (a), (b), and (c)

(e) Those persons designated by a Party Lottery's law as ineligible to play its games shall also be ineligible to play the MUSL game in that Party Lottery's jurisdiction.

33.2 A Play or share of the Mega Millions game may not be purchased in any lottery jurisdiction by any Party Lottery board member, commissioner, officer, or employee; or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person. Prizes shall not be paid to any persons prohibited from playing Mega Millions in a particular jurisdiction by rules, governing law, or any contract executed by the Selling Lottery.

MM RULE 34—APPLICABLE LAW.

In purchasing a Play, or attempting to claim a prize, purchasers and prize claimants agree to comply with and abide by all applicable laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Party Lottery where the Play was purchased, and by directives and determinations of the director of that Party Lottery.

Additionally, the player shall be bound to all applicable provisions in the Mega Millions Finance and Operations Procedures for Mega Millions established by the Mega Millions Lotteries.

A prize claimant agrees, as its sole and exclusive remedy that claims arising out of a Play can only be pursued against the Party Lottery which issued the Play. Litigation, if any, shall only

be maintained within the jurisdiction in which the Play was purchased and only against the Party Lottery that issued the Play. No claim shall be made against any other Party Lottery or against the MUSL.

Nothing in these Rules shall be construed as a waiver of any defense or claim the Party Lottery which issued the Play, any other Party Lottery, or MUSL may have in any litigation, including in the event a player or prize claimant pursues litigation against a Party Lottery or MUSL, or their respective officers, directors, or employees.

All decisions made by a Party Lottery, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof and the interpretation of Mega Millions Rules, shall be final and binding on all Play purchasers and on every person making a prize claim in respect thereof, but only in the jurisdiction where the Play was issued.

Unless the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Party Lottery which issued the Play provide otherwise, no prize shall be paid upon a Play purchased, claimed or sold in violation of these Rules or the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Party Lottery; any such prize claimed but unpaid shall constitute an unclaimed prize under these Rules and the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Party Lottery.

Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019, to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

PART III – MEGA MILLIONS GAME

MM RULE 35 - MEGA MILLIONS GAME DESCRIPTION

35.1 Mega Millions Game. Mega Millions is a five (5) out of seventy (70) plus one (1) out of twenty-four (24) lottery game, drawn on the day(s), time(s) and location(s) as determined by the Mega Millions Lotteries. Each Mega Millions Play will include a Multiplier, which is a unique number that is automatically selected by computer software according to the frequency set for in **MM RULE 38** and printed directly on a Mega Millions Ticket. The Multiplier increases non-Jackpot Prizes by two times, three times, four times, five times, or ten times the prize won. A Mega Millions Jackpot Prize will be paid at the election of the player made in accordance with these rules or by a default election made in accordance with these rules, either on a graduated annuitized annual pari-mutuel basis or as a cash value option using a rate determined by the Mega Millions Lotteries on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a single payment basis.

Amended June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

35.2 Mega Millions winning numbers applicable to determine Mega Millions prizes will be determined on the day(s), time(s) and location(s) as determined by the Mega Millions Lotteries. During the drawing event, five (5) numbers shall be drawn from the first field of seventy (70) numbers, and one (1) number shall be drawn from the second field of twenty-four (24) numbers, which shall constitute the Winning Numbers. A Multiplier will be automatically selected.

Amended June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; October 28, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on April 21, 2020; June 27, 2024.

35.3 To play Mega Millions, a player shall select (or computer pick) five (5) different numbers, from a field of one (1) through seventy (70), and one (1) additional number from a second field of one (1) through twenty-four (24). The player selected (or computer picked) number from the second field may be the same as one of the five numbers selected from the first field. A computer-generated Multiplier will be included on each Mega Millions Play purchased and will multiply lower tier prizes only. The Multiplier is included in the price of a Play and is not an add-on. The Multiplier is further defined in **MM RULE 38**.

Amended June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

35.4 MM Plays can be purchased for five dollars (U.S. \$5.00), including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Party Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery Play.

Amended June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

35.5 Plays may be purchased from a Party Lottery approved sales outlet in a manner as approved by the Party Lottery and in accordance with MUSL Rules.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013, to be effective with the drawing on October 22, 2013; June 5 2014; June 14, 2016 to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

MM RULE 36—MEGA MILLIONS PRIZE POOL.

36.1 Mega Millions Prize Pool. The prize pool for all prize categories offered by the Party Lotteries shall consist of up to fifty-five percent (55%) of each drawing period's sales, inclusive of any specific statutorily-mandated tax of a Party Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery MM Play, and inclusive of contributions to the prize pool accounts and prize reserve accounts, but may be higher or lower based upon the number of winners at each prize level, as well as the funding required to meet a guaranteed Annuity Mega Millions Jackpot Prize as may be required by Rule 30.1(a).

Amended Dec 31, 2009; September 21, 2010, to be effective December 1, 2010; June 5, 2014; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

36.2 Mega Millions Prize Pool Accounts and Prize Reserve Accounts. The Product Group shall set the contribution rates to the prize pool and prize reserve accounts established by this rule.

(a) The following prize reserve accounts for the Mega Millions game are hereby established:

(i) The Prize Reserve Account (PRA) which is used to guarantee the payment of valid, but unanticipated, Mega Millions Jackpot Prize claims that may result from a system error or other reason to fund deficiencies in the Set Aside Pool, and to fund pari-mutuel prize deficiencies as defined and limited in Rules 36.3(c)(1)(a) and G(2)(a)(1).

(b) The following prize pool accounts for the Mega Millions game are hereby established:

(i) The Mega Millions Jackpot Prize Pool (JPP), which is used to fund the current Mega Millions Jackpot Prize;

(ii) The Set Prize Pool (SPP), which is used to fund the Set or Lower Tier Prizes. The SPP shall hold the temporary balances that may result from having fewer than expected winners in the Set Prize categories. The Source of the SPP is the Party Lottery's weekly prize contributions less actual Set Prize liability; and,

(iii) The Set-Aside Pool (SAP) which is used to fund the payment of the awarded minimum starting annuity Mega Millions Jackpot Prizes and the minimum annuity Mega Millions Jackpot Prize increase, if necessary (subject to the limitations in these rules), as may be set by the Product Group. The source of the SAP funding shall accumulate from the difference between the amount in the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize Pool at the time of a Mega Millions Jackpot Prize win and the amount needed to fund Mega Millions Jackpot Prize payments as determined by the Mega Millions lotteries.

The maximum balance amounts and balance limit triggers are subject to review by the MUSL Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall have two weeks to state objections, if any, to the approved maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers. Approved maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers shall become effective no sooner than two weeks after notice is given to the Finance Committee and no objection is stated or sooner if the Committee affirmatively approves the maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers. The Group may appeal the Committee's objections to the full Board. Group approved changes in the maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers set by the Product Group shall be effective only after the next Mega Millions Jackpot Prize win.

(d) The contribution rate to the GPP from MM Plays shall be 37.6509% of sales.

An amount up to five percent (5%) of a Party Lottery's sales, including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Party Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery play, shall be added to a Party Lottery's Mega Millions Prize Pool contribution and placed in trust in one or more prize pool and prize reserve accounts held by the Product Group at any time that the Party Lottery's share of the PRA is below the amounts designated by the Product Group.

(e) The Product Group may determine to expend all or a portion of the funds in the prize pools (except the GPP) and the prize reserve accounts:

(i) for the purpose of indemnifying the Party Lotteries in the payment of prizes to be made by the Selling Lotteries; and

(ii) for the payment of prizes or special prizes in the game, limited to prize pool and prize reserve contributions from lotteries participating in the special prize promotion, subject to the approval of the Board's Finance Committee or that Committee's failure to object after given two weeks' notice of the planned action, which actions may be appealed to the full Board by the Product Group.

(f) The prize reserve shares of a Party Lottery may be adjusted with refunds to the Party Lottery from the prize reserve account(s) as may be needed to maintain the approved maximum balance and sales percentage shares of the Party Lotteries.

(g) A Party Lottery may contribute to its sales percentage share of prize reserve accounts over time, but in the event of a draw down from a reserve account, a Party Lottery is responsible for payment of its full sales percentage share of the prize reserve account.

(h) Any amount remaining in the Mega Millions prize pool accounts or prize reserve account when the Product Group declares the end of the game shall be returned to the lotteries participating in the prize pool and prize reserve accounts after the end of all claim periods of all Selling Lotteries, carried forward to a replacement game, or otherwise expended in a manner at the election of the individual Members of the Product Group in accordance with jurisdiction statute.

Amended September 21, 2010, to be effective December 1, 2010; March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013; June 5, 2014; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

36.3 Expected Prize Payout. The Mega Millions Jackpot payout shall be determined on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as otherwise provided in these rules all other prizes awarded by Party Lotteries shall be paid as single payment prizes. All prize payouts are made with the following expected prize payout percentages, which does not include any additional amount contributed to or held in prize reserves, although the prize payout percentages per draw may vary:

(a) The Mega Millions Jackpot Prize amount shall be divided equally by the number of MM Plays winning the Mega Millions Jackpot Prize.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 15, 2017, to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017; June 27, 2024.

(b) The SPP (for payment of single payment prizes of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013, to be effective with the drawing on October 22, 2013; June 5, 2014; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016; June 15, 2017 to be effective with the drawing on October 31, 2017.

(c) Pari-mutuel Prize Determinations.

(c)(1) Except as otherwise provided for in 36.3(c)(2):

(c)(1)(a) If the total of the Mega Millions Set Prizes (as multiplied by the respective multiplier if applicable) awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the Mega Millions Set Prizes, then the amount needed to fund the Mega Millions Set Prizes, awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order: *Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016.*

(i) the amount available in the SPP, if any;

Amended June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016.

(ii) an amount from the PRA, if available, not to exceed forty million dollars (\$40,000,000.00) per drawing.

(c)(1)(b) If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the Set Prizes, then the highest Set Prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest Set Prize when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest Set Prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining Set Prizes awarded, then the next highest Set Prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all Set Prize levels, if necessary, until all Set Prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this Rule shall be divided among the winning MM Plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Mega Millions prizes will be reduced by the same percentage.

Amended June 5, 2014; June 14, 2016, to be effective with the drawing on October 18, 2016.

(c)(2) By agreement with the Mega Millions Lotteries, the Mega Millions Lotteries shall independently calculate their set pari-mutuel prize amounts. The Party Lotteries and the Mega Millions Lotteries shall then agree to set the pari-mutuel prize amount for all lotteries selling the game at the lesser of the independently calculated prize amounts. The California Lottery is excluded from the Participating Lotteries' pari-mutual prize calculations.

Amended March 29, 2013; June 25, 2013, to be effective with the drawing on October 22, 2013; June 27, 2024.

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(d) Except as may be required by Rule 30.1(a), the official advertised Mega Millions Jackpot annuity amount is subject to change based on sales forecasts and/or actual sales.

Amended Dec 31, 2009; June 3, 2010, to be effective September 14, 2010.

(e) Subject to the laws and rules governing each Party Lottery, the number of prize categories and the allocation of the prize fund among the prize categories may be changed at the discretion of the Mega Millions Lotteries, for promotional purposes. Such change shall be announced by Mega Millions Lotteries.

MM RULE 37 – PRIZE STRUCTURE. The matrix of 5/70 and 1/24 with an anticipated prize payout is shown below and applies to all Product Group members with respect to the Jackpot Prize and will apply for all Product Group members for the second through ninth level prizes. Due to jurisdictional law requirements, the California State Lottery shall separately determine the second through ninth level prizes and Multiplier prize values on a pari-mutuel basis.

The following table sets forth the odds of winning and the probable distribution of winners in and among each prize category for MM Plays sold by Party Lotteries, based upon the total number of possible combinations in Mega Millions. All prize payouts are made with the following expected prize payout percentages, which does not include any additional amount contributed to or held in prize reserves, although the prize payout percentages per draw may vary:

MM RULE 38 – MULTIPLIER FREQUENCY AND ODDS. The Multiplier shall apply to all prize levels except the Jackpot Prize. The Multiplier increases non-Jackpot Prizes by two times, three times, four times, five times, or ten times the prize won. The Multiplier shall print directly on, or be applied to each Play on a Ticket. Multipliers may repeat due to the frequency and limited Multiplier levels as shown below.

PART I — ADMINISTRATION

L A RULE 1—DISPUTES, VOTING, ELECTIONS.

1.1 First Review. The Product Group shall have the first opportunity to informally resolve any disputes arising among Party Lotteries regarding the Product Group, rules, policies, or guidelines. The Selling Lottery seeking resolution of a dispute shall seek a remedy from the Product Group by filing a notice of dispute with the Product Group. Filing shall be done by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the Executive Director. If the Product Group fails to resolve the dispute to the satisfaction of any party to the dispute within sixty (60) days after receiving notice of the dispute, the aggrieved Selling Lottery may seek any other remedy authorized by the Multi-State Lottery Agreement.

1.2 Voting. Unless a different requirement is stated in these Rules, the Product Group shall take actions by a majority of members casting votes.

Amended June 6, 2019.

1.3 Amendment of Rules. These Product Group Rules may be amended upon a vote of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes. For rule amendments under Rule 27.9, Emergency Rulemaking Authority, the rules may be amended upon a vote of three-fourths (3/4) or more of the members casting votes.

Amended May 6, 2020 to be effective after the Drawing on June 13, 2020; January 27, 2021.

1.4 Quorum. The quorum necessary to hold an official meeting of the Product Group shall be representation in person or by proxy from more than fifty percent (50%) of all members. If neither the Chair nor Vice-Chair can attend a scheduled meeting in person, then the meeting shall be rescheduled.

1.5 Elections. A Product Group Chair and Product Group Vice-Chair shall be elected for one-year terms. The Chair shall appoint a Nominating Committee to recommend candidates to the Product Group. Nominations may also be made by motion and properly seconded.

L A RULE 2— Reserved.

L A RULE 3—BUDGET.

3.1 Duties of Executive Director. Annually or on a more frequent basis, the Executive Director shall prepare and submit to the Product Group Chair a proposed budget and fees for the Party Lotteries to pay the Product Group for the services it renders to them and shall be paid as a fee for services by each of the Party Lotteries in accordance with estimated sales. An acceptable method of payment shall be determined by the Product Group, subject to approval by the Board.

If a lottery withdraws from participation in the product group without giving proper notice of such withdrawal before approval of the group's budget, then that Participating Lottery shall not be entitled to a refund of its contributions to the budget.

If the Product Group terminates before the end of a fiscal year, all unspent funds shall be returned to the lotteries which contributed to the Group's budget, however Group contributions to MUSL overhead expenses shall not be refunded.

L A RULE 4—DRAWINGS.

The Executive Director shall establish, with Product Group approval, the minimum drawing procedures to be established for the drawing of winning numbers and shall work with the lottery conducting the drawing to implement the procedures. The Drawing Procedures shall include procedures for randomly selecting the Winning Numbers.

Drawings shall be held at the times and places established by the Product Group and the results shall be subsequently announced to the public. All drawings shall be open to the public and shall be witnessed by an independent certified public accounting firm and other Selling Lottery officials as may be required by jurisdiction statute.

The Lotto America game drawing will be conducted at 9:15 pm CT or later. The Selling Lottery Director shall determine the time for the end of sales prior to the drawings, which shall not be later than 9:00 pm CT. Lotteries shall not process Plays for that drawing after the time established by the Selling Lottery Director.

Amended June 16, 2022; March 7, 2023.

The Product Group shall designate or delegate the type of drawing equipment to be used and any equipment used in a drawing shall be inspected and tested by the draw officials in the presence of an independent certified public accounting firm before the drawing. All drawings, inspections, and tests shall be video- and audio-recorded.

L A RULE 5— Reserved.

L A RULE 6—RECORDS MANAGEMENT.

6.1 Records Defined. "Records" shall mean any document, paper, photograph, or recording made or received, in whatever form, in connection with the official business of the Product Group. Records do not include materials made or acquired for reference or exhibition purposes, or miscellaneous papers or correspondence without official significance.

6.2 Duties of Executive Director. The Executive Director shall maintain Product Group records in a secure and orderly manner.

6.3 Confidentiality. To the maximum extent practical, Product Group records shall be made available for inspection by participating lotteries in a reasonable and responsible manner.

6.4 Records Retention. The Executive Director shall establish the minimum retention period for each record or class of record with Product Group approval. The Executive Director shall establish the criteria for the disposal of Product Group records.

L A RULE 7—Reserved.

L A RULE 8—PETITION FOR ADMISSION.

8.1 MUSL Rule 2 Compliance - Minimum ICS Standards. A Lottery seeking admission to the Product Group shall have a fully tested internal control system that meets or exceeds the minimum standards set forth in MUSL Rule 2 (Minimum ICS Standards) before sales of Plays commence. The Security and Integrity Committee shall review the internal control systems of each lottery seeking admission to the Product Group for compliance with Rule 2 (Minimum ICS Standards) and shall issue a written report summarizing its findings.

8.2 Other Admission Requirements. The Product Group shall determine other admission requirements as allowed by the Agreement.

L A RULE 9—EXPULSION OR SUSPENSION OF A PARTY LOTTERY.

9.1 The Product Group can expel or suspend a Party Lottery of the Product Group for cause as determined in the sole discretion of the Product Group with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes in conformance with the MUSL Agreement. If the Product Group votes to expel or suspend a Party Lottery as provided in the Agreement, the Party Lottery being considered for expulsion or suspension shall be excluded from the vote in that proceeding and shall also be excluded from any subsequent vote by the Product Group to reinstate that Party Lottery, and in the voting calculations outlined in these Product Group Rules.

Amended November 7, 2017; June 6, 2019; January 27, 2021.

9.2 The Product Group can reinstate a Party Lottery of the Product Group with the consent of two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members casting votes in conformance with the MUSL Agreement. Requests for reinstatement shall be considered by the Product Group at its earliest convenience, following submission of support sufficient for such reinstatement from the requesting lottery.

Adopted November 7, 2017

Amended June 6, 2019; January 27, 2021.

9.3 Any Party Lottery, which fails, is unwilling, or loses the ability to transfer prize contributions as required under these Rules shall suspend its sales of Lotto America within seven (7) days of such failure or loss of ability. The Party Lottery may request reinstatement as provided for under these Rules. Failure to notify the Product Group of such circumstances, or of the suspension of sales, or the failure to suspend sales as required, shall be grounds for suspension or expulsion.

Adopted November 7, 2017.

9.4 Any Party Lottery that fails, is unwilling, or loses the ability to pay all prize levels in the game(s) after prize claimants have met all prize claim procedures of the Party Lottery, the Group and the MUSL Board, shall immediately suspend its sales of Lotto America upon such failure, unwillingness or loss of ability. The Party Lottery may request reinstatement as provided for under these Rules. Failure to notify the Product Group of such circumstances, or of the suspension of sales, or the failure to suspend sales as required, shall be grounds for suspension or expulsion.

Adopted November 7, 2017.

L A RULE 10—ADVERTISING.

10.1 Unfair Advertising. No Selling Lottery may advertise, either directly or indirectly, that Lotto America Plays sold in its jurisdiction offer better odds, better chances of winning, or better payoffs than Lotto America Plays sold in other jurisdictions. This rule does not prohibit a Selling Lottery from offering retailer promotions or other creative promotions designed to increase the sale of Lotto America Plays.

10.2 Grand Prize Estimate. No Selling Lottery may advertise an estimated or guaranteed Grand Prize amount that is different than the estimated or guaranteed Grand Prize amount provided to the Selling Lottery by the Product Group.

L A RULE 11—PLAY PRICE.

11.1 Uniform Price. Each Play shall be sold at retail for the price set by the Product Group.

11.2 Taxes. The Play price set by the Product Group shall include all the applicable taxes that a Selling Lottery may be required to collect.

11.3 Discounts, Rebates, and Promotions. A Selling Lottery may offer Plays through discounts, rebates, or promotions, without Product Group approval, for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days in any six-month period after advising all Group members of the terms and dates of the offering. A Selling Lottery may offer other discounts, rebates, or promotions as may be approved by the Product Group.

11.4 Plays as Prizes. Nothing in this rule shall prohibit a Selling Lottery from offering Plays as a prize in any other game or promotion operated by the Selling Lottery after advising all Group members of the terms and dates of the offering.

11.5 Contribution to Prize Pool. Selling lotteries that offer Plays as a prize or as part of an authorized discount, promotion, or rebate shall contribute to the prize pool the full amount assessed for a Play sold at the uniform price.

Comment. Rules 11.3 and 11.4 are intended to require reporting only where the price of the Lotto America Play is reduced by a promotion or is given away for free. A Selling Lottery need not report promotions that do not change the price of the Play. Promotions that increase the “value” of a Play or that offer other lottery games free or at a reduced price with the purchase of a Lotto America Play do not need to be reported. The intent of the rule is to advise contiguous lotteries when their players might find that they can get the same Lotto America Play at a reduced price from another lottery – not that they can get that other lottery’s games at a reduced price.

L A RULE 12—SALE OF PLAYS.

12.1 Authorized Agents. Lotto America Plays shall be sold only through agents and means authorized by a Selling Lottery.

12.2 Printed Plays. Lotto America Plays shall be sold through an authorized Selling Lottery and other than ticketless transaction Plays, shall be printed on paper that meets the security requirements used in the Selling Lottery's other games and other requirements adopted by the MUSL Board and the Product Group.

Amended June 16, 2022.

12.3 MUSL Markings. All Play Slips used in the game shall contain registered game trademarks and shall communicate other information as may be required by the MUSL Board and the Group.

12.4 Game Sell Out Prohibited. No Selling Lottery shall directly and knowingly sell a Play or combination of Plays to any person or entity that would guarantee such purchaser a Grand Prize win.

12.5 Location and Method of Sales. An offer to buy and an offer to sell a Lotto America Play shall be made only at a location or only by a method that is licensed, certified, authorized, or contracted by the Selling Lottery.

L A RULE 13—PRIZE PAYMENTS.

No Selling Lottery may pay prizes that are less than or more than the prize amounts established by the Product Group. The prize won cannot be indirectly increased by Selling Lottery promotions or agent promotions that have the effect of increasing the designated Lotto America prize.

L A RULE 14—LOTTO AMERICA PRIZE FUND TRANSFERS.

14.1 Prize Funds Transferred to MUSL. Each Party Lottery shall transfer to the MUSL in trust an amount as determined by the Product Group to be its total proportionate share of the Lotto America prize pool less actual low-tier Lotto America prize liability. If this results in a negative amount, the MUSL central office shall transfer funds from the appropriate prize account to the Party Lottery.

14.2 Grand Prize Funds Transferred to Selling Lottery. Grand Prize amounts held by MUSL shall be transferred to the Selling Lottery immediately after the Selling Lottery validates the prize claim and a Grand Prize payout election has been determined, and after MUSL has collected the prize pool shares from all Selling Lotteries.

14.3 Unclaimed Grand Prizes. All funds to pay a Grand Prize, that had been collected by MUSL from a Selling Lottery and that went unclaimed shall be returned to the Selling Lotteries in proportion to sales by Selling Lotteries for the Grand Prize in question after the claiming period set by the Selling Lottery selling the winning Play expires.

If after a winning Play has not been claimed or redeemed and the corresponding prize monies have been returned to Participating Lotteries pursuant to this Rule, a claim is made or redemption sought which a Selling Lottery pays (i) as a result of the provisions of the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (50 U.S.C. App. §3901 et seq as amended) (SCRA); (ii) as a result of jurisdictional legislation adopted to satisfy the requirements of the SCRA; or (iii) as a result of jurisdictional legislation requiring such payment to a member of the armed forces who was engaged in active military service outside the paying Selling Lottery jurisdiction when the usual permitted time period to make a claim or seek redemption expired, each other Participating Lottery, that was a Participating Lottery at the time of the drawing, shall reimburse the paying Selling Lottery in an amount equal to the amount such other Participating Lottery would have contributed to the prize had the claim been made or redemption sought within the usual permitted time period for that claim or redemption. The provisions of this rule shall remain in force and effect and be binding upon the Participating Lotteries without regard to whether the Lotto America game remains in existence and/or whether the Selling Lottery seeking reimbursement has withdrawn from the game at the time a Selling Lottery seeks reimbursement pursuant to this rule.

L A RULES 15 through 18 —Reserved.

L A RULE 19—FUNDS TRANSFER.

Funds shall be collected from each Party Lottery weekly by wire transfer, electronic funds transfer, or other means acceptable to the Product Group. The amount to be transferred shall be calculated in accordance with these rules. The Product Group shall determine collection days.

Comment. Funds shall be collected weekly from Party Lotteries on the Monday, or the first banking day, that is twelve (12) days from the applicable Wednesday drawing or nine (9) days from the applicable Saturday drawing.

L A RULE 20 — Reserved.

L A RULE 21—ADVANCE SALES.

Proceeds from advance sales may be held by the Party Lottery until the draw date for which the Play applies.

L A RULES 22 through 25 — Reserved.

PART II LOTTO AMERICASM GAME RULES

L A RULE 26—DEFINITIONS.

The following definitions apply to all Parts of these rules unless the context requires a different meaning or is otherwise inconsistent with the intention of these rules adopted by the Product Group. Capitalized terms used but not defined in these rules shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the MUSL Agreement.

26.1 “Advertised Grand Prize” shall mean the estimated annuitized Grand Prize amount as determined by the MUSL Central Office by use of the MUSL Annuity Factor and communicated through the Selling Lotteries prior to the Grand Prize drawing. The “Advertised Grand Prize” is not a guaranteed prize amount and the actual Grand Prize amount may vary from the advertised amount, except in circumstances where there is a guaranteed Grand Prize amount as described in Rule 30.5.

26.2 “Agent” or “retailer” means a person or entity authorized by a Selling Lottery to sell lottery Plays.

26.3 “All Star Bonus” shall refer to the All Star Bonus Multiplier Promotion described in Part III of these Rules.

26.4 “All Star Bonus Multiplier Plays” shall refer to Plays purchases as part of the All Star Bonus Multiplier Promotion described in Part III of these Rules.

26.5 A “Drawing” refers collectively to the formal draw event for randomly selecting the winning indicia that determine the number of winners for each prize level of the Lotto America game. Winning indicia include the Winning Numbers for the Lotto America game.

26.6 “Computer pick” means the random selection of indicia by the computer that appear on a ticket or ticketless transaction and are played by a player in the game.

26.7 “Game ticket” or “Ticket” means the physical evidence of a Play, printed on paper that meets the play and security data required by the Selling Lottery, these Game Rules, and the MUSL Rules that allow redemption of a prize. Tickets may be printed by terminals or Retailer Controlled Selling Devices as permitted by these Rules and the Selling Lottery. Affected MUSL Rules include, but are not limited to MUSL Rules 2.14, 2.20, and 2.21.

June 16, 2022.

26.8 “Grand Prize” shall refer to the top prize in the Lotto America game.

26.9 “Lotto America Play” shall refer to Plays purchased as part of the Lotto America game, but shall not include All Star Bonus Multiplier Plays.

26.10 “MUSL” means the Multi-State Lottery Association, a government-benefit association wholly owned and operated by the Party Lotteries.

26.11 “MUSL Annuity Factor” shall mean the annuity factor as determined by the MUSL central office through a method approved by the MUSL Finance Committee and which is used as described in these Rules.

26.12 "MUSL Board" means the governing body of the MUSL, which is comprised of the chief executive officer of each Party Lottery.

26.13 “MUSL Finance Committee” shall mean the committee of that name established by the MUSL Board.

26.14 “Participating Lottery” or “Selling Lottery” means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity that is authorized by the Product Group to participate in selling the Lotto America game.

26.15 "Party Lottery" or “Member Lottery” means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity that has joined the MUSL and, in the context of these Product Group Rules, that is authorized to sell the Lotto America game.

26.16 "Play" or "Bet" means a set of six (6) numbers, the first five (5) from a field of fifty-two (52) numbers and the last one (1) from a field of ten (10) numbers, that appear on a ticket or communicated in a ticketless transaction as a single lettered selection and are to be played by a player in the Lotto America game. Each Play is played separately in determining matches to winning numbers and prize amounts.

As used in these Rules, unless otherwise specifically indicated, “Play” or “Bet” includes Lotto America Plays.

“All Star Bonus Multiplier Plays” are separately described in Part III of these Rules.

26.17 "Play Slip" or "Bet Slip" means a physical or electronic means by which a player communicates their intended Play selection to the retailer as defined and approved by the Selling Lottery. A Play Slip or Bet Slip is not a ticket or ticketless transaction.

Amended June 16, 2022.

26.18 “Product Group” or “the Group” means a group of lotteries that has joined together to offer a product pursuant to the terms of the Multi-State Lottery Agreement and the Product Group’s own rules.

26.19 “Registered Play” means a wager where the play is owned by a specifically identified player through a means acceptable to the Selling Lottery, and which is recorded on the Selling Lottery’s computer gaming system and the internal control system.

Amended June 16, 2022.

26.20 “Retailer Controlled Selling Device” means a device which is not a Terminal and which is controlled by a retailer for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating tickets, and transmitting reports. Examples of Retailer Controlled Selling Devices include cash registers. Retailer Controlled Selling Devices must meet all security requirements of the Selling Lottery,

these Rules and the MUSL Rules. Retailer Controlled Selling Devices do not include player provided point of sale devices such as smartphones.

Amended June 16, 2022.

26.21 "Set Prize", also referred to as "low-tier prize", means all other prizes, except the Grand Prize, and, except in instances outlined in these rules, will be equal to the prize amount established by the Product Group for the prize level.

26.22 "Terminal" means a device that meets all security and definitional requirements of these Rules, the MUSL Rules and the Selling Lottery, and which is authorized by a Selling Lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the computer gaming system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating tickets, and transmitting reports. The term Terminal does not include a Retailer Controlled Selling Device such as a cash register or player provided point of sale device such as a smartphone.

Amended June 16, 2022.

26.23 "Ticketless Transaction" means any Play that is not printed on paper that meets the anti-counterfeiting requirements described in the MUSL Rules. Examples of Ticketless Transactions include internet, subscription, and other types of Registered Plays. All Ticketless Transactions must be Registered Plays. Any Play sold through a Terminal or Retailer Controlled Selling Device, but which is a Registered Play requiring confirmation of the player's identity upon prize redemption shall be considered a Ticketless Transaction even when a receipt, summation, or recognition of purchase is printed by or through the device.

Amended June 16, 2022.

26.22 "Winning Numbers" means the indicia randomly selected during a Drawing event which shall be used to determine winning Plays for the Lotto America game contained on a game ticket or ticketless transaction.

L A RULE 27—LOTTO AMERICA GAME DESCRIPTION.

27.1 Lotto America.

(a) Lotto America is a five (5) out of fifty-two (52) plus one (1) out of ten (10) numbers lottery game drawn on days as determined by the Lotto America Product Group as part of the Lotto America drawing event, which pays the Grand Prize, at the election of the player made in accordance with these rules or by a default election made in accordance with these rules, either on an annuitized pari-mutuel basis or as a single lump sum payment of the total funding held in the Grand Prize Pool (GPP) for the winning drawing on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a single payment basis.

Amended June 24, 2021

Comment: Lotto America Drawings are held on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Effective July 18, 2022, Lotto America Drawings are held on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays. June 24, 2021, September 17, 2021.

(b) Lotto America Winning Numbers applicable to determine Lotto America prizes will be determined in the Lotto America Drawing event. During the drawing event, five (5) numbers shall

be drawn from the first set of fifty-two (52) numbers, and one (1) number shall be drawn from the second set of ten (10) numbers, which shall constitute the Winning Numbers.

(c) To play Lotto America, a player shall select (or computer pick) five (5) different numbers, from one (1) through fifty-two (52) and one (1) additional number from one (1) through ten (10). The additional number may be the same as one of the first five numbers selected by the player.

(d) Plays can be purchased for one dollar (U.S. \$1.00), including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a Play.

(e) Plays may be purchased from a Selling Lottery approved sales outlet in a manner as approved by the Selling Lottery and in accordance with MUSL Rules

27.2 Proof of Play. Unless otherwise permitted by a selling lottery, a ticket (subject to the validation requirements set forth in Rule 31 (Ticket Validation)) or properly registered ticketless transaction shall be the only proof of a game Play or Plays and the submission of a winning ticket to the issuing Selling Lottery or its authorized agent shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes. A Play Slip, paper receipt, or printed summation of a Play printed by a Terminal which is not a ticket has no pecuniary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of a Play purchase or numbers selected.

Amended June 16, 2022.

27.3 Cancellations Prohibited; Request for Plays, Returned Plays, Incomplete Transaction Plays, Stolen Plays and Refunds for Game Cancellations.

(a) **Plays Non-Cancellable.** In all instances, a Play recorded on the CGS may not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket or ticketless transaction to the Retailer or to the Selling Lottery, including tickets that are misprinted, illegible, printed in error, or for any reason not successfully transferred to an authorized selling entity or Player.

(b) **Request for Plays.** A lottery may conduct future sales through a subscription or other system that does not immediately record such sales on the CGS. A “Request for Play” is a sale that is not immediately recorded on the CGS, but is instead recorded onto the CGS at some future time prior to a draw event. At the sole discretion of the lottery, authorized sales through a subscription or other system that has not been recorded on the CGS (instead recorded as “Request for Plays”), may be cancelled at any time prior to the time the Request for Play is recorded as a Play on the CGS. If a Request for Play is cancelled, it shall not be recorded on the CGS.

Per 27.3(a), once a Play is recorded on the CGS, it may not be cancelled at any time. Any cancelled “Request for Play” shall not be included in sales data report to MUSL.

Comment: Examples of instances when Selling Lotteries may desire to permit cancellation of subscription “Request for Plays” include game matrix changes, price changes, modifications of game features, players who enroll in self-exclusion programs, and other circumstances as may be determined by the Selling Lottery.

(c) **Returned Plays.** To promote good Player or Retailer relations, a Selling Lottery, at its sole discretion, may develop a method of compensating Players or Retailers for Plays accepted by the Selling Lottery as returned to the Selling Lottery (“Returned Plays”) that are misprinted, illegible, printed in error, future Plays affected by changes in game features by the Selling Lottery or due to game cancellations.

Returned Plays may not be cancelled or voided. Returned Plays are not reported to MUSL.

The Selling Lottery Must remit its required prize pool contributions on all Plays accepted as returned Plays by the Selling Lottery.

Returned Plays may not be claimed for a prize by any person or entity, including the Selling Lottery. Any prizes which would have been won on a Returned Play shall become an unclaimed prize at the end of the prize claim period.

(d) Incomplete Transaction Plays. Incomplete Transaction Plays occur when a Retailer begins a Play transaction as requested by a Player, and the Play is registered on the CGS, but the transaction is terminated prior to transferring Play confirmation to the Player, there is no attempt to print the Play on a ticket, and the Player has not paid for the Play. Transaction terminations may be due to time sensitivities, communications loss or other issues as accepted by the Selling Lottery.

A Selling Lottery, at its sole discretion, may develop an approved method of managing Incomplete Transaction Plays, subject to these provisions.

Incomplete Transaction Plays may not be cancelled or voided.

The Selling Lottery must remit its required prize pool contributions on any Incomplete Transaction Plays. At its sole discretion, the Selling Lottery may develop a method of compensation Retailers for Incomplete Transaction Plays if Retailers are required to reimburse Selling Lotteries for prize pool contributions.

Incomplete Transaction Plays may not be claimed for a prize by any person or entity including the Retailer. Any prize which cannot be claimed as a prize under this Rule but would otherwise have been won on an Incomplete Transaction Play shall become an unclaimed prize at the end of the prize claim period of the drawing for which the Incomplete Transaction Play was recorded. Incomplete Transaction Plays are not reported to MUSL.

(e) Stolen Plays. Plays reported as stolen from a Retailer that have been recovered cannot be accepted by the Selling Lottery as Returned Plays.

Selling Lotteries may compensate a Retailer for the loss from theft if a Selling Lottery, solely at its discretion, determines to assume such a loss, but Stolen Plays cannot be cancelled or voided.

Ownership of Stolen Plays, and whether any party has a right to claim prizes on Stolen Plays, shall be determined by the rules of the Selling Lottery.

(f) Game Cancellation. In the event of cancellation of the Game by the Product Group prior to the occurrence of all drawings for which Plays have been sold and recorded on the CGS, the Selling Lottery may provide a refund mechanism for such Plays to the Players, and the Selling Lottery shall not be required to remit its prize pool contributions for any such refunded Plays.

(g) Selling Lotteries Prohibited from Claiming Prizes. Selling Lotteries and lottery officials are prohibited from claiming any prizes on Plays that are owned by the Selling Lottery through “Returned Plays” or otherwise acquired and held by the Selling Lottery. Any prizes that would otherwise be won on Plays owned or acquired by Selling Lotteries shall become unclaimed prizes at the end of the prize claim period.

Comment: Last amended June 6, 2019 to be effective with the drawing on December 7, 2019.

Amended June 6, 2019 to be effective December 7, 2019.

27.4 Player Responsibility. It shall be the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game Play or Plays and other data printed on the ticket or contained in a ticketless

transaction. The placing of Plays is done at the player's own risk through the agent that is acting on behalf of the player in entering the Play or Plays. The purchaser of a Play or Plays through a ticketless transaction has the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data at the time of purchase.

27.5 Entry of Plays. Plays may only be entered as approved by the Selling Lottery by such means as approved by the Selling Lottery. Retailers shall not permit the use of Play Slips that are not allowed by the Selling Lottery. Retailers shall not permit any device to enter Plays, except as allowed by the Selling Lottery.

Amended June 16, 2022.

27.6 Registration of Plays. Ticketless transaction Plays may be registered with the Selling Lottery in a manner that meets the requirements established by the Product Group, the Selling Lottery, and the MUSL Rules.

Amended June 16, 2022.

27.7 Maximum Purchase. Except for a ticketless transaction Play purchase when the Selling Lottery has a process in place to allow players to make changes to their Play purchases in the event of a game change, the maximum number of consecutive drawings on a single Play purchase is thirty-nine (39). The maximum number of consecutive drawings encompassed by a ticketless transaction Play purchase when the Selling Lottery has a process in place to allow players to make changes to their Play purchases in the event of a game change is one hundred four (104).

Amended June 24, 2021.

27.8 Matrix Change. In the event of a matrix change, the Selling Lottery that issued the ticketless transaction will determine the option(s) available to ticketless transaction purchasers from that Selling Lottery for the balance of Plays remaining on their ticketless transactions effective as of the date of the matrix change.

Amended January 27, 2021.

27.9 Emergency Rulemaking Authority. The Product Group recognizes that rulemaking procedures in each state are unique and play a critical role in the governance of the multi-jurisdictional game. Pursuant to the Product Group's fiduciary duty, the Product Group similarly recognizes that it may become necessary for the Product Group to propose or adopt a permanent rule change or modification to protect the integrity of a game in response to an imminent crisis or emergency. A rule change adopted pursuant to this section is effective upon the affirmative vote of three-fourths (3/4) or more of the members casting votes. A rule adopted pursuant to this section shall have the same force and effect as any other rule adopted by the Product Group.

Adopted May 6, 2020 to be effective after the Drawing on June 13, 2020.

Amended January 27, 2021.

L A RULE 28—LOTTO AMERICA PRIZE POOL.

28.1 Lotto America Prize Pool. The prize pool for all prize categories shall consist of fifty percent (50%) of each drawing period's sales, inclusive of any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a Play, and including contributions to the

prize pool accounts and prize reserve accounts but may be higher or lower based upon the number of winners at each prize level.

28.2(a) Lotto America Prize Pool Accounts and Prize Reserve Accounts. The Product Group shall set the contribution rates to the prize pools and prize reserve accounts established by this Rule.

(i) The following prize reserve accounts for the Lotto America Game are hereby established:

(a) The Prize Reserve Account (PRA) which is used to guarantee the payment of valid, but unanticipated, Grand Prize claims that may result from a system error or other reason; to fund deficiencies in low-tier Lotto America Game prize payments (subject to the limitations of these rules); deficiencies in guaranteed Grand Prize funding if approved by the Group; and for other purposes as established in these Rules.

(ii) The following prize pools for the Lotto America Game are hereby established:

- (a) The Grand Prize Pool (GPP), which is used to fund the current Grand Prize;
- (b) The Set Prize Pool (SPP), which is used to fund the Set Prizes. The SPP shall hold the temporary balances that may result from having fewer than expected winners in the Set Prize (aka low-tier prize) categories. The Source of the SPP is the Party Lottery's weekly prize contributions less actual Set Prize liability;
- (c) The Set-Aside Pool (SAP) which is used to fund the payment of the awarded minimum starting annuity Grand Prizes and the minimum annuity Grand Prize increase, if necessary (subject to the limitations in these rules), as may be set by the Product Group; and
- (d) the Grand Prize Carry Forward Pool (GPCFP), which is used to fund the starting minimum annuity Grand Prize, as may be set by the Product Group, if such funds are available, and if sales do not fund the Grand Prize.

(iii) The above prize reserve accounts, the GPCFP and the SAP may have maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers that are set by the Product Group and are detailed in the Comments to this Rule.

The maximum balance amounts and balance limit triggers are subject to review by the MUSL Board Finance and Audit Committee. The Finance and Audit Committee shall have two weeks to state objections, if any, to the approved maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers. Approved maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers shall become effective no sooner than two weeks after notice is given to the Finance and Audit Committee and no objection is stated or sooner if the Committee affirmatively approves the maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers. The Group may appeal the Committee's objections to the full Board. Group approved changes in the maximum balance amounts or balance limiter triggers set by the Product Group shall be effective only after the next Grand Prize win.

(iv) The maximum contribution rate to the GPP shall be 46.1982% of the prize pool (23.0991% of sales).

An amount of a Party Lottery's sales shall be deducted from a Party Lottery's GPP contribution and placed in trust in one or more prize pools and prize reserve accounts held by the Product Group (hereinafter the "prize pool and reserve deduction") at any time that the SAP and Party Lottery's share of the prize reserve accounts(s) is below the amounts designated by the Product Group.

An additional amount up to twenty percent (20%) of a Party Lottery's sales shall be deducted from a Party Lottery's GPP contribution and placed in trust in the GPCFP to be held by the Product Group at a time as determined by the Product Group.

(v) The Product Group may determine to expend all or a portion of the funds in the Lotto America Game prize pools and the prize reserve accounts (except the GPP and the CPCFP):

(1) for the purpose of indemnifying the Party Lotteries in the payment of prizes to be made by the Selling Lotteries; and

(2) for the payment of prizes or special prizes in the game, limited to prize pool and prize reserve contributions from lotteries participating in the special prize promotion, subject to the approval of the Board's Finance & Audit Committee or that Committee's failure to object after given two weeks' notice of the planned action, which actions may be appealed to the full Board by the Product Group.

The GPCFP may only be expended to fund the starting minimum annuity Grand Prize.

(vi) The prize reserve shares of a Party Lottery may be adjusted with refunds to the Party Lottery from the prize reserve account(s) as may be needed to maintain the approved maximum balance and sales percentage shares of the Party Lotteries.

(vii) A Party Lottery may contribute to its sales percentage share of prize reserve accounts over time, but in the event of a draw down from the reserve account, a Party Lottery is responsible for its full sales percentage share of the account, whether or not it has been paid in full.

(viii) Any amount remaining in the Lotto America Game prize pools or prize reserve accounts when the Product Group declares the end of the game shall be returned to the lotteries participating in the prize pools and prize reserve accounts after the end of all claim periods of all Selling Lotteries, carried forward to a replacement game, or otherwise expended in a manner at the election of the individual Members of the Product Group in accordance with jurisdiction statute.

Comment: The SPP, to the extent it exists, may be used to fund a deficiency in All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes; but monies from the GPP may not be used to fund or increase an All Star Bonus Multiplier prize.

As permitted by Rule 30.5 and as required by Rule 28.2(a)(iii), on November 7, 2017, the Lotto America Game Product Group set the maximum SAP balance amount at five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00). As required by Rule 28.2(a)(iii), on November 7, 2017, the Product Group set the maximum PRA balance amount at twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000.00).

On November 7, 2017, the Group determined that the prize pool and reserve deduction:

is set to begin at zero percent (0.0 %) when the annuity Grand Prize, as determined after sales are known, is below three million dollars (\$3,000,000.00);

and is set at two percent (2.0%) when the annuity Grand Prize, as determined after sales are known, is three million dollars (\$3,000,000.00) or more, but below five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00);

and is set at four percent (4.0%) when the annuity Grand Prize, as determined after sales are known is five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00) or more.

Any amount of the prize pool and reserve deduction shall first be used to fund the SAP until it reaches its maximum established balance amount, and then shall be used to fund the prize reserve account (PRA) until it reaches its maximum established balance amounts. Any amount of the prize pool and reserve deduction not used to fund the SAP or prize reserve account shall become part of the GPP.

On November 7, 2017, the Group established that there would be no continuing funding of the GPCFP except for any amount utilized from a transfer from the Hot Lotto Group; the Group has therefore not established funding percentages, maximum balances or balance limit trigger levels for the GPCFP.

Approval of the Group is required to change the prize pool and prize reserve deduction percentages, maximum balances and balance limit trigger levels.

Comment last updated November 17, 2017.

28.3 Expected Lotto America Prize Payout Percentages.

The Grand Prize payout shall be determined on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as otherwise provided in these rules, all other prizes awarded shall be paid as single payment prizes. All prize payouts are made with the following expected prize payout percentages, which does not include any amount contributed to or held in prize reserves, although the prize payout percentages per draw may vary:

(a) The prize money allocated to the Grand Prize category shall be divided equally by the number of Lotto America Plays winning the Grand Prize; see Rule 30.1(b) and (c).

(b) **Lotto America Game Set Prize Pool (SPP) Carried Forward.** The SPP (for single payment prizes of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw.

(c) Pari-Mutuel Lotto America Game Prize Determinations.

(1)(a) If the total of the Lotto America Game Set Prizes (as multiplied by the All Star Bonus Multiplier if applicable) awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the Lotto America Game Set Prizes, then the amount needed to fund the Lotto America Game Set prizes, including All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes, awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

- (i) the amount available in the SPP and the All Star Bonus Multiplier Prize Pool; and, if needed,
- (ii) an amount from the PRA, if available, not to exceed the balance of the PRA; and, if needed,
- (iii) an amount from the SAP, if available, not to exceed the balance of that pool.

(1)(b) If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the Set Prizes, including the All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes, then the highest Set Prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest Set Prize, including All Star Bonus Multiplier Prizes, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest Set Prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, including All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes, then the next highest Set Prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all Set Prize levels, if necessary, until all Set Prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning Plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Lotto America Game and All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes will be reduced by the same percentage.

L A RULE 29 PROBABILITY OF WINNING LOTTO AMERICA PRIZES. The following table sets forth the probability of winning and the probable distribution of winners in and among each prize category, based upon the total number of possible combinations in Lotto America Game.

L A RULE 30 LOTTO AMERICA PRIZE PAYMENT.

30.1 Grand Prizes.

(a) Grand Prizes shall be paid, at the election of the player made no later than sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, with either a per-winner annuity or single lump sum payment (which may be referred to as the “cash option”). If the payment election is not made at the time of purchase and is not made by the player within sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, then the prize shall be paid as an annuity prize. An election for an annuity payment made by a player before ticket purchase or by system default or design may be changed to a cash option payment at the election of the player until the expiration of sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. The election to take the cash option payment may be made at the time of the prize claim or within sixty (60) days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. An election made after the winner becomes entitled to the prize is final and cannot be revoked, withdrawn, or otherwise changed.

(b) Shares of the Grand Prize shall be determined by dividing the funds available in the GPP equally among all winning Plays of the Grand Prize. Winner(s) who elect a cash option payment shall be paid their share(s) in a single lump sum payment. The annuitized option prize shall be determined by multiplying a winner’s share of the Grand Prize pool by a process as approved by the MUSL Board. Neither MUSL nor the Selling Lotteries shall be responsible or liable for changes in the advertised or estimated annuity prize amount and the actual amount purchased after the prize payment method is actually known to MUSL.

(c) In certain instances announced by the Product Group, the Grand Prize shall be a guaranteed amount and shall be determined pursuant to Rule 30.5.

(d) If individual shares of the GPP funds held to fund an annuity is less than \$250,000.00, the Product Group, in its sole discretion, may elect to pay the winners their share of the funds held in the GPP.

(e) All annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in thirty (30) payments with the initial payment being made in a single payment, to be followed by twenty-nine (29) payments funded by the annuity. Except as may be controlled by a Selling Lottery’s governing statute, all annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in thirty (30) graduated payments (increasing each year) by a rate as determined by the Product Group. Prize payments may be rounded down to the nearest one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). Annual payments after the initial payment shall be made by the lottery on the anniversary date or if such date falls on a non-business day, then the first business day following the anniversary date of the selection of the Grand Prize Winning Numbers.

Comment: The Product Group has set the graduated rate at five percent (5%) per year.

(f) Funds for the initial payment of an annuitized prize or the lump sum cash option prize payment shall be made available by MUSL for payment by the Selling Lottery no earlier than the fifteenth calendar day (or the next banking day if the fifteenth day is a holiday) following the drawing. If necessary, when the due date for the payment of a prize occurs before the receipt of funds in the prize pool trust sufficient to pay the prize, the transfer of funds for the payment of the full lump sum cash option amount may be delayed pending receipt of funds from the Selling Lotteries. A paying lottery may elect to make the initial payment from its own funds after validation, with notice to MUSL.

(g) If a Party Lottery purchases or holds the prize payment annuity for a prize won in that jurisdiction, that Party Lottery’s game rules, and any prize payment agreement with the prize winner, shall indicate that the prize winner has no recourse on the MUSL or any other Party Lottery for payment of that prize.

(h) In the event of the death of a lottery winner during the annuity payment period, unless prohibited by jurisdictional law, the MUSL Finance & Audit Committee, in its sole discretion excepting a discretionary review by the Product Group, upon the petition of the estate of the lottery winner (the "Estate") to the lottery of the jurisdiction in which the deceased lottery winner purchased the winning Play, and subject to federal, state, district, or territorial applicable laws, may accelerate the payment of all of the remaining lottery proceeds to the Estate. If such a determination is made, then securities and/or cash held to fund the deceased lottery winner's annuitized prize may be distributed to the Estate. The identification of the securities to fund the annuitized prize shall be at the sole discretion of the Finance & Audit Committee or the Product Group.

(i) If a Party Lottery purchases or holds the prize payment annuity for a prize won in that jurisdiction, that Party Lottery's game rules, and any prize payment agreement with the prize winner, shall indicate that the prize winner has no recourse on the MUSL or any other Party Lottery for payment of that prize.

30.2 Lotto America Prize Payments. All prizes (whether described as "cash" payment prizes or otherwise) shall be paid through the Selling Lottery that sold the winning Play(s) and at the discretion of the Selling Lottery that sold the winning Play(s) may be paid by cash, check, warrant or electronic transfer.

A Selling Lottery may begin paying low-tier prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

30.3 Lotto America Prizes Rounded. Annuitized payments of the Grand Prize or a share of the Grand Prize may be rounded to facilitate the purchase of an appropriate funding mechanism. Breakage on an annuitized Grand Prize win shall be added to the first payment to the winner or winners.

Prizes other than the Grand Prize, which, under these rules, may become single-payment, pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next drawing.

30.4 Lotto America Prize Rollover. If the Grand Prize is not won in a drawing, the prize money allocated for the Grand Prize shall roll over and be added to the GPP for the following drawing.

30.5 Funding of Guaranteed Lotto America Prizes.

30.5(a) The Product Group may offer guaranteed minimum Grand Prize amounts or minimum increases in the Grand Prize amount between drawings or make other changes in the allocation of prize money where the Product Group finds that it would be in the best interest of the game. The Product Group may delegate this responsibility to the Chair and Vice Chair of the Product Group.

Amended January 27, 2021.

30.5(b) If a minimum Grand Prize amount or a minimum increase in the Grand Prize amount between drawings is offered by the Product Group, then the Grand Prize shares shall be determined as follows:

30.5(b)(1) If there are multiple Grand Prize winners during a single drawing, each selecting the annuitized option prize, then a winner's share of the guaranteed annuitized Grand Prize shall be determined by dividing the guaranteed annuitized Grand Prize by the number of winning Plays;

30.5(b)(2) If there are multiple Grand Prize winners during a single drawing and at least one (1) of the Grand Prize winners has elected the annuitized option prize, then the MUSL Annuity Factor shall be utilized to determine the cash pool. The cost of the annuitized prize(s) will be determined at the time the annuity is purchased through a process as approved by the MUSL Board;

30.5(b)(3) If no winner of the Grand Prize during a single drawing has elected the annuitized option prize, then the amount of cash in the GPP shall be an amount equal to the guaranteed annuitized amount divided by the MUSL Annuity Factor.

30.5(c) Minimum guaranteed prizes or increases may be waived by the Product Group if the alternate funding mechanism set out in Rule 28.3(c) becomes necessary. The Product Group may delegate authority to the Chair and Vice Chair of the Group to determine the guaranteed minimum Grand Prize amounts and minimum increases in the Grand Prize amount.

Amended May 6, 2020 effective after the Drawing on June 13, 2020; January 27, 2021.

Comment: On May 6, 2020, the Product Group determined that, effective after the Drawing on June 13, 2020, any minimum starting Grand Prize and any minimum increases in the Grand Prize between drawings shall be as determined and announced by the Group Chair and Vice-Chair.

30.6 Limited to Highest Lotto America Prize Won. The holder of a winning Play may win only one (1) prize per Play in connection with the Winning Numbers drawn and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category. All liabilities for a Lotto America prize are discharged upon payment of a prize claim.

30.7 Lotto America Prize Claim Period. Prize claims shall be submitted within the period set by the Selling Lottery selling the Play. If no such claim period is established, all Grand Prize claims shall be made within one hundred eighty (180) days after the drawing date.

L A RULE 31—PLAY VALIDATION.

31.1 To be a valid Play and eligible to receive a prize, a Play's ticket or ticketless transaction shall satisfy all the requirements established by a Party Lottery for validation of winning Plays sold through its computer gaming system and any other validation requirements adopted by the Product Group, the MUSL Board, and published as the Confidential MUSL Minimum Game Security Standards. The MUSL and the Party Lotteries shall not be responsible for tickets or ticketless transactions that are altered in any manner.

31.2 Under no circumstances will a claim be paid for any prize without an official Lotto America ticket (or validly registered ticketless transaction) matching all game Play, serial number and other validation data residing in the selling Party Lottery's computer gaming system and unless otherwise permitted by the selling Party Lottery such ticket (or validly registered ticketless transaction) shall be the only valid proof of the wager placed and the only valid receipt for claiming or redeeming such prize.

31.3 In addition to the above, in order to be deemed a valid, winning Play, unless the Play is a validly registered ticketless transaction, all of the following conditions must be met:

- (a) The validation data must be present in its entirety and must correspond, using the computer validation file, to the number selections printed on the ticket for the drawing date(s) printed on the ticket;
- (b) The ticket must be intact;
- (c) The ticket must not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted, or tampered with in any manner;
- (d) The ticket must not be counterfeit or an exact duplicate of another winning ticket;
- (e) The ticket must have been issued by an authorized sales agent, or retailer of the selling Party Lottery and printed on paper in compliance with MUSL Rule 2;
- (f) The ticket must not have been stolen, to the knowledge of the Party Lottery;
- (g) The Play data must have been recorded on the computer gaming system prior to the drawing and the Play data must match this computer record in every respect. In the event of a contradiction between information as printed on the ticket and as accepted by the Party Lottery's computer gaming system, the wager accepted by the Party Lottery's computer gaming system shall be the valid wager;
- (h) The player or computer pick number selections, validation data and the drawing date(s) of an apparent winning Play must appear on the official file of winning Plays, and a Play with that exact data must not have been previously paid;
- (i) The play must not be misregistered, and the Play's ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error to an extent that it cannot be processed by the Party Lottery that issued the Play;
- (j) The Play must pass all confidential security checks of the Party Lottery that issued the Play;
- (k) In submitting a Play for validation, the claimant agrees to abide by applicable laws, all rules and regulations, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Director of the Party Lottery that issued the Play;
- (l) There must not be any other breach of these Rules in relation to the Play that, in the opinion of the Director of the Party Lottery that issued the Play, justifies invalidation;
- (m) The Play must be submitted to the Party Lottery that issued it;
- (n) Ticketless transaction Plays must meet the validation requirements of the Party Lottery that issued the Play.

Amended June 16, 2022.

31.4 A Play submitted for validation that fails any of the preceding validation conditions shall be considered void, subject to the following determinations:

(a) In all cases of doubt, the determination of the Party Lottery that sold the Play, shall be final and binding; however, the Party Lottery may, at its option, replace an invalid Play with a Play of equivalent sales price;

(b) In the event a defective ticket is purchased or in the event the Party Lottery determines to adjust an error, the Claimant's sole and exclusive remedy shall be the replacement of such defective or erroneous ticket(s) with a Play of equivalent sales price;

(c) In the event a Play is not paid by a Party Lottery and a dispute occurs as to whether the Play is a winning Play, the Party Lottery may, at its option, replace the Play as provided in paragraph (a) of this subsection. This shall be the sole and exclusive remedy of the Claimant unless the laws or regulations governing the Party Lottery provide for further administrative review.

L A RULE 32— PLAY RESPONSIBILITY.

32.1 Prize Claims. Prize claim procedures shall be governed by the rules of the Selling Lottery. The MUSL and the Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for prizes that are not claimed following the proper procedures as determined by the selling lottery.

32.2 Reserved.

32.3 Stolen Tickets. The Product Group, the MUSL and the Party Lotteries shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Plays.

32.4 Ticketless Transactions. A Ticketless Transaction Play is only valid when registered with the lottery in accordance with lottery rules, these Rules, and the MUSL Rules. The person or, if permitted by the lottery rules, the persons registering the Play shall be the owner of the Ticketless Transaction Play. A receipt for a Ticketless Transaction Play has no value and is not evidence of a Play.

Amended June 16, 2022.

32.5 Agent or Retailer Errors. The Party Lotteries shall not be responsible to a prize claimant for Plays redeemed in error by a selling agent or retailer.

Amended January 27, 2021.

32.6 Audited Results. Winners are determined by the numbers drawn and certified by the independent auditor responsible for auditing the draw. MUSL and the Party Lotteries are not responsible for winning numbers reported in error.

Amended January 27, 2021.

L A RULE 33—INELIGIBLE PLAYERS.

33.1 A Play or share for a MUSL game issued by the MUSL or any of its Party Lotteries shall not be purchased by, and a prize won by any such Play or share shall not be paid to:

- (a) a MUSL employee, officer, or director;
- (b) a contractor or consultant under agreement with the MUSL to review the MUSL audit and security procedures;
- (c) an employee of an independent accounting firm under contract with MUSL to observe drawings or site operations and actually assigned to the MUSL account and all partners, shareholders, or owners in the local office of the firm; or
- (d) an immediate family member (parent, stepparent, child, stepchild, spouse, or sibling) of an individual described in subsections (a), (b), and (c) and residing in the same household.

33.2 Those persons designated by a Selling Lottery's law as ineligible to play its games shall also be ineligible to play the Lotto America game in that Selling Lottery's jurisdiction.

L A RULE 34—APPLICABLE LAW.

In purchasing a Play, or attempting to claim a prize, purchasers and prize claimants agree to comply with and abide by all applicable laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Selling Lottery where the Play was purchased, and by directives and determinations of the director of that Party Lottery.

A prize claimant agrees, as its sole and exclusive remedy that claims arising out of a Lotto America Play can only be pursued against the Selling Lottery which issued the Play. Litigation, if any, shall only be maintained within the jurisdiction in which the Lotto America Play was purchased and only against the Selling Lottery that issued the Play. No claim shall be made against any other Participating Lottery or against the MUSL

Nothing in these Rules shall be construed as a waiver of any defense or claim the Selling Lottery which issued the Play, any other Participating Lottery or MUSL may have in any litigation, including in the event a player or prize claimant pursues litigation against the Selling Lottery, any other Participating Lottery or MUSL, or their respective officers, directors or employees.

All decisions made by a Selling Lottery, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof and the interpretation of Lotto America Rules, shall be final and binding on all Play purchasers and on every person making a prize claim in respect thereof, but only in the jurisdiction where the Lotto America Play was issued.

Unless the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Lottery which issued the Play provide otherwise, no prize shall be paid upon a Play purchased, claimed or sold in violation of these Rules or the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Selling Lottery; any such prize claimed but unpaid shall constitute an unclaimed prize under these Rules and the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Selling Lottery.

PART III –LOTTO AMERICA SPECIAL GAME RULES: LOTTO AMERICA ALL STAR BONUS® MULTIPLIER PROMOTION

Adopted August 10, 2017; Amended November 7, 2017; June 24, 2021

L A RULE A — PROMOTION DESCRIPTION.

The Lotto America All Star Bonus® Multiplier Option is a limited extension of the Lotto America Game and is conducted in accordance with the Lotto America Game Rules and other lottery rules applicable to the Lotto America Game except as may be amended herein. The Promotion will begin at a time announced by the Member Lottery and will continue until discontinued by the lottery. The Promotion will offer to the owners of a qualifying Play a chance to multiply the amount of any of the eight lump sum Set Prizes (the lump sum prizes normally paying \$2.00 to \$20,000.00) won in a drawing held during the Promotion. The Grand Prize is not a Set Prize and will not be multiplied. Participating lotteries may require purchase of the All Star Bonus Promotion when a player purchases a Lotto America Play.

Amended June 24, 2021.

L A RULE B — QUALIFYING PLAY.

A qualifying Play is any single Lotto America Game Play for which the player pays an extra dollar for the All Star Bonus Multiplier option and that is recorded at the Member Lottery's computer gaming system as a qualifying All Star Bonus Multiplier Play.

L A RULE C — PRIZES TO BE MULTIPLIED.

Except as provided in these rules, a qualifying Play which wins one of the Set Prizes will be multiplied by the number selected, either two, three, four or five (2, 3, 4 or 5), in a separate random All Star Bonus Multiplier drawing announced by the Product Group.

L A RULE D — LOTTO AMERICA ALL STAR BONUS DRAWINGS.

MUSL will conduct a separate random "All Star Bonus" drawing and announce the results. During each 2-5X Multiplier drawing a single number (2, 3, 4 or 5) shall be drawn. The Lotto America Game Group may modify the multiplier features for special promotions from time to time.

L A RULE E — LOTTO AMERICA ALL STAR BONUS MULTIPLIER PRIZE POOL.

E(1) Lotto America All Star Bonus Multiplier Prize Pool.

(a) The All Star Bonus Multiplier Prize Pool (MPP) is hereby created, and which is used to fund All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes. The MPP shall hold the temporary balances that may result from having fewer than expected winners in All Star Bonus Multiplier. The source of the MPP is the Party Lottery's weekly prize contributions less actual All Star Bonus Multiplier Prize liability.

(b) In total, fifty percent (50%) of each draw's sales shall be collected for the payment of prizes:

(1) The expected payout for all prize categories shall consist of up to forty-nine and five hundred ninety-eight thousandths percent (49.598%) of each drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket.

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(2) An additional four-hundred and two thousandths percent (0.402%) of each drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily mandated tax of a Selling Lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket, may be collected and placed in trust in the MPP, for the purpose of paying All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes.

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(c) The prize payout percentage per draw may vary. The MPP shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw and held in the MPP.

E(2) End of Game.

Any amounts remaining in the MPP when the Product Group declares the end of this game shall be returned to the lotteries participating in the pool after the end of all claim periods of all Party Lotteries, carried forward to a replacement game, or otherwise expended in a manner as directed by the individual Members of the Product Group in accordance with jurisdiction law.

E(3) Expected Prize Payout. Except as provided in these rules, all prizes awarded shall be paid as lump sum set prizes. Instead of the Lotto America Game set prize amounts, qualifying All Star Bonus Multiplier Plays will pay the amounts shown:

In certain rare instances, the Lotto America Game set prize amount may be less than the amount shown. In such case, the eight (8) lowest Power Play prizes will be changed to an amount announced after the draw. For example, if the Match 4+1 Lotto America set prize amount of

\$1,000.00 becomes \$500.00 under the rules of the Lotto America game and a 5x multiplier is selected, then an All Star Bonus player winning that prize amount would win \$2,500.00.

L A RULE F — PROBABILITY OF PRIZE INCREASE.

The following table sets forth the probability of the various All Star Bonus Multiplier numbers being drawn during a single 2X-5X Multiplier drawing. The Group may elect to run limited promotions that may modify the multiplier features.

L A RULE G — LIMITATIONS ON PAYMENT OF ALL STAR BONUS PRIZES.

G(1) Pari-Mutuel Prizes—All Prize Amounts.

G(1)(a) If the total of the original Lotto America Game set prizes and the multiplied All Star Bonus Multiplier set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pools allocated to the set prizes and All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes, then the amount needed to fund the Set Prizes (including the All Star Bonus Multiplier prize amounts) awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

- (i) the amount available in the SPP allocated to the set prizes and the MPP, if any;
- (ii) an amount from the PRA up to, if available, not to exceed the balance of the PRA; and,
- (iii) an amount from the SAP, if available, not to exceed the balance of that pool.

G(2)(b) If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the Set Prizes awarded (including All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes), then the highest Set Prize (including the All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes) shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest Set Prize (including the All Star Bonus Multiplier Prizes) when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest Set Prize (including the All Star Bonus Multiplier Prizes) and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining Set Prizes awarded, then the next highest Set Prize (including the All Star Bonus Multiplier prize) shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all Set Prize levels, if necessary, until all Set Prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning Plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Lotto America Game and All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes will be reduced by the same percentage

Comment: Monies from the Grand Prize Pool may not be used to fund Set Prizes or All Star Bonus Multiplier prize payments.

L A RULE H – PRIZE PAYMENT.

H(1) Prize Payments. All All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes shall be paid in one lump sum through the Member Lottery that sold the winning Play(s). A Member Lottery may begin paying All Star Bonus Multiplier prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

H(2) Prizes Rounded. Prizes that, under these rules, may become pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the MPP for the next drawing.

EXHIBIT D

MULTI-STATE LOTTERY ASSOCIATION MILLIONAIRE FOR LIFE GROUP RULES (as of November 18, 2025)

Game Rules*

Lotteries offering the Millionaire for Life multi-jurisdictional lottery game agreed to jointly operate the game pursuant to the Game Participation Agreement ("Agreement") and such other related procedures agreed to by the Selling Lotteries. Participating states have joined the game since it was established and may change from time to time.

OVERVIEW – 5/58 + 1/5

The Millionaire for Life game is a draw-based lottery game with a set Grand Prize and eight set prize levels. A Winning Play will match the randomly selected five (5) of fifty-eight (58) numbers from the First Set of Numbers, and one (1) of five (5) numbers from the Second Set of Numbers.

A sample Play could be as follows:

01-02-21-04-30-04

(First Set of Numbers: 01-02-21-04-30; Second Set of Numbers: 04)

The Prize Structure offers nine (9) ways to win up to \$1,000,000 a year for life**.

The top two prizes are offered as a lifetime annuity payment, **or** as a lump sum cash payment. Players will make an **irrevocable** choice of an annuity, or a lump sum cash payment when claiming their prize.

- Match 5 + 1 prize will be an annuity prize of \$1,000,000 a year for life (or the cash value of \$18,000,000 in a one-time lump sum cash payment)
- Match 5 + 0 prize will be an annuity prize of \$100,000 a year for life (or the cash value of \$2,200,000 in a one-time lump sum cash payment)

The remaining seven prize tiers are set cash prizes.

- Match 4 + 1 prize will be a one-time cash payment of \$7,500
- Match 4 + 0 prize will be a one-time cash payment of \$500
- Match 3 + 1 prize will be a one-time cash payment of \$250
- Match 3 + 0 prize will be a one-time cash payment of \$50
- Match 2 + 1 prize will be a one-time cash payment of \$25
- Match 2 + 0 prize will be a one-time cash payment of \$8
- Match 1 + 1 prize will be a one-time cash payment of \$8

Drawings will be held seven (7) days per week after 10:15 P.M. Central Time. The game play sales will close for each draw no later than 9:15 P.M. Central Time. The winning numbers will be selected randomly using Digital Draw Systems.

The Digital Draw System will randomly select five (5) numbers of fifty-eight (58) for the First Set of Numbers; and one (1) number of five (5) for the Second Set of Numbers.

GAME RULES

1. DEFINITIONS

Agent or Retailer – means a person or an Entity authorized by a Lottery offering the game to sell lottery Plays.

Annuity - means the Millionaire for Life Grand Prize or Match 5 Prize paid in annual installments for the Annuitant's Measuring Life.

Annuitant – means the person(s) or Entity who receives the benefits of an Annuity resulting from a Winning Ticket for the Grand Prize or Match 5 Prize paid under the Annuity Option.

Central or Computer Gaming System (CGS) – means a computer system(s) required to allow the processing, storage, and reporting of gaming transactions with all intended redundancy, which can include multiple sites and multiple vendors. Systems required for processing of transactions through non-traditional methods (electronic/web play, mobile play, plays through devices that are not Terminals, etc.) are part of the CGS. Terminals and retailer provided point of sale devices such as cash registers or player provided point of sale devices such as smartphones are not part of the CGS.

Claimant - means any person or Entity submitting a claim form within the required time period to collect a Prize for an official Millionaire for Life Ticket. A Claimant may be the Purchaser, the person or Entity named on a signed official Millionaire for Life Ticket, the bearer of an unsigned official Millionaire for Life Ticket, or any other person or Entity who may seek entitlement to a Millionaire for Life Prize payment in accordance with the Millionaire for Life Rules.

Claim Limitation Period or Expiration Period - means the requirement that a Winning Ticket Prize must be claimed within the time period as established by the Director of the lottery that sold the Play. If no time period has been set, the claim period is 180 days of the valid Drawing date for which it was purchased.

Computer Pick – means a Game feature that allows the random selection of game play number indicia by the authorized retailer computer (or as otherwise permitted by a Selling Lottery) that appears on a Ticket or Ticketless Transaction and is used as the First Set of Numbers and Second Set of Numbers by a Player.

Courier – means a non-Selling Lottery third-party entity or person, which is operating in a state in which the Courier is not legally prohibited to operate, who purchases a Millionaire for Life Play or Plays on behalf of a Player and delivers the ticket exhibiting the Play or Plays to the Player within that state.

Deferred Annuity Portion – means the portion of the Annuity Option paid once the Prizewinner exceeds the Guaranteed Portion of the Annuity. Also see definition of Guaranteed Annuity Portion of these Game Rules.

Director - means the person who has primary responsibilities for managing the participating lottery. Titles may include, but are not limited to Executive Director, Director, Chief Executive Officer, and Interim Director.

Drawing - means a formal process of randomly selecting the Winning Numbers in accordance with the Drawing Procedures.

Entity – means any Claimant other than a natural person who claims a Grand Prize or Second Level Prize. An Entity can only be paid a lump sum cash Prize or the minimum twenty (20) year Annuity; see definition of Measuring Life.

First Set of Numbers means the first set of numbers from one (1) to fifty-eight (58).

Fixed or Set Prizes - means a set amount awarded in the Game unless a Liability Limit is reached.

Future Play - means a Game feature which allows a Player to select numbers for one or more future Drawing(s) scheduled after the next most immediate Drawing. A Future Play can be for up to ninety (90) consecutive Drawings on a single Play Slip or Bet Slip, except for ticketless transactions which can be for up to 365 Drawings if a Selling Lottery has a process in place to allow Players to make changes to their Play purchases in the event of a game change.

Game – means the Millionaire for Life lottery game.

Game Administrator – means the Multi-State Lottery Association (MUSL). The Game Administrator is not a Lottery, or part of the Selling Lotteries.

Grand Prize – means the Prize amount awarded for matching five (5) out of fifty-eight (58) numbers in the First Set of Numbers, and one (1) out of five (5) numbers in the Second Set of Numbers. If more than one Play from all Selling Lotteries wins the Grand Prize, the Grand Prize shall be divided among the persons holding such Plays, as provided in these Game Rules.

Guaranteed Annuity Portion – means the portion of the Annuity Option where the Prizewinner is guaranteed Annuity payments for the first twenty (20) years of the Claimant's Measuring Life as may be defined in these Game Rules.

Internal Control Systems or ICS means a system maintained by a Lottery that records and reports game sales, prize wins, and other information as required by the Lotteries or Game Administrator.

Liability Limit – means a pre-established threshold, as determined and announced by the Selling Lotteries before sales commence for a Drawing to which the threshold applies. The Liability Limit will be posted on the Selling Lotteries' websites

Lottery or Lotteries; Selling Lottery or Selling Lotteries – means the Lottery or Lotteries that operate the Millionaire for Life Game.

Official Game Rules – means the official game rules adopted by each Lottery that is offering the Millionaire for Life Game. Individual lottery game rules will not conflict with these Game rules.

Measuring Life or Life – means the period over which a Grand Prize or Second Level Prize is paid out under the Annuity Option. For each Winning Ticket, the Measuring Life shall be the natural life of the individual who the Lottery determines to be a valid Prizewinner. However, for the following Claimants, the Measuring Life shall be fixed at twenty (20) years:

- A legal Entity other than an individual.
- More than one natural person who claims a Prize on the same Ticket.
- If allowed by a Selling Lottery, a minor under the age of 18, or any group including a minor under the age of 18.

Millionaire for Life Sales Cut-off – means the time after which Lottery Plays will not be accepted for that Drawing. The Sales Cut-Off occurs Monday through Sunday no later than sixty (60) minutes prior to each Millionaire for Life Drawing.

Multi-Draw – means a Game feature which allows a Player to select Plays for up to ninety (90) consecutive Drawings on one (1) or more Tickets, starting with the next scheduled Drawing. The cost of a Multi-Draw Ticket depends on the number of Draws and the number of Plays that are selected.

Pari-Mutuel – means the appropriate Prize is divided by the number of Winning Plays for a Prize Level.

Play or Wager – means for each play a Player selects five (5) different numbers from the First Set of Numbers and one (1) additional number from the Second Set of Numbers. The additional number from the Second Set of Numbers may be the same number as one of the five numbers a Player selects from the First Set of Numbers. A Player may select numbers by communicating the six (6) numbers to a lottery Retailer or Courier; by marking five (5) numbered spaces in the First Set of Numbers and one (1) numbered space in the Second Set of Numbers on a Millionaire for Life Play Slip and submitting it to a Retailer; or by requesting a Computer Pick from a Retailer. Additionally, the Lottery may authorize other means to place a Wager, such as through a Subscription or other type of Ticketless Transaction. The Retailer shall then issue a Ticket containing the

selected set or sets of numbers and the Prize payment option, each of which constitutes a Play. Each Play costs \$5.00, or as otherwise determined by all Selling Lotteries.

Play Slip/Bet Slip – means an optically readable card on paper stock issued by the Lottery that a Player uses to make a Millionaire for Life Play or Plays.

Player or Purchaser – means a person at least eighteen (18) years of age, who purchases a Millionaire for Life Ticket.

Plays per Ticket – means the number of Plays printed on a single Ticket. Selling lotteries will determine how many Plays can be provided on a Ticket.

Prize or Prizes – means the Prize levels as defined in these Game Rules.

Prize Pools – means the number of dollars available to fund all Prizes. The Prize Pool for any Drawing is expected to be 55% of sales.

Prize Level – means the Prizes as defined in these and the Lottery's Game Rules.

Prizewinner – means a Player who is entitled, as a result of successful Claimant verification and successful Play/Ticket validation, to receive a Prize under the rules of this Game.

Registered Play – means a wager where the Play is owned by a specifically identified Player through a means acceptable to the Selling Lottery, and which is recorded on the Selling Lottery's central gaming system and internal control system.

Second Level or Match 5 Prize means the Prize amount awarded for matching 5 out of 58 numbers in the First Set of Numbers and none out of five (5) numbers in the Second Set of Numbers, subject to limitations set out below.

Second Set of Numbers means the second set of numbers from one (1) to five (5). A number in the Second Set of Numbers may be the same as one (1) through five (5) selected from fifty-eight (58) in the First Set of Numbers.

Subscription or Subscription Play means an extended, Multi-Draw purchase option wherein the same set(s) of numbers may be placed for a specified number of consecutive draws effective on a future prescribed date. If a purchased set of numbers on a Subscription matches the randomly selected Winning Numbers in the applicable Drawing for either the Grand Prize or Second Prize, a claim form for the Subscription Play must still be presented, in writing, to the Lottery that sold the Subscription.

Terminal – means a device that is authorized by the Lottery to interact with the Lottery's central gaming system to issue Lottery Tickets and to enter, receive and process Lottery transactions that may include issuing Tickets, validating Tickets and transmitting reports. This includes Player Self-Service Terminals (PSST) for the purchase of Millionaire for Life Tickets. When using a PSST, the Player may make selections by inserting a completed Play or Bet Slip into the PSST's optical mark reader, or by manually entering the selections on the PSST touch screen or selecting a Computer Pick option. Note: some PSST's may not support all of the differing methods of number selection.

Ticket – means an official Millionaire for Life Game Ticket, produced on official paper stock by a Retailer in an authorized manner, bearing Player or computer selected numbers, Game name, Drawing date, amount of Wager, and validation data which contain the Play or Plays selected by the Player, either manually or by Computer Pick.

Ticketless Transaction – means any Registered Play that is not printed on paper that meets the anti-counterfeiting requirements required by the Selling Lotteries. Examples of Ticketless Transactions include internet, subscription, and other types of Registered Plays.

Wager – See “Play”.

Winning Numbers – means the five (5) one- (1) or two- (2) digit numbers from the First Set of Numbers, and a one (1) digit number from five (5) in the Second Set of Numbers, randomly selected during a Millionaire for Life Drawing, that shall be used to determine the Winning Play.

Winning Play(s) – means the Play(s) that matches the Winning Numbers.

Winning Ticket – means a Ticket that has passed all Lottery validation and security requirements and that contains a set of numbers entitling Claimant to a Prize. Each Winning Ticket must meet all Play validation requirements as established by the Lottery that sold the Play.

Unclaimed Prize – means a Prize that has not been formally claimed or redeemed by a Claimant within the specified claim period as set forth in these and/or the game rules as provided by the Selling Lottery. In no event shall any Prize that remains unclaimed after the period set by these Game rules become or constitute unclaimed property or abandoned property.

2. GAME PLAY

a. To play Millionaire for Life, a Player selects, or has the Terminal randomly assign (Computer Pick) five (5) numbers from the First Set of Numbers which includes a range of consecutive numbers from one (1) to fifty-eight (58) and one (1) number from the Second Set of Numbers which includes a range of consecutive numbers from one (1) to five (5). The additional number selected from the Second Set of Numbers may be the same number as one of the five (5) numbers a Player selects from the First Set of Numbers, or has the Terminal randomly assign (Computer Pick) from the First Set of Numbers.

Play selections of less than or more than six (6) numbers will be impermissible and void.

All Lottery Tickets issued for this Game shall be clearly identified with the name of the Game and the date or dates of the Drawing(s) for which they apply.

b. The price of a single Play shall be \$5.00, including all applicable taxes that a Selling Lottery may be required to collect. The Director of a Selling Lottery may establish a discount for Players for limited promotional purposes from time to time. A Selling Lottery that plans any promotion, discount, free Play, etc. which is to be offered for more than ninety (90) days shall notify the Game Administrator prior to the start of the event(s). The Game Administrator will advise all Selling Lotteries of the date and overview of the promotion, discount, free Play offer, etc.

c. Millionaire for Life Plays may not be canceled once recorded on the Selling Lottery's central gaming system.

d. Millionaire for Life Tickets will be sold every day during the normal business hours of the Retailers authorized to sell said Tickets, or other means authorized by the Lottery. The sale period for any given Millionaire for Life Lottery Drawing will terminate on the date of the Drawing no later than 9:15 P.M. Central Time.

e. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Purchaser to verify the accuracy and readability of the information printed on the Millionaire for Life Ticket at the time of purchase. After the Purchaser leaves a Retailer location, neither a Retailer nor the Lottery shall be liable for any errors in the accuracy and readability of a Ticket occurring for any reason.

- f.** Millionaire for Life Play Slips shall be available at no cost to the Player. Play Slips shall have no pecuniary or Prize value and shall not constitute evidence of purchase or number selections.
- g.** Replay Feature. Players may request that a Retailer utilize the barcodes of already purchased Millionaire for Life Tickets to duplicate another Ticket of the same price and with the same number selections and options.
- h.** The Purchaser must sign a written Prize payout election form and make an irrevocable selection of the Cash Option, or the Annuity Option sixty (60) days from the date the Purchaser is entitled to the Prize. Selling Lotteries may adopt a different process so long as the Purchaser indicates an irrevocable decision by signature.
- i.** The Selling Lotteries reserve the right to make changes to the Millionaire for Life game, including the quantity of the First Set of Numbers and/or the Second Set of Numbers. Any changes in the Millionaire for Life Game shall be determined by the Selling Lotteries and shall be publicly announced by the Selling Lottery in advance of the effective date.
- j.** Sales cut-off (game closure) will be no later than 9:15 P.M. Central Time.

3. DRAWINGS

- a.** The Drawing to select the Winning Numbers shall be conducted at the studios of the Multi-State Lottery Association at approximately 10:15 P.M. Central Time. Millionaire for Life Drawings shall be conducted seven (7) days per week, Monday through Sunday, at the designated time. However, the day, time or location of Millionaire for Life Drawings may be modified as determined by all Lotteries offering the Millionaire for Life Game, and will be publicly announced by the Lotteries. All Millionaire for Life Drawings will be open to the public and shall be witnessed by an Independent Certified Public Accounting Firm.
- b.** Millionaire for Life Drawings shall randomly generate, by mechanical means, Millionaire for Life Winning Numbers, pursuant to the controls and methods defined by the Selling Lotteries.
- c.** Official results of the Drawings, even though announced, are located in the draw files at the offices of the Game Administrator. Neither the Game Administrator nor the Selling Lotteries shall be liable for media misprints or incorrectly announced Winning Numbers on any website(s) and social media.

4. CLAIMS AND VALIDATIONS

- a.** Claims and validations will be performed by the Lottery that sold the Winning Ticket.
- b.** The Play must have been issued on a Ticket by an authorized Retailer on official paper stock of the Lottery or be a Ticketless Transaction (registered or Subscription Play) as authorized by a Lottery.
- c.** The Winning Play must have been recorded on the central gaming system prior to the Drawing and must match exactly with the official file of Winning Tickets and must not have been previously paid. In the event of a contradiction between information as printed on the Ticket and as accepted by the Lottery central gaming system, the Wager accepted by the Lottery central gaming system shall be the valid Wager.
- d.** Tickets are void if:
 - i.** Stolen, unissued, unreadable, mutilated, altered, reconstituted, counterfeit in whole or in part, miscut, defective, tampered with, printed or produced in error, or blank or partially blank; or

- ii. Printing is irregular; or
 - iii. Apparent or asserted symbols are not confirmed by validation number; or
 - iv. The Ticket fails any of the Lottery's other validation tests.
- e. A Millionaire for Life Play matching all Game play, serial number, and other validation data recorded in the Lottery's computer gaming system shall be the only valid proof of a Wager placed and the only valid receipt for claiming or redeeming any Prize.
- f. Federal and state tax withholding shall be determined by the Lottery in the State in which the Play was purchased.
- g. The Claim Limitation period for Millionaire for Life Prizes is determined by the Lottery that sold the Play. If none has been set, the claim period shall be 180 days from the date of the Drawing.
- h. Lottery laws in the State in which the Play was purchased govern whether a Claimant can remain anonymous.

5. UNCLAIMED GRAND PRIZES.

- a. Each Selling Lottery will set a Jackpot Prize claim period. If the Selling Lottery has not set a Prize claim period, the Prize claim period shall be 180 days from the date of the applicable Drawing. Claims, including Registered Plays/Ticketless Transactions must follow the **PLAY VALIDATION** provisions below prior to an award of the Jackpot Prize.
- b. If the Grand Prize goes Unclaimed, all funds collected by the Game Administrator to pay a Grand Prize shall be returned to the Selling Lotteries in proportion to sales from each Selling Lottery. An unclaimed Grand Prize is not considered unclaimed property.

6. PRIZE PAYMENTS.

- a. Prize Claim Requests and Claim Period. All Prize claims, including purchases made by Ticketless Transactions must be submitted in writing to the Selling Lottery selling the Play within the claim period required by the that Selling Lottery. If no claim period has been set in that jurisdiction, the claim period is 180 days from the date of purchase.
- b. Process for Prize Payments. If a written claim has been made within the applicable claim period, and all validation requirements established by these and the Selling Lottery have been met, Prizes will be paid through the Selling Lottery that sold the winning Play(s) by means approved by that Selling Lottery. Selling Lotteries shall calculate applicable taxes and debt setoffs.

7. INELIGIBLE PLAYERS.

- a. Plays shall not be purchased, and a Prize won by any Play either in whole or in part, shall not be paid to any of the following persons:
- i. A Selling Lottery employee, officer, director, board member or commissioner; and,
 - ii. Employees of a Selling Lottery's Central gaming system vendor(s), as each Selling Lottery may designate; and,
 - iii. An employee of the Multi-State Lottery Association; and,

- iv. Other persons as each Selling Lottery may designate; and,
- v. Any person residing in the same household of an individual described in subsections (i), (ii), (iii) or (iv); and,
- vi. Persons designated as ineligible to play the Millionaire for Life Game in any Selling Lottery jurisdiction shall be also ineligible to play the Millionaire for Life Game in all other Selling Lottery jurisdictions.

8. PLAY VALIDATION REQUIREMENTS.

- a. To be a valid Play and eligible to receive a Prize, a Player's Ticket or a Ticketless Transaction shall satisfy all the requirements established by a Selling Lottery for validation of Plays sold through its central gaming system, any other validation requirements adopted by the Selling Lotteries, and the Game Administrator's security requirements. The Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for Tickets or Ticketless Transactions that are altered in any manner.
- b. Except as may be permitted by the Selling Lottery, under no circumstances will any Prize be paid without an official Ticket matching all Wager requirements, serial number, and other validations required by the Official Game Rules, and additional validation data residing in the Selling Lottery's central gaming system or a properly registered Ticketless Transaction. Such Ticket, or properly registered Ticketless Transaction shall be the only valid proof of the Wager placed and the only valid receipt for claiming or redeeming such Prize.
- c. In addition to the above, to be deemed a valid, Winning Play, unless the Play is a properly registered Ticketless Transaction all the following conditions must be met:
 - i. The validation data must be present in its entirety and must correspond, using the computer validation file, to the number selections printed on the Winning Play displayed on a Ticket for the date of the applicable official Drawing;
 - ii. The Play numbers, validation data and the purchase date of an apparent Winning Play must appear on the official file of Winning Plays, and a Play with that exact data must not have been previously paid;
 - iii. The Play must not be misregistered, or a voided Ticket pursuant to 4d. above, and the Play's Ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error to an extent that it cannot be processed by the Selling Lottery that issued the Play;
 - iv. The Ticket must have been issued by an authorized Agent, Retailer, or Courier of the Selling Lottery and printed on paper in compliance with MUSL Rule 2;
 - v. In submitting a Play for validation, the Claimant agrees to abide by applicable laws, all rules and regulations, instructions, conditions, and final decisions of the Director of the Selling Lottery that issued the Play;
 - vi. There must not be any other breach of these Game Rules in relation to the Play that, in the opinion of the Director of the Selling Lottery that issued the Play, justifies invalidation;
 - vii. The Play must be submitted to the Selling Lottery that issued it; and
 - viii. Ticketless Transactions must meet the validation requirements of the Selling Lottery that issued the Play.

d. In the event a Play does not meet the Play Validation Requirements and is not paid by a Selling Lottery, and a dispute occurs as to whether the Play is a Winning Play at any Prize Level, the Selling Lottery may, at its option, replace the Play. Replacement of the Play shall be the sole and exclusive remedy of the Player unless the laws or regulations governing the Selling Lottery provide for further administrative review. In all cases, the determination of the Selling Lottery shall be final and binding.

9. RETURNED PLAYS / PLAY RESPONSIBILITY.

a. Prize claim and validation procedures shall be governed by the rules of the Selling Lottery. The Game Administrator and the Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for Prizes that are not claimed following the proper procedures as determined by the Selling Lottery.

b. The Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Tickets.

c. The Selling Lotteries shall not be responsible to a Prize Claimant for Plays redeemed in error by a selling Agent, sales Agent, Retailer, or Courier.

d. A Ticketless Transaction Play is only valid when registered with the Selling Lottery in accordance With the Selling Lottery rules, these Rules and the MUSL Rules. The person or, if permitted by the Selling Lottery rules, the persons registering the Play shall be the owner of the Ticketless Transaction Play. A receipt for a Ticketless Transaction Play has no value and is not evidence of a Play.

e. A Selling Lottery may develop a method of compensating Players or Retailers, Agents, or Couriers For Plays that are misprinted, illegible, or printed in error, and any Future Play affected by changes in Game features, including Game cancellations.

10. APPLICABLE LAW.

a. In purchasing a Play, or attempting to claim a Prize, Purchasers and Prize Claimants agree to comply with and abide by all applicable laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Selling Lottery where the Play was purchased, and by directives and determinations of the Director of that Selling Lottery.

b. A Prize Claimant agrees, as its sole and exclusive remedy that Claims arising out of a Play can only be pursued against the Selling Lottery that issued the Play. Litigation, if any, shall only be maintained within the jurisdiction in which the Play was purchased and only against the Selling Lottery that issued the Play. No claim shall be made against any other Selling Lottery or against the Game Administrator.

c. The Selling Lotteries agree to place language on any Lottery Game Play Slips or other Lottery Game literature and on Selling Lotteries websites and i-gaming platforms, if reasonably possible, that all claims arising out of the Millionaire for Life Game are limited as set forth in this section and the specific rules adopted by the Selling Lottery.

d. Nothing in these Rules shall be construed as a waiver of any defense or claim the Selling Lottery which issued the Play, any other Selling Lottery, or the Game Administrator may have in any litigation, including in the event a Player or Prize Claimant pursues litigation against the Selling Lottery, any other Selling Lottery or the Game Administrator, or their respective officers, directors, or employees.

e. All decisions made by a Selling Lottery, including the declaration of Prizes and the payment thereof

and the interpretation of the Millionaire for Life Game rules shall be final and binding on all Play Purchasers and on every person making a Prize claim in respect thereof in the jurisdiction where the Play was issued.

f. Unless the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of the Lottery which issued the Play provide otherwise, no Prize shall be paid upon a Play purchased, claimed or sold in violation of these Rules or the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Selling Lottery; any such Prize claimed but unpaid shall constitute an Unclaimed Prize under these Rules and the laws, rules, regulations, procedures, and decisions of that Selling Lottery.

11. ADVERTISING.

a. No Selling Lottery may offer, or state that its jurisdiction offers better odds than another jurisdiction selling the Game, or a Grand Prize estimate that is different than the one provided by MUSL.

12. PROMOTIONS.

a. Selling Lotteries that offer the Millionaire for Life Game Plays as part of an authorized discount, promotion, or rebate shall contribute the full amount assessed for a Play sold at the uniform price to the Grand Prize Pool. Selling Lotteries members shall be advised of any promotions, discounts, and/or rebates that last more than ninety (90) days.

13. LIABILITY OF THE LOTTERY

a. The liability of the Lottery for Tickets printed or produced in error or for defective Tickets shall be limited to the replacement of the defective Ticket with another un-played Ticket or reimbursement of the holder at the retail sale price of the Ticket.

b. All winners, Tickets, and transactions are subject to the Lottery rules and regulations and state law.

c. If the Millionaire for Life Game is no longer offered by a Lottery, state law will govern the process by which the Lottery will use any amounts it may have in a Prize reserve account.

d. Except as herein provided, all rules and regulations of the Lottery shall govern the operation of the Millionaire for Life Game. All determinations of Winning Tickets shall be made by the Director of that Lottery, whose judgment shall be final.

14. PRIZE STRUCTURE

a. Prize Pool. The Prize Pool for the aggregate of all Prize Levels shall consist of 55% percent of the sales receipts for each Drawing.

b. Cash Value of Cash Option Subject to Change. The Cash Value of the lump sum payment for the Grand and Second Level Prizes are posted on the Lottery's and MUSL websites and are subject to change.

c. Prize Payout and Structure. There are nine (9) Prize Levels in the Millionaire for Life Game. The Prize payouts and Prize structure are as follows, unless there are multiple winners in a Prize Level, in which case Prize amounts may be reduced as set forth in these Game Rules.

d. The Grand Prize shall be determined on a Pari-Mutuel basis. In certain circumstances (see below), the Second Level Prize may become Pari-Mutuel. Other Prizes are set Prizes as indicated below.

e. Highest Prize Won. In a single drawing, a Claimant may win in only one (1) Prize Level per single Play and shall be entitled only to the highest Prize Level for that Winning Play.

16. PRIZE LIABILITY LIMITATION

a. In the event that a Liability Limit would be exceeded for a particular Draw, the Prize amounts for each Prize Level shall be adjusted in accordance with a formula established by the Selling Lotteries so that the aggregate liability for Prizes in such Draw shall not exceed the Liability Limit. Prize Liability Limits are posted on the Selling Lotteries' websites.

b. **Grand Prize Payout.** Except as provided in these Official Game Rules, the Grand Prize shall be paid either as an Annuity or lump sum cash. A Grand Prize payout shall be divided equally among the number of Grand Winning Tickets as set forth below. Under certain circumstances, as detailed below, the Grand Prize is required to be paid in a single lump sum cash payment and no annuitized payment option is available.

c. One (1) Grand Prize-Winning Play among the Selling Lotteries. If there is one (1) Grand Prize-Winning Play, the annuitized Prize value will be \$1,000,000 per year for life, paid in annual installments, or a one-time lump sum cash Prize payment.

d. Two (2) to Twenty (20) Grand Prize-Winning Tickets among the Selling Lotteries. If there is more than one (1) and less than or equal to Twenty (20) Grand Prize-Winning Plays, the annuitized payment based on an annuitized Prize value of \$1,000,000 per year will be divided by the total number of Grand Prize-Winning Plays. The minimum annuitized Prize value for this category will be \$50,000 per year for life. The two (2) to twenty (20) Grand Prize-Winning Play Purchasers may choose the Cash Option as an alternative to the Annuity Option.

e. Twenty-one or more Grand Prize-Winning Plays among the Selling Lotteries. If there are twenty-one (21) or more Grand Prize-Winning Plays, no Annuity Option shall be available. Rather, the Grand Prize Cash Value shall be divided equally among all Grand Prize-Winning Plays and paid in one lump sum cash payment per each winning Play that has been claimed and validated. The minimum Grand Prize value for each of the 21 or more Grand Prize-Winning Plays shall be not less than the lowest tier Prize paid for the same Drawing.

f. Second Level Prize Payouts. Except as provided in these Game Rules, the Second Level Prize shall be paid either as an Annuity or lump sum cash. For each Second Level Prize Winning Play, the annuitized Prize value will be \$100,000 annually for life, paid in annual installments, or a one-time lump sum cash Prize payment, unless a Liability Limit would be exceeded.

g. One (1) to Twenty (20) Second Level Prize Winning Plays among the Selling Lotteries. If there are between one (1) and Twenty (20) Second Level Winning Plays, the annuitized Second Level Prize Value will be \$100,000 per year for life. Any of these one (1) to twenty (20) Second Level Prize Winning Plays may choose the Cash Option as an alternative to the Annuitized Payment Option. The amount of the Cash Option for this category will be the amount of the Second Level Prize Cash Option as established by all of the Selling Lotteries.

h. Twenty-one (21) or more Second Level Prize Winning Plays among the Selling Lotteries. If there are twenty-one (21) or more Second Level Prize Winning Plays, the Second Level Prize Liability shall be capped at an amount as determined by the Selling Lotteries, and shall be split equally among all Second Level Prize-Winning Plays, and shall be paid in one (1) Lump Sum Cash Payment, without an annuitized Payment Option. The minimum prize value for this category shall not be less than the lowest tier Prize paid in that respective Drawing.

Effective with the drawings on and after September 1, 2026, the **Second Level Prize Payouts** will be as follows:

Second Level Prize Payouts. Except as may be provided in the Game Rules, the Second Level Prize shall be paid either as an Annuity or lump sum cash. For each Second Level Prize Winning Play, the annuitized Prize value will be \$100,000 annually for life, paid in annual installments, or a one-time lump sum cash Prize payment of \$2,200,000, unless a Liability Limit would be exceeded.

One (1) to Seven (7) Second Level Prize Winning Plays among the Selling Lotteries. If there are between one (1) Second Level Winning Plays and Seven (7) Second Level Prize Winning Plays, the annuitized Second Level Prize Value will be \$100,000 per year for life. Any of these one (1) to seven (7) Second Level Prize Winning Plays may choose the Cash Option as an alternative to the Annuitized Payment Option. The Cash Option for this category will be the amount of the Second level Prize Cash Option as established by all of the Selling Lotteries.

Eight (8) or more Second level Prize Winning Plays among the Selling Lotteries. If there are eight (8) or more Second Level Prize Winning Plays, the Second Level Prize Liability shall be capped at

\$15,000,000 and shall be split equally among all Second Level Prize-Winning Plays and shall be paid in one (1) Lump Sum Cash Payment, without an annuitized Payment Option. The minimum prize value for this category shall not be less than any lower tier prize paid in that respective Drawing.

i. Third Level Prize Payouts. The Third Level Prize Payout will be paid as a \$7,500 Fixed Prize and paid in one single cash payment.

j. Fourth Level Prize Payouts. The Fourth Level Prize Payout will be \$500 Fixed Prize and paid in one single cash payment.

k. Fifth Level Prize Payouts. The Fifth Level Prize Payout will be \$250 Fixed Prize and paid in one single cash payment.

l. Sixth Level Prize Payouts. The Sixth Level Prize Payout will be \$50 Fixed Prize and paid in one single cash payment.

m. Seventh Level Prize Payouts. The Seventh Level Prize Payout will be \$25 Fixed Prize and paid in one single cash payment.

n. The Eighth and Ninth Level Prize Payouts will be \$8 Fixed Prize each and paid in one single cash payment.

17. LIFE ANNUITY REQUIREMENTS AND RESTRICTIONS

a. Minimum Annuity Period. An Annuitant shall be paid their appropriate Grand Prize share or Second Level Prize share on an annual basis for life, or for the twenty (20) year term of the Guaranteed Annuity Portion, whichever is longer. In the event that an Annuitant dies within the twenty (20) year Guaranteed Annuity Portion, any remaining Prize payments in the Guaranteed Annuity Portion shall be paid to the Annuitant's estate or to the Annuitant's beneficiary pursuant to the Lottery's rules and regulations and law. The initial payment under the Annuity Option shall be paid as soon as possible upon completion of internal validation procedures and in accordance with these Official Game Rules.

b. There shall be no assignment of Grand Prize or Second Level Prize except as set forth in the statutes or regulations of the Lottery that sold the winning Ticket.

e. Proof of Life. Prior to the beginning of payment of the Deferred Annuity Portion, Lottery will send an affidavit letter to the Annuitant requesting proof of life. The purpose of the affidavit letter is to verify that the Annuitant is still alive. The Annuitant shall sign the affidavit letter, and the letter shall bear the seal of a notary public. A proof of life affidavit letter will be sent to the Annuitant each subsequent year prior to the next scheduled installment payment. If Annuitant fails to provide a signed and notarized affidavit letter, the Lottery shall not make any further Deferred Annuity Portion payments. However, when, in the Director's sole discretion, the facts underlying an Annuitant's failure to provide a completed annual affidavit letter are reasonable, the Deferred Annuity Portion payments may resume. No interest shall be paid by the Lottery on the value of the Prize or any payment thereof during any period that a Prize payment was not made due to failure of the Annuitant to provide an affidavit letter.

f. In no event shall installment payments be made in the Deferred Annuity Portion of the Annuity Option after the Annuitant's death.

g. It shall be the Prizewinner's responsibility to provide the Lottery paying the Annuity any updated address information to which Prize installments will be mailed even if a full annual payment or multiple payments have been assigned to a third party.

h. Where a Claimant of a Grand Prize or Second Level Prize is a minor who has not yet attained a majority age in the applicable jurisdiction in which the lottery that sold the Play is located, such Prize will be subject to the laws and regulations governing the Selling Lottery.

*These are the basic Game Rules. Selling Lotteries may devise lottery-specific game rules, which shall not conflict with these Game Rules.

**Prizes are subject to Prize Liability Limitations set forth in the Game Rules. Prizes may vary based on the number of winning Plays as provided for in these Game Rules.
